12 13	PETITION FOR CONFIDENTIAL PROTECTION
14 15	1. Big Rivers Electric Corporation ("Big Rivers") hereby petitions the
16	Kentucky Public Service Commission (the "Commission"), pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001
17	Section 13 and KRS 61.878, to grant confidential protection to certain information
18	contained in the annual report being filed by Big Rivers with this Petition and as
19	required by the Commission's June 30, 2016 Order in the above-captioned matter.
20	2. The information for which Big Rivers seeks confidential treatment is
21	hereinafter referred to as the "Confidential Information." The Confidential
22	Information consists of proprietary, business-sensitive, or otherwise private
23	information relating to the increase in load from the ramp-up project at the
24	Lewisport, Handcock County, Kentucky facility of Aleris Rolled Products, Inc.
25	("Aleris") under the Amended and Restated Agreement for Retail Electric Service
26	between Kenergy Corp. and Aleris, which was the subject of this 2016 proceeding.
27	3. Pursuant to the Commission's Emergency Orders In the Matter of:
28	Electronic Emergency Docket Related to the Novel Coronavirus Covid-19, Case No.
29	2020-00085 (March 16, 2020 and March 24, 2020), Big Rivers is filing with this

- 1 Petition, via electronic mail sent to <u>PSCED@ky.gov</u>, (a) a public version of the report,
- 2 with the Confidential Information redacted; and (b) the pages from the report that
- 3 contain Confidential Information, with the Confidential Information highlighted.
- 4. Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001 Section 13(2)(b) and the Emergency Orders,
- 5 one (1) copy of this Petition and one (1) copy of the redacted pages containing the
- 6 Confidential Information have been served on all parties to this proceeding by
- 7 electronic mail.

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- 8 5. Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001 Section 13(10)(b), if and to the extent any of
- 9 the Confidential Information becomes generally available to the public, whether
- through filings required by other agencies or otherwise, Big Rivers will notify the
- 11 Commission and have the confidential status removed.
- 12 6. Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001 Section 13(2)(a)(1), as discussed *infra*, the
- 13 Confidential Information is entitled to confidential protection and is being submitted
- 14 confidentially under the purview of KRS 61.878(1)(a) and KRS 61.878(1)(c)(1).

I. The Confidential Information is Entitled to Confidential Protection under KRS 61.878(1)(a)

- 7. KRS 61.878(1)(a) explicitly grants confidential protection to "[p]ublic
- 18 records containing information of a personal nature where the public disclosure
- 19 thereof would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy." Here,
- 20 Aleris is recently underwent a multi-phase expansion at its facility located in
- 21 Lewisport, Handcock County, Kentucky, and the Confidential Information reveals
- 22 proprietary, business-sensitive, and otherwise private information, including its load
- 23 under the expansion project and the cost it pays for power.

8. As a point of reference and consistency, Big Rivers sought, and was granted, confidential treatment for similar information in its March 24, 2016 and April 21, 2016 Petitions for Confidential Treatment filed in this case; and, in conjunction with its prior annual reports related to this matter, Big Rivers sought, and was granted, confidential treatment for analogous information in 2017, 2018, and 2019.

9. As explained in more detail in Section II(B) infra, Aleris is a retail customer on the Big Rivers system and considers this information highly confidential such that public disclosure would cause it substantial competitive harm. Because public disclosure of the Confidential Information would constitute an unwarranted invasion of this customer's privacy, this Confidential Information should be granted confidential treatment. See Ky. Op. Atty. Gen. 96-ORD-176 (August 20, 1996) (holding Kroger Company's utility bills exempt from disclosure under KRS 61.878(1)(a)); see also In the Matter of: Application of Kentucky Utilities Company for an Adjustment of its Electric Rates, Order, P.S.C. Case No. 2012-00221 (July 25, 2013) (holding customer names, account numbers, and usage information exempt from disclosure under KRS 61.878(1)(a)).

II. The Confidential Information is Further Entitled to Confidential Protection under KRS 61.878(1)(c)(1)

10. The Confidential Information is also entitled to confidential protection based upon KRS 61.878(1)(c)(1), which protects "records confidentially disclosed to an agency or required by an agency to be disclosed to it, generally recognized as confidential or proprietary, which if openly disclosed would permit an unfair

commercial advantage to competitors of the entity that disclosed the records." See 807 KAR 5:001 Section 13(2)(a)(1). In support for this ground of granting confidential protection, Subsection A infra describes how Big Rivers operates in competitive environments; Subsection B infra explains that the Confidential Information is generally recognized as confidential or proprietary; and Subsection C infra demonstrates that public disclosure of the Confidential Information would permit an unfair commercial advantage to Big Rivers' competitors.

A. Big Rivers faces actual competition.

11. Big Rivers' must successfully compete in the wholesale power market in order to sell excess energy to meet its members' needs, including competition in: term bilateral energy markets, day-ahead and real-time energy and ancillary services markets, the annual capacity market, and forward bilateral long-term wholesale agreements with utilities and industrial customers. Big Rivers' ability to successfully compete in these wholesale power markets is dependent upon an effective combination of: (a) obtaining the maximum price and the best contract terms for the power it sells; and (b), keeping its cost of production as low as possible. Fundamentally, if Big Rivers' cost of producing a kilowatt hour or its business risks increase, then its ability to sell the same kilowatt hour in competition with other utilities is adversely affected.

12. Moreover, a utility the size of Big Rivers that operates generation and transmission facilities will always have periodic cash and borrowing requirements for both anticipated and unanticipated needs, which requires Big Rivers to compete for

reasonably-priced credit in the credit markets. Big Rivers' credit is directly impacted by the financial results it obtains and the business risks it assumes, and any event that adversely affects Big Rivers' financial results or increases its business risks may adversely affect the price it pays for credit. Thus, a competitor armed with Big Rivers' proprietary and confidential information would be able to increase Big Rivers' costs or decrease Big Rivers' revenues, which could in turn affect Big Rivers' apparent creditworthiness. Likewise, any impediments to Big Rivers' ability to obtain the best contract terms could affect its apparent creditworthiness. Since Big Rivers is currently in the credit market and expects to be in the market on a regular basis in the future, it is imperative that Big Rivers improve and maintain its credit profile, which involves the protection of the Confidential Information.

13. Accordingly, Big Rivers faces competition in the wholesale power and credit markets such that the Confidential Information should be afforded confidential treatment to prevent the imposition of an unfair competitive advantage to its competitors.

B. The Confidential Information is generally recognized as confidential or proprietary.

14. The Confidential Information for which Big Rivers seeks confidential treatment under KRS 61.878(1)(c)(1) is generally recognized as confidential or proprietary under Kentucky law.

15. Aleris is a privately-held, global leader in aluminum rolled products, and has owned and operated an aluminum rolling mill in Lewisport, Handcock County, Kentucky since 1964. The Lewisport mill operates in a highly competitive,

- 1 cost sensitive, and increasingly global market to provide rolled aluminum sheet to
- 2 key industries in Kentucky and throughout the United States, including:
- 3 Distribution, Transportation, Automotive, Building and Construction and Specialty
- 4 Products. Although Aleris maintains a positive outlook, its domestic competition in
- 5 the flat-rolled aluminum industry has increased significantly due to the introduction
- 6 of foreign competitors that benefit from lower cost structures and rich government
- 7 incentives on power, tax adjustments, and other subsidies.
- 8 16. Aleris' expansion that was the subject of this case was the largest
- 9 investment in its company's history and involved the construction of twin Continuous
- 10 Annealing Line with Pre-Treatment ("CALP") lines, which will allow Aleris to be one
- of the first companies in the United States with a state of the art auto body sheet
- 12 production process.
- 17. It is clear that the Confidential Information relates to the inner
- 14 workings of Aleris' organization. The Confidential Information is not publicly
- 15 available, nor is such information known or disseminated within the Aleris or Big
- Rivers organizations except to those employees and professionals with a legitimate
- business need to know and act upon the information. Under Kentucky law, it is well-
- 18 recognized that information about a company's detailed inner workings, such as the
- 19 Confidential Information, is generally recognized as confidential or proprietary. See,
- 20 e.g., Hoy v. Kentucky Indus. Revitalization Authority, 907 S.W.2d 766, 768 (Ky. 1995)
- 21 ("[i]t does not take a degree in finance to recognize that such information concerning

- the inner workings of a corporation is 'generally recognized as confidential or proprietary.").
- 3 Moreover, KRS 278.160(3) directly recognizes that the terms of a special 18. contract are not required to be publicly disclosed if such terms are entitled to 4 5 protection under KRS 61.878(1)(c)(1). The Commission has previously granted 6 confidential treatment to similar information applying this principle. See, e.g., In the Matter of: Big Rivers Electric Corporation Filing of Wholesale Contracts Pursuant to 7 KRS 278.180 and 807 KAR 5:011 Section 13, Order, P.S.C. Case No. 2014-00134 8 9 (September 10, 2014) (granting confidential treatment to confidential contract 10 terms); see also, e.g., In the Matter of: Big Rivers Electric Corporation Filing of Wholesale Contracts Pursuant to KRS 278.180 and 807 KAR 5:011 Section 13, Order, 11 P.S.C. Case No. 2014-00134 (October 9, 2014) (granting confidential treatment to 12
- 14 19. Based on the foregoing, the Confidential Information is generally recognized as confidential or proprietary under Kentucky law.
- 16 C. Disclosure of the Confidential Information would permit 17 an unfair commercial advantage to Big Rivers' 18 competitors.

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confidential contract terms).

20. Disclosure of the Confidential Information would permit an unfair commercial advantage to Big Rivers' competitors. As discussed *supra*, Big Rivers faces actual competition in the wholesale power and credit markets, so it reasonably follows that Big Rivers would suffer competitive injury if the Confidential Information were publicly disclosed.

21. Applying analogous considerations, in P.S.C. Case No. 2003-00054, the Commission granted confidential protection to bids submitted to Union Light, Heat & Power ("ULH&P") due to the unfair advantage such information would provide to competitors. There, ULH&P's argued, and the Commission implicitly accepted, that the bidding contractors would not want their bid information publicly disclosed, and that such disclosure would reduce the contractor pool available to ULH&P, which would then drive up ULH&P's costs and impede its ability to compete with other gas suppliers. In the Matter of: Application of the Union Light, Heat and Power Company for Confidential Treatment, Order (August 4, 2003). Similarly, in Hoy v. Kentucky Indus. Revitalization Authority, the Kentucky Supreme Court found that without protection for confidential information provided to a public agency, "companies would be reluctant to apply for investment tax credits for fear the confidentiality of financial information would be compromised." 907 S.W.2d 766, 769 (Ky. 1995).

22. Here, Aleris undoubtedly considers the Confidential Information highly confidential. If Big Rivers is unable to obtain confidential treatment for information that its counterparty (Aleris in this case) considers confidential, then potential future counterparties dealing with Big Rivers would inevitably worry that their competitive information could also be at risk of public disclosure. Because many companies would be reluctant to have such information disclosed, public disclosure of the Confidential Information would likely reduce the pool of counterparties willing to deal with Big Rivers, thereby reducing Big Rivers' ability to sell power and impairing its ability to compete in the wholesale power and credit markets.

- 1 23. In the same way, Aleris had choices about where it would make its CALP
 2 project investment. If Aleris knew that it would be risking the disclosure of extremely
 3 confidential project information that could endanger the ultimate competitiveness of
 4 the company, Aleris may have made a different decision about the location of the
- 6 24. Accordingly, the public disclosure of the Confidential Information would 7 provide competitors of Big Rivers with an unfair commercial advantage.

8 III. Time Period

expansion project.

25. Big Rivers requests that the Confidential Information remain confidential in perpetuity because it reveals private customer data. 807 KAR 5:001 Section 13(2)(a)(2).

IV. Conclusion


26. Based on the foregoing, the Confidential Information is entitled to confidential protection. If the Commission disagrees that Big Rivers is entitled to confidential protection, due process requires the Commission to hold an evidentiary hearing. See Utility Regulatory Com'n v. Kentucky Water Service Co., Inc., 642 S.W.2d 591 (Ky. App. 1982).

WHEREFORE, Big Rivers respectfully request that the Commission classify and protect as confidential the Confidential Information.
