RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. METER READING

It was recognized early in the rural electric cooperative movement that in order to supply electric service to the sparsely populated rural areas that the self-reading of meters by member consumers would be a major contributing factor towards supplying such service at the lowest possible rates. Therefore, the meter reading rules of the Owen County Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation are as follows:

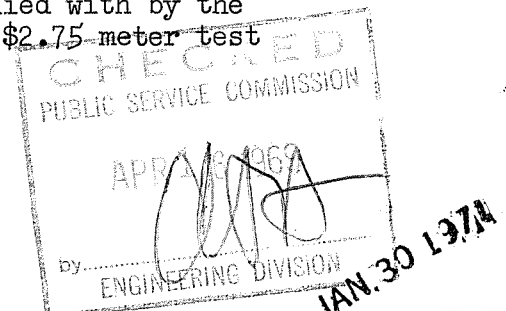
- (a) Consumer will mark the reading on the combination bill and meter reading card which he receives on or about the 10th of each month. The consumer will mail the card, along with their payment, by the 15th of each month.
- (b) If a consumer's meter reading card fails to reach the Cooperative's office on or before the 20th day of the month, for three consecutive months, the Cooperative shall read the consumer's meter on the fourth meter reading date and make a charge of \$2.25 for this service.

2. BILLING PROCEDURE

This is on file with the Public Service Commission now.

3. METER TESTING

- (a) Each and every watt-hour meter installed by the Cooperative on consumer's premises shall be tested at least once every eight (8) years without charge to the consumer.
- (b) Any other request for a meter test shall be complied with by the Cooperative only if the consumer agrees to pay a \$2.75 meter test deposit.

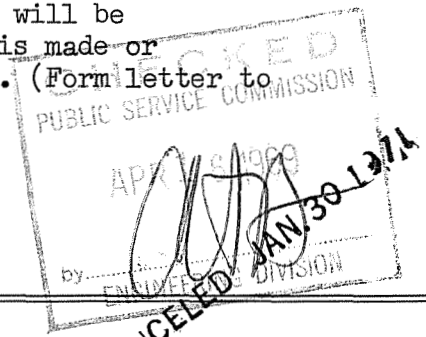

- (c) If a meter tests more than 2% fast, the \$2.75 deposit shall be returned to the consumer and a credit, based on the percentage of error times the KWH's billed the consumer on his previous three (3) month's statements times the applicable rate, shall be issued by the Cooperative to the consumer.

4. RECONNECTION CHARGE

- (a) The Cooperative will make only one connect without charge for one account.
- (b) After the original "no charge" connect is made, all subsequent reconnects (regardless of the name of the occupant) of any account shall carry a \$5.00 reconnection charge.
- (c) Any applicant requesting a connection of service of an account previously occupied by the applicant or someone else, shall be advised at the time of his request that he must pay the five dollars (\$5.00) reconnection charge.
- (d) If the applicant makes the above request in person to the office or to a serviceman, the employee must collect the reconnection charge immediately.
- (e) If the reconnection request is made by phone, the applicant should be advised to be at the account location and pay the charge when the maintenance man makes the connect or to come to the office and pay the reconnection charge.
- (f) If the request is made by mail, the applicant must be advised by mail, immediately, that the reconnection charge will be collected by the serviceman when the reconnection is made or that he may come to the office and pay this charge. (Form letter to be made for this.)

5. MEMBERSHIP FEES

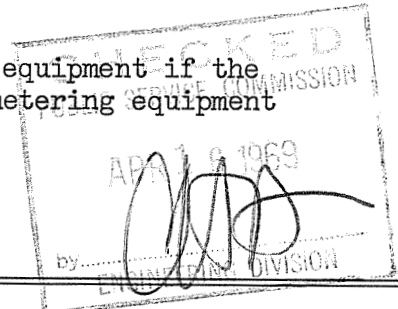
- (a) Beginning with the effective date (9-1-52), the membership fee shall be \$10.00.
- (b) Present members or applicants for service filed prior to 9-1-52 holding a \$5.00 membership certificate or record of \$5.00 fee shall not be required to pay the increased fee.

6. SMALL COMMERCIAL POWER, INDUSTRIAL LIGHTING

- (a) Applicable
 - 1. Applicable to entire territory served
- (b) Availability of service
 - 1. Available to commercial small power, three-phase farm service, for all uses including lighting, heating and power.
- (c) Type of Service
 - 1. Single phase or three phase where available.
 - 2. Motors rated above 10 HP capacity must be three phase.
 - 3. Entrances above 200-amp will be classed small commercial.
 - 4. Rate

First	20 KWH	\$1.50 month
Next	80 KWH	.05 month
Next	100 KWH	.025 month
Next	800 KWH	.015 month
Next	1000 KWH	.012 month

Consumer will pay for all installation of metering equipment if the Co-op does the work, or the consumer can have the metering equipment installed and inspected at his cost.

7. MINIMUM MONTHLY CHARGE

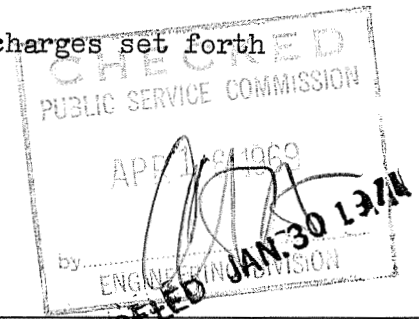
The minimum monthly charge under the above rate shall be \$1.50 when 5 KVA or less of transformer capacity is required. For consumers requiring more than 5 KVA of transformer capacity, the minimum monthly charge shall be increased by 75¢ for each additional KVA or fraction thereof required. When it is necessary to extend or reinforce existing distribution facilities, the minimum monthly charge may be increased to assure adequate compensation to the added facilities. When the minimum charge is increased in accordance with the terms, additional energy and demand shall be included in accordance with the foregoing schedule.

8. TERMS

None.

9. SEASONAL LOADS - Camps Class 5 - Barns Class 7

- (a) Effective January 1, 1969, all seasonal loads classified as barns and camps will not be disconnected each year.
- (b) Camps and barns will be subject to the Rate 1 Schedule with no prepayment required. The consumer will be required to read his own meter although classified as a camp or barn. Consumer will be subject to any tariff charges for failure to read their own meter.
- (c) If consumer demands to be disconnected, he will be subject to all reconnection charges. The amounts are set forth under heading "Reconnection Charges".
- (d) Barns and camps will be subject to all delinquent charges set forth in the billing and collection procedure.

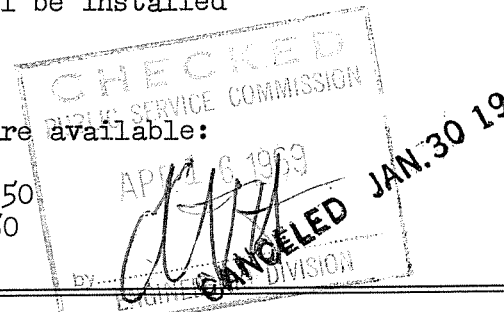

11. SECURITY LIGHTS (Continued)

- 3. If at any time an extra security light is needed, it will be added at the appropriate rate.
- 4. If a permanent service, either residential, commercial or large power is added to the line during the five-year contract, the balance of the contract will be adjusted accordingly.
- 5. Where transformer is required, there is an extra charge of fifty cents (\$.50) a month.

12. TRAILERS

- (a) \$10.00 membership fee is required.
- (b) Survey required by engineering department.
- (c) All trailers are required to wire their meter pole in compliance with the standards of the National Electric Code.
- (d) Minimum 60-Amp entrance for 110 volts; 100-Amp entrance for 220 volts.
- (e) Should the consumer own the property on which the trailer is to be located and have plumbing and water that meets the county health code, the Co-op will build to the same as any other resident. (no cost.)
- (f) For any trailer that is located on leased or rental property, the consumer will be required to:
 - 1. Set his own pole. (Distance to be no further than one service span from existing service line or approximately 100 feet. Any distance greater than this, the cost is to be borne by the consumer.)

- 2. Pole must be creosote type.
- 3. Pole to pass inspection by Cooperative personnel before service is connected.
- 4. Consumer must wire own pole in compliance with standards of National Electric Code.

(g) Alternative to Item # 6 will be that the Co-op will furnish and set pole for minimum cost of \$60.00 which is to be paid in advance.

- 1. Consumer will be required to wire meter pole in compliance with standards of National Electric Code.

RATE PER UNIT

SPECIAL RULES:

- (1) The consumer shall install and operate in regular use a standard approved storage type of electric water heater and shall have no non-electric household water heating device in use during any part of the year (such as heating coils in a fuel burning range or furnace).
- (2) Provision shall be made in the consumer's water heater wiring installation for an automatic control device which the cooperative may install at its discretion.
- (3) The standard approved type of water heater shall consist of an insulated tank of 30 or more gallons capacity which has two thermostatically controlled non inductive heating elements of 20 watts per gallon of tank capacity in lower element and 30 watts per gallon of tank capacity in the upper element. The theromastats shall be so arranged to allow only one element to operate at a time. The lower element shall be placed to heat the whole tank and the upper element to heat only the upper part of the tank. The entire installation shall be subject to the approval of the cooperative including the wiring, tank size, tank insulation and capacity in watts of the heating elements.
- (4) The lower element shall be arranged for control by a device which shall be set so that the lower element may operate not more than 18 hours per day and be automatically disconnected during the remaining hours. The hours of disconnection shall be determined from time to time and shall be the hours of system Peak Load. The upper element shall not be controlled.

NOTE:

Consumers desiring uncontrolled water heating service may secure such service under the schedule applicable for other types of usage, in which case no control device will be required.

The rated capacity of any motor served under this schedule shall not exceed ten horsepower.

The rated capacity of any motor served under the schedule shall not exceed 10 horsepower.

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
