SCHEDULE A-1-WH (Cont.)
 FARM AND HOME SERVICE WITH STORAGE-TYPE WATER HEATER

Conditions of Service

1. The consumer shall install and operate in regular use a standard approved storage type of electric water heater and shall have no non-electric household water heating device in use during any part of the year (such as heating coils in a fuel-burning range or furnace).
2. Regardless of number of storage type water heaters connected to any single service only one block of 300 kwh per month at 1¢ per kwh will be allowed for any single service.
3. The standard approved type of water heater shall consist of an insulated tank containing two thermostatically controlled, non-inductive heating elements, so connected that only one element is permitted to operate any time. The capacity of the tank shall be sufficient to furnish an ample supply of hot water but in no case shall it be less than 30 gallons. The wattage of the heating elements shall not exceed 20 watts per gallon of tank capacity for the lower element and 30 watts per gallon for the upper element, rounded off to the nearest commercial sizes of elements. The entire installation shall be subject to the approval of the cooperative including the insulation and size of the tank, the wiring and the size of the heating elements.
4. Provision shall be made in the consumer's water-heater wiring installation for an automatic control device which the cooperative may install at its discretion.

CLASSIFICATION OF SERVICE

SCHEDULE WP-1 - Water Pumping Service

RATE PER UNIT

Availability

Available to the city of Milton, Kentucky, for water pumping service, subject to the Seller's established rules and regulations.

Rate

\$1.50 per month per KW of billing demand
Plus energy charges of:
2¢ per KWH for first 5,000 KWH per month.
1 1/2¢ per KWH for next 10,000 KWH used per month.
1¢ per KWH for all remaining KWH used per month.

In any month in which the consumer's demand does not increase the Seller's demand, the foregoing demand charge shall be omitted for billing purposes.

Determination of Billing Demand

The billing demand shall be the maximum kilowatt demand established by the consumer for any period of fifteen (15) consecutive minutes during the month for which the bill is rendered, as indicated or recorded by a graphic type meter.

Power Factor Adjustment

The consumer agrees to maintain unity power factor as nearly as practicable. Demand charges will be adjusted when the average power factor is lower than 85%. Such adjustments will be made by increasing the measured demand by 1% for each 1% by which the average power factor is less than 85% lagging.

Fuel Cost Adjustment Charge

In case the rate under which Seller purchases power at wholesale is adjusted in accordance with a fuel cost adjustment provision in Seller's wholesale power contract, the foregoing energy charges shall be adjusted each month by the same amount per KWH as the fuel cost adjustment per KWH in Seller's wholesale power bill for the next preceding month.

CLASSIFICATION OF SERVICE

**RATE
PER UNIT**

Minimum Monthly Charge

The monthly minimum charge shall be 75¢ per KVA of installed transformer capacity.

Type of Service

Single and three-phase, 60 cycles at Seller's standard voltages.

Conditions of Service

1. Motors having a rated capacity in excess of ten horsepower (10 H.P.) must be three-phase.

2. Both power and lighting shall be billed at the foregoing rate. If a separate meter is required for the lighting circuit, the registrations of the two watt-hour meters shall be added to obtain the total kilowatt-hours used and the registrations of the two demand meters shall be added to obtain the total kilowatt demand for billing purposes.

3. All wiring, pole lines, and other electrical equipment beyond the metering point, shall be considered the distribution system of the consumer and shall be furnished and maintained by the consumer.

4. The consumer agrees to install reduced voltage starting equipment on all motors larger than ten horsepower (10 H.P.) and to provide all motor protective equipment necessary for protection against overload and against temporary abnormal voltage conditions on the Seller's primary system.

RULES AND REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE

Meter Reading

Member's meter reading cards failing to be received by the 25th of the month in the office of the Cooperative for at least two (2) consecutive months, the Cooperative will send its employee to the member's premises and have the member's meter read; and a charge of \$2.50 will be made to the member's account for the extra service rendered, due and payable on notice of said charge.

Collection of Delinquent Accounts

Members of the Shelby Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation will receive statements from the 1st day of the month for service rendered for a thirty (30) day period ending the 20th of the preceding month. These bills are due and payable upon receipt. Non-receipt of statement does not relieve the member of the responsibility of payment of bills by the 15th of the month that the bill was due and payable. All members delinquent on the 15th of the month will be sent notices advising them they failed to make payment; and upon the 20th of the month, a final notice will be sent the member that he is still delinquent; and if bill is not paid within five (5) days or by the 25th of the month, an employee of the Cooperative will be sent to the member's premises to collect the delinquent bill.

Request for Meter Test By Members

If the member's meter has been tested within the period as prescribed by Public Service Commission and the member doubts the accuracy of the meter by which his consumption is measured, the said member can file with the Cooperative a written

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request for a meter test with a deposit of \$2.50 to defray the costs of said test. If the meter is found incorrect, the deposit of \$2.50 will be refunded to the said member by the Cooperative.

Applications for Service.

Each applicant for service shall be required to sign application for service and pay \$5.00 membership fee; and upon contracting for the wiring of this premises, the electrician will be required to pay a fee of \$4.00 for the electrical inspection of the work installed in the applicant's premises. If, upon inspection, the work is found unsatisfactory and turned down by the electrical inspector, the electrician will be required to deposit with the Cooperative an additional fee for re-inspection. No member's premises will be connected for service until the electrical work has been approved by the State Electric Inspection Bureau inspector. The Cooperative requires three wire, 60 ampere service entrance to be installed on member's premises in all homes of three rooms or more. Two wire, 30 ampere entrances are permissible only in houses of two (2) rooms. Each kitchen must have installed two duplex convenience receptacles. New homes constructed on lines of Cooperative are required to make application for a rough-in inspection, the charge being \$4.00 payable to the Cooperative and a finished inspection after construction and work is complete and fee payable to the Cooperative is \$4.00.

Requirements for the number of outlets in your home shall be the National Electric Code requirements.

Conditions of Service

Every member who has more than one house on his premises wherein a separate family makes a separate home, each of said houses shall be metered separately.

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Members Requesting Temporary Service

Electricity to be used in the construction of buildings along lines of the Cooperative shall file written application for such service with a deposit of \$10.00 and service will be rendered for a period of six weeks, the amount of the current consumed shall not be in excess of 200 KWH. All in excess of this amount shall be charged at a rate of 2 1/2¢ per KWH.

A contractor receiving temporary service shall install necessary fuse protection equipment to protect Cooperative's transformer from overloads.

Consumers Deposits

A deposit of ten dollars (\$10.00) will be required of all consumers occupying rental property effective January 1, 1951, to be deposited prior to connecting said consumers and to be paid back with usual interest if bill is paid in full at time of vacating such property, otherwise to be used in paying all unpaid bills owed by said consumer.

Applicable:

All territories served.

Availability of Service:

Domestic.

Type of Service:

Single-phase, 60 cycle, 115/220 volts.

Rates:

First	40 KWH per month	8 1/8¢/KWH
Next	40 KWH per month	5¢ /KWH
Next	120 KWH per month	2 1/2¢/KWH
Over	200 KWH per month	1 1/2¢/KWH

Minimum Charge:

- (a) \$3.25 per month if 5 KVA, or less, of transformer capacity is required.
- (b) For customers requiring more than 5 KVA of transformer capacity, the minimum bill per month will be \$3.25 plus \$.50 for each KVA of transformer capacity required in excess of 5 KVA.
- (c) The customer shall be entitled to the use of the number of KWH corresponding to the minimum bill.

Special Rules:

- (a) Service under this schedule is limited to individual motors up to and including ten horsepower (10 H.P.).
- (b) Customers qualifying for Schedule E may be billed under this schedule if they so desire.

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SCHEDULE - A2

SERVICE TO TOBACCO BARNs

Availability:

This schedule shall be applicable only for service to tobacco barns using not over 3 KVA of transformer capacity and is limited to extensions not exceeding 1000 feet, including primary and secondary, subject to the established rules and regulations.

Type of Service:

Single phase, 60 cycles, at available secondary voltages.

Rates:

First	15 KWH per month	10¢	per KWH
Next	25 KWH per month	7¢	per KWH
Next	40 KWH per month	5¢	per KWH
Next	120 KWH per month	2 1/2¢	per KWH
Over	200 KWH per month	1 1/2¢	per KWH

Minimum Charge:

For extensions of 1000 feet or less, including primary and secondary, the minimum monthly charge will be \$1.50 per month. When the extension exceeds 1000 feet, the \$1.50 monthly minimum charge will be increased by $.66 \frac{2}{3}$ per cent of the cost of the excess over 1000 feet, using as a basis an average cost of \$1,000 per mile.

The consumer shall be entitled to use of the number of KWH corresponding to the minimum bill.

Contract Term:

The initial contract term under this schedule shall be five (5) years and thereafter until terminated by the consumer or the cooperative giving to the other three (3) months notice in writing.

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SCHEDULE A-S

SEASONAL RESIDENTIAL SERVICE

Applicable:

All territories served.

Availability of Service:

Residential use for periods aggregating not more than nine months per year.

Type of Service:

Single-phase, 60 cycle, 115/220 volts.

Rates:

First	40 KWH per month	8 1/8¢/KWH
Next	40 KWH per month	5¢ /KWH
Next	120 KWH per month	2 1/2¢/KWH
Over	200 KWH per month	1 1/2¢/KWH

Minimum Charge:

- (a) \$24.00 per year if 3 KVA, or less, of transformer capacity is required.
- (b) Where over 3 KVA of transformer capacity is required, the annual minimum charge will be 9 times the monthly minimum charge which would apply under Schedule A.

Special Rules:

- (a) Service under this schedule is limited to individual motors up to and including ten horsepower (10 H.P.).
- (b) Service need not be disconnected during periods of non-occupancy.
- (c) One bill may be rendered for the entire off-season period.

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SCHEDULE B
COMMERCIAL AND SMALL POWER SERVICE

Applicable:

All territory served.

Availability of Service:

Commercial, small industrial and three-phase domestic.

Type of Service:

Single or three-phase where available, 60 cycle, 115/220 volts.

Rates:

First	40 KWH per month	8 1/8¢/KWH
Next	40 KWH per month	5¢ /KWH
Next	920 KWH per month	2 1/2¢/KWH
Next	2,000 KWH per month	2¢ /KWH
Over	3,000 KWH per month	1 1/2¢/KWH

Minimum Charge:

- (a) \$3.25 per month if 5 KVA, or less, of transformer capacity is required.
- (b) For customers requiring more than 5 KVA of transformer capacity, the minimum bill per month will be \$3.25 plus 0.50 for each KVA of transformer capacity required in excess of 5 KVA.
- (c) The customer shall be entitled to the number of KWH corresponding to the minimum bill.

Special Rules:

- (a) Service under this schedule is limited to 25 KVA of transformer capacity.
- (b) A customer, having his home and business establishment in the same building, may include service to both on the same meter and be billed on this schedule. If the customer prefers to, he may make provision for two meters and have only his business billed under this schedule and his domestic use billed under the appropriate residential schedule.
- (c) Motors having a rated capacity in excess of ten horsepower (10 H.P.) must be three-phase.
- (d) In case it is necessary to extend or reinforce distribution lines, the customer must give satisfactory assurance, supported by a written agreement, as to the character, amount and duration of the business offered.

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SCHEDULE E

SERVICE TO SCHOOLS, CHURCHES AND COMMUNITY HALLS

Applicable:

All territories served.

Availability of Service:

Schools, churches, and community halls.

Type of Service:

Single-phase, 60 cycle, 115/220 volts.

Rates:

First	40 KWH per month	8 1/8¢/KWH
Next	40 KWH per month	5¢ /KWH
Next	120 KWH per month	2 1/2¢/KWH
Over	200 KWH per month	1 1/2¢/KWH

Minimum Charge:

- (a) \$24.00 per year if 3 KVA, or less, of transformer capacity is required.
- (b) For customers requiring more than 3 KVA of transformer capacity, the minimum bill per year will be \$24.00 plus \$9.00 for each KVA of transformer capacity required in excess of 3 KVA.

Special Rules:

- (a) Bills will be rendered monthly, and the extra charge for the minimum, if necessary, will be added to the twelfth bill.
- (b) Customers qualifying for this schedule may be billed under Schedule A if they so desire.

IRRIGATION SERVICE - SMALL

Applicable:

All territories served.

Availability of Service:

Crop irrigations systems.

Type of Service:

Single phase, 60 cycle, 120/240 volts.

Rates:

First	40 KWH per month	8 1/8¢/KWH
Next	40 KWH per month	5¢ /KWH
Next	120 KWH per month	2 1/2¢/KWH
Over	200 KWH per month	1 1/2¢/KWH

Minimum Charge:

- (a) \$39 per year if 5 KVA or less of transformer capacity is required.
- (b) For consumers requiring more than 5 KVA of transformer capacity, the minimum bill per year will be \$39 plus \$9 for each KVA of transformer capacity required in excess of 5 KVA.
- (c) The consumer shall be entitled to the use of the number of KWH corresponding to the minimum bill.

Special Rules:


- (a) Service under this schedule is limited to individual motors up to and including 10 H. P., which horse power shall be determined by the motor name plate rating or at the option of the Cooperative by a test conducted by the Cooperative under conditions of maximum operating load.

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SCHEDULE I

Irrigation Service - Small

- (b) Contracts under this schedule shall be for a term of at least three (3) years where it is necessary to construct a line including secondary and primary of 300 feet or less and for an additional year for each additional 300 feet or fraction thereof.
- (c) Motor loads totaling over 10 H. P. may not be served under this schedule but must be served under Schedule LP.
- (d) Bills will be rendered monthly, and the extra charge for the minimum, if necessary, will be added to the twelfth bill.

SCHEDULE LP

LARGE POWER SERVICE

Availability

Available to consumers located on or near Seller's three-phase lines for all types of usage, subject to the established rules and regulations of Seller.

Rate

\$ 1.50 per month per KW of billing demand
Plus energy charges of:
2.5¢ per KWH for the first 50 KWH used per month
per KW of billing demand.
1.5¢ per KWH for the next 100 KWH used per month
per KW of billing demand.
1.0¢ per KWH for all remaining KWH used per month.

Determination of Billing Demand

The billing demand shall be the maximum kilowatt demand established by the consumer for any period fifteen consecutive minutes during the month for which the bill is rendered, as indicated or recorded by a demand meter and adjusted for power factor as follows:

Power Factor Adjustment

The consumer agrees to maintain unity power factor as nearly as practicable. Demand charges will be adjusted for consumers with 50 KW or more of measured demand to correct for average power factors lower than 90%, and may be so adjusted for other consumers if and when the Seller deems necessary. Such adjustments will be made by increasing the measured demand 1% for each 1% by which the average power factor is less than 90% lagging.

Fuel Cost Adjustment Charge

In case the rate under which Seller purchases power at wholesale is adjusted in accordance with a fuel cost adjustment provision in Seller's wholesale power contract, the foregoing energy charges shall be adjusted each month by the same amount per KWH as the fuel cost adjustment per KWH in Seller's wholesale power bill for the next preceding month.

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SCHEDULE LP
LARGE POWER SERVICE

Minimum Monthly Charge

The minimum monthly charge shall be the highest one of the following charges as determined for the consumer in question.

- (1) The minimum monthly charge specified in the contract for service.
- (2) A charge of \$0.75 per KVA of installed transformer capacity.
- (3) A charge of \$25.

Minimum Annual Charge for Seasonal Service

Consumers requiring service only during certain seasons not exceeding nine months per year may guarantee a minimum annual payment of twelve times the minimum monthly charge determined in accordance with the foregoing section in which case there shall be no minimum monthly charge.

Type of Service

Three-phase, 60 cycles, at Seller's standard voltages.

Conditions of Service

1. Motors having a rated capacity in excess of ten horsepower (10 H. P.) must be three-phase.
2. Both power and lighting shall be billed at the foregoing rate. If a separate meter is required for the lighting circuit, the registrations of the two watt-hour meters shall be added to obtain total kilowatt-hours used and the registrations of the two demand meters shall be added to obtain the total kilowatt demand for billing purposes.
3. All wiring, pole lines, and other electrical equipment beyond the metering point, shall be considered the distribution system of the consumer and shall be furnished and maintained by the consumer.
4. If service is furnished at primary distribution voltage, a discount of ten per cent (10%) shall apply to the demand and energy charges, and if the minimum charge is based on transformer capacity, a discount of 10% shall also apply to the minimum charge. However, the Seller shall have the option of metering at secondary voltage and adding the estimated transformer losses to the metered kilowatt-hours and kilowatt demand.

Terms of Payment

The above rates are net, the gross rates being 10% higher on the first \$25 and 2% on the remainder of the bill. In the event the current monthly bill is not paid within fifteen (15) days from the date of the bill, the gross rates shall apply.

Availability:

Available to rural communities and villages for controlled multiple street lighting systems, furnishing lighting from dusk to dawn.

Discounts:

Where two or more lamps are served in any village or community, a discount from the above annual charges will apply to each lamp except one, as follows:

401 - 500 feet	4.00
501 - 700 feet	3.00
701 - 900 feet	2.00

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For service from dusk to midnight a discount of 10% of the Base Rate shall be allowed.

SCHEDULE SL-3

STREET LIGHTING SERVICE

Additional Charges:

The above charges apply to lamps mounted on brackets. An additional charge of \$3 per year will be made for each suspended unit.

The above charges apply to lamps mounted on existing poles of the Cooperative and where no additional poles are required for any necessary street lighting circuits. An additional charge of \$2 per year will be added to the total charge as determined above for each additional pole required, unless the village pays the installed cost of such additional poles.

Conditions of Service:

1. Street-lighting equipment including lamps, fixtures, and the necessary street-lighting circuits, transformers and additional guys and fittings will be furnished by the Cooperative. Where extensions of primary line are required, the total cost of such construction shall be paid by the village.
2. Lamp replacements will be made by the Cooperative. Any lamps replaced by the Cooperative will be charged to the village at cost as a separate item on the monthly bill for service.
3. Service will be furnished for future additional lamps in accordance with the above charges. The average spacing between lamps shall be recomputed to include the additional lamps.

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RATES

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
