AVAILABILITY

Available to commercial and small power customers of the corporation located on its lines for service, including lighting, incidental appliances, cooking heating, and motors, all subject to the established rules and regulations of the corporation covering this service. Single-phase customers having their residences on the same premises may include residential services on the same meter.

Available to schools, Churches, and other public buildings which meet the requirements of this schedule.

Service under this schedule is limited to customers whose load requirements can be met by a transformer having a capacity not to exceed 25 kva.

MONTHLY RATE

First 40 kwh @ 6.0¢ per kwh
Next 60 kwh @ 4.0¢ per kwh
Next 900 kwh @ 2.5¢ per kwh
Over 1000 kwh @ 1.4¢ per kwh

MINIMUM CHARGE

The minimum monthly charge under the above rate shall be \$1.50 net where 3 kva or less of transformer capacity is required. Each customer who requires more than 3 kva of transformer capacity shall pay, in addition to the above minimum, 75¢ for each additional kva or fraction thereof required.



The average power factor shall be the cosine of the angle determined by the tangent formed by the kilovar hours metered each month divided by the kilowatt hours metered to the consumer for the same period.

Such adjustment shall be made by multiplying the registered KW demand times the ratio of 80% divided by the average power factor as determined above.

FUEL COST ADJUSTMENT CHARGE

In case the rate under which the Seller purchases power at wholesale is adjusted in accordance with a fuel cost adjustment provision in Seller's wholesale power contract, the foregoing energy charges shall be adjusted each month by the same amount per KWH as the fuel cost and adjustment per KWH in Seller's wholesale power bill for the next preceding month.

MINIMUM MONTHLY CHARGE

The minimum monthly charge shall be the highest one of the following charges as determined for the consumer in question.

- (1) The minimum monthly charge as specified in the contract for service. (N)
- (2) A charge of \$.75 per KVA of installed transformer capacity. (N)
- (3) A charge of \$25.00. (N)

MINIMUM ANNUAL CHARGE FOR SEASONAL SERVICE

Consumers requiring service only during certain seasons not exceeding 9 months per year may guarantee a minimum annual charge, in which case there shall be no minimum monthly charge. The minimum annual charge shall be sufficient to assure adequate compensation for the facilities installed to serve the Consumer, and in no event shall it be less than \$9.00 per KVA of installed transformer capacity, or \$300.00 whichever is greater.

2. Payment

a. The Consumer shall pay the Seller for service hereunder at the rates and upon the terms and conditions set forth in Rate Schedule made a part of this agreement. Notwithstanding any provision of the Schedule, however, the minimum charge per month shall be \$.

b. Bills for service hereunder shall be paid at the Office of the Seller in Danville, Kentucky, monthly within ten days after the bill is presented. If the Consumer shall fail to pay any such bill within such ten day period, the Seller may discontinue service hereunder by giving ten days' notice in writing to the Consumer.

3. Continuity of Service

The Seller shall use reasonable diligence to provide a constant and uninterrupted supply of electric power and energy; but if such supply shall fail or be interrupted, or become defective through the act of God, or the public enemy, or by accident, strikes, labor troubles, or by action of the elements, or inability to secure rights-of-way, or other permits needed, or for any other cause beyond the reasonable control of the Seller, the Seller shall not be liable therefor.

4. Membership

The Consumer shall become a member of the Seller, shall pay the membership fee and be bound by the provisions of the articles of incorporation and by-laws of the Seller and by such rules and regulations as may from time to time be adopted by the Seller.

5. Succession

This agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the successors, legal representatives and assigns of the respective parties hereto.

6. Deposit

The Consumer shall deposit with the Seller the sum of on account of the cost of facilities required to make service available to the Consumer on or before the commencement of construction of such facilities. Such deposit shall be returnable to the Consumer in the form of a credit on each bill for service in the amount of percent of the bill, which credits shall continue until they total \$. No refund shall be made to the Consumer of any portion of the deposit remaining upon termination of this agreement.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

APPLICABLE TO ALL CLASSES OF SERVICE

1. Application for Service: Each prospective member or customer desiring electric service may be required to sign cooperatives (herein after referred to as distributor) standard form of application for service or contract before service is supplied by the DISTRIBUTOR.

2. Deposit: A deposit or suitable guarantee not exceeding twice the average monthly bill may be required of any member or customer before electric service is supplied. DISTRIBUTOR may at its option return deposit to customer after one year. Upon termination of service, deposit may be applied by DISTRIBUTOR against unpaid bills of member or customer, and if any balance remains after such application is made, said balance shall be refunded to member or customer.

3. Point of Delivery: The point of delivery is the point, as designated by DISTRIBUTOR, on member or customer's premises where current is to be delivered to building or premises. All wiring and equipment beyond the point of delivery shall be maintained by the member or customer.

4. Member or Customer's Wiring-Standards: All wiring of member or customer must conform to cooperative requirements and accepted modern standards, as exemplified by the requirements of the National Electrical Safety Code, and the National Electric Code.

5. INSPECTIONS: DISTRIBUTOR shall have the right, but shall not be obligated, to inspect any installation before electricity is introduced or at any later time, and reserves the right to reject any wiring or appliances not in accordance with DISTRIBUTOR'S standards but such inspection or failure to inspect or reject shall not render DISTRIBUTOR liable or responsible for any loss or damage resulting from defects in the installation, wiring, or appliances, or from violation of DISTRIBUTOR'S rules or from accidents which may occur upon member or customer's premises.

6. Underground Service Lines: Members or customers desiring underground service lines from DISTRIBUTOR'S overhead system must bear the excess cost incident thereto. Specifications and terms for such construction will be furnished by DISTRIBUTOR on request.

7. Member or Customer's Responsibility for DISTRIBUTOR'S Property: All meter, service connections, and other equipment furnished by DISTRIBUTOR, shall be, and remain, the property of the DISTRIBUTOR. Member or customer shall provide a space for, and exercise proper care, to protect the property of DISTRIBUTOR on its premises and in the event of loss or damage to DISTRIBUTOR'S property, arising from neglect of member or customer to care for same the cost of necessary repairs or replacements shall be paid by member or customer.

8. Right of Access: DISTRIBUTOR'S identified employees shall have access to member or customer's premises at all reasonable times for the purpose of reading meters, testing, repairing, removing, or exchanging any or all equipment belonging to DISTRIBUTOR.

9. Billing: Bills will be rendered monthly and shall be paid within ten (10) days from date of bill at the office of DISTRIBUTOR. Failure to receive bill will not release customer from payment obligation. Should bills not be paid as above, the DISTRIBUTOR may at any time thereafter, upon five (5) days written notice to member or customer, discontinue service, or should the DISTRIBUTOR have to travel to the home or some other place to collect bills, a collect fee of not less than \$2.50 may be added to member or customer's bill.

10. Discontinuance of Service by DISTRIBUTOR: The DISTRIBUTOR may refuse to connect or may discontinue service for the violation of any of its Rules and Regulations, or for violation of any of the provisions of the SCHEDULE OF RATES AND CHARGES, or of the application of member or customer or contract with member or customer. DISTRIBUTOR may discontinue service to member or customer for the theft of current or the appearance of current theft devices on the premises of member or customer. The discontinuance of Service by

DISTRIBUTOR for any causes as stated in this rule does not release member or customer from his obligation to DISTRIBUTOR for payment of minimum bills as specified in application of member or customer or contract with member of customer.

11. Reconnection Charge: Whenever service has been discontinued by DISTRIBUTOR, as provided above, or whenever service has been discontinued for a period of 12 months or less for any other reason, a charge of not less than two dollars, fifty cents (\$2.50) may be collected by DISTRIBUTOR before service is restored.

12. Termination of Contract by Member or Customer: Member or customer who have fulfilled their contract terms and wish to discontinue service must give at least three (3) days written notice to that effect, unless contract specifies otherwise. Notice to discontinue service prior to expiration of contract term will not relieve member or customer from any minimum or guaranteed payment under any contract or rate.

13. Service Charges for Temporary Service: Member or customer requiring electric service for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days may be required by DISTRIBUTOR to pay all costs for connection and disconnection incidental to the supplying and removing of service. This rule applies to circuses, carnivals, fairs, temporary construction and the like.

14. Interruption of Service: The DISTRIBUTOR will use reasonable diligence to provide a regular and uninterrupted supply of current, but in case the supply of current should be interrupted for any cause, DISTRIBUTOR shall not be liable for damages resulting therefrom.

15. Voltage Fluctuations Caused by Member or Customer: Electric service must not be used in such a manner as to cause unusual fluctuations or disturbances to DISTRIBUTION system. DISTRIBUTOR may require member or customer at his own expense, to install suitable apparatus which will reasonably limit such fluctuation.

16. Additional Load: The service connection, transformer, meters, and equipment supplied by DISTRIBUTOR for each member or customer have definite capacity, and no addition to the equipment or load connected thereto will be allowed except by consent of DISTRIBUTOR. Failure to give notice of additions or changes in load and to obtain DISTRIBUTOR'S consent for same shall render the member or customer liable for any damage to any of DISTRIBUTOR'S lines or equipment caused by the additional or changed installation.

17. Standby and Resale Service: All purchased electric service (other than emergency and standby service) used on the premises of member or customer shall be supplied exclusively by DISTRIBUTOR, and the member or customer shall not directly or indirectly, sell, sublet, assign, or otherwise dispose of the electric service or any part thereof, without permission of DISTRIBUTOR.

18. Notice of Trouble: Member or customer shall notify DISTRIBUTOR immediately should the service be unsatisfactory for any reason, or should there be any defects, trouble or accidents affecting the supply of electricity. Such notice, if verbal should be confirmed in writing.

19. Non-Standard Service: The member or customer shall pay the cost of any special installation necessary to meet his requirements for services other than standard voltages, or for the supply of closer voltage regulation than required by standard practice.

20. Meter Tests: DISTRIBUTOR will, at its own expense, make periodical tests and inspections of its meters in order to maintain a high standard of accuracy. DISTRIBUTOR will make additional tests or inspections of its meters at the request of member or customer. If such test show that the meter is accurate within 2%, slow or fast, no adjustment will be made in member or customer's bill and the testing charge of two dollars, fifty cents (\$2.50) per meter will be paid by member or customer. In case the test shows meter to be in excess of 2%, an adjustment shall be made in the member or customer's bill over a period of not over ninety (90) days prior to date of such test, and cost of making test shall be borne by DISTRIBUTOR.

21. Billing Adjusted to Standard Periods: The demand charges and the blocks in the energy charges set forth in the rate schedules are based on billing periods of approximately one month. In the case of the first billing of new accounts, temporary service, (seasonal customers excepted), and final billing of all accounts (temporary service excepted) where the period covered by the billing involves fractions of a month, the demand charges and the blocks of the energy charge will be adjusted to a basis proportionate with the period of time during which service is extended.


22. Filing and Posting: A copy of these RULES AND REGULATIONS, TOGETHER WITH A COPY OF DISTRIBUTOR'S SCHEDULE OF RATES AND CHARGES, shall be kept open to inspection at the office of DISTRIBUTOR.

23. Scope: This SCHEDULE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS is a part of all contracts for receiving electric service from DISTRIBUTOR, and applies to all service received from DISTRIBUTOR whether the service is based upon contract, agreement, signed application, or otherwise.

24. Revisions: These RULES AND REGULATIONS may be revised, amended, supplemented, or otherwise changed from time to time. Such changes, when effective, shall have the same force as the present RULES AND REGULATIONS.

25. Conflict: In case of conflict between any provision of any rate schedule and the SCHEDULE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS, the rate schedule shall apply.

26. Date of Approval: These RULES AND REGULATIONS were approved by the Board of Directors of Inter-County Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation at their regular board meeting on April 27, 1957.

1. The undersigned will pay forthwith to the Corporation a membership fee of Ten Dollars (\$10).

2. As soon as electric energy shall be available after the issuance to the undersigned of a membership certificate, the undersigned will purchase monthly from the Corporation not less than the minimum amount of electric energy which shall from time to time be determined by the Board of Directors of the Corporation and will pay therefor and all additional electric energy used by the undersigned, the price which shall from time to time be fixed therefor by the Board of Directors.

3. The undersigned will grant to the Corporation at its request the necessary rights, privileges and easements to construct, operate, replace, repair and perpetually maintain on the property owned or occupied by the undersigned, and in or upon all roads, streets or highways abutting said property, its line or lines for the transmission or distribution of electric energy, and will execute and deliver to the Corporation any conveyance, grant or instrument which the Corporation shall deem necessary or convenient for said purposes or any of them. All service lines supplying the undersigned with electric energy and all switches, meters and other appliances and equipment constructed or installed by the Corporation on said property, except so much thereof, if any, as shall be paid by the undersigned, shall at all times be the sole property of the Corporation, and the Corporation shall have the right of access to said property to repair and service, and upon the discontinuance of service for any reason, to remove the same.

4.
