### ORDINANCE NO. 94-07-21

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A REVISED SCHEDULE OF RATES AND CHARGES FOR THE USE AND SERVICES OF THAT PORTION OF THE COMBINED AND CONSOLIDATED MUNICIPAL WATERWORKS AND SEWER SYSTEM OF THE CITY OF SHELBYVILLE, KENTUCKY, FURNISHING SAID SERVICES.

WHEREAS, it is required that rates and charges for the use and services of the combined and consolidated Municipal Waterworks and Sewer System be prescribed and maintained so as to pay the interest upon and principal of said bonds as the same become due, and also pay operating and maintenance costs, as well as create an adequate depreciation fund; and

WHEREAS, the City of Shelbyville desires that the Municipal Waterworks and Sewer System receive a return on investment for the provision of these services from those customers located outside the City of Shelbyville; and

WHEREAS, the last water rates were last revised in 1981, and the sewer service charges were last revised in 1983, with expansion of both plant facilities and major infrastructure improvements occurring in the interim years; and

WHEREAS, the USEPA as well as the Kentucky Department of Natural Resources have and continue to impose more stringent criteria to improve both the quality of drinking water and treated wastewater, increasing the costs of providing these services; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Water and Sewer Commission has petitioned the city council to enact an ordinance establishing a revised schedule of rates and charges for the use and services of the portion of said combined and consolidated Municipal Waterworks and Sewer System furnishing such services:

Mull FOR THE PUBLIC ST NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City of Shelbyville, Kentucky, that Ordinance No. 81-04-07, Ordinance No. 83-04-01, and Ordinance No. 88-03-02, as relating to the pertinent water and sewer rates and charges are hereby amended as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> That from and after the effective date of this ordinance there shall be and there is hereby established a revised schedule of rates and charges for the use and services of the portion of said combined and consolidated Municipal Waterworks and Sewer System furnishing water services as follows:

(7) Fire Protection

Fire protection provided by fire hydrants outside the city limits of Shelbyville shall be provided at the rate of \$7.50 per month for each hydrant where installation is requested.

For subdivisions, fire protection shall be charged for once the system is dedicated to the city in accordance with the following formula:

(Number of Hydrants) x 7.50-per month (Number of Lots served) Rate

Fire protection for each lot shall be paid by the developer from installation and dedication until the lot is sold. Once the lot is sold and a meter installed, the individual land owner will be responsible for the fire protection charge for the individual lot. # (6) Fire Protection:

Fire protection provided by private fire hydrants outside the city limits of Shelbyville shall be charged at the rate of \$7.50 per month per hydrant.

Fire protection provided by sprinkler system shall be charged at the rate of \$0.0004 per square foot per month of building sprinkled.

# SECTION 2.

Be it further ordained that the ordinance pertaining to sewer service rates enacted April 1, 1983 is hereby amended as follows:

### SECTION 2 - SEWER RATES

2.2 Sewer rates provided in paragraph 2.1 are based on the underlying assumption that 90 percent of all metered water consumption is eventually returned to the sewage treatment system. Where it can be evidenced that the proportion of metered water consumption actually returned to the treatment system by an individual customer is significantly different from 90 percent, service charges shall be determined on the basis of measured or estimated wastewater discharge. In this event, service charges shall be computed by applying rates as shown in paragraph 2.1 plus 11 percent. The city reserves the right to determine by whatever means and methods it may find practicable, the amount of water consumption and/or wastewater discharge that shall be used to compute sewer service charges.

2.3 In the event that the Commission shall permit a user to discharge wastes to the sewage works having an average biochemical oxygen demand (BOD) content in excess of 250 mg/1, and/or an average suspended solids-(SS) content in excess of 250 mg/1, the user shall pay a surcharge based upon the excess strength of its wastes.

2.4 The following surcharge rates shall apply to each user of the sewage works that has received permission from the Commission to contribute excessive strength sewage.

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## SECTION 3:

Be it further ordained by the City of Shelbyville, Kaitworky 94 that Ordinance No. 88-03-02 enacted on March 29, 1989, and pertaining to System Development Charges for new wateurs and Tose dar 5011, SECTION 9(1) service is hereby amended as follows: andan " Mul

#### Α. Purpose and Policy

This ordinance sets forth uniform requirements for financing capital improvements to the water and sewer systems to serve growth and at the same time prevent or reduce the inequity to existing customers that would result when the existing customers must pay the increases in water or sewer rates that are needed to pay for added plant costs for new customers.

The method chosen to establish the SYSTEM DEVELOPMENT CHARGE is the system buy-in-method. This method is based on the premise that new customers are entitled to water services at the same prices charged to existing customers. However, it is also recognized that existing customers have provided funds for debt retirement, cash financing of improvements and additions to the water system through payment of water rates or through their own contribution of capital. New connections to the system shall be required to pay an amount corresponding to that which has already been paid by existing customers towards the water and sewer facilities.

#### Definitions Β.

Commission: The Shelbyville Water and Sewer Commission

System Development Charge is defined as the charge for SDC: a new meter and/or sewer connection which corresponds to that amount which has already been paid by existing customers towards the invested capital funds of the system.

Sewer Inspection Fee: That fee established by ordinance to recover costs of inspection of new sewer service connections and to obtain a sewer use permit.

Water Meter Fee: That fee established by ordinance to recover costs of setting new water services, inclusive of the metering device.

#### Method of establishing the System Development Charges c.

The system buy-in method utilizes the calculations of existing customers' equity based on:

The above charges for meter setting include materials, labor, and installation costs for installing the meter at the property line not more than 60 feet from the watermain. Installation of water meters at the property line which exceeds 60 feet from the watermain shall require payment of the meter setting fee above, plus the cost of labor and materials in excess of 60 feet. Requesting parties in all installations, including those within 60 feet of the watermain, shall pay for any expense of rock removal. Meter setting fees for meters greater than 1 inch shall be based on the costs of materials, labor, and installation of the meter plus 15%.

### E. <u>Payment of Charges</u>

1. No person shall begin construction on a development, and no building permit or occupancy permit shall be issued until all fees and/or charges have been paid and applicable permits obtained.

2. If the proposed development does not occur within 120 days of application, the charge may be refunded with Commission approval.

3. In the case of the SDC for an industrial, commercial, or other than residential duplexes or apartments, the initial SDC that was collected will be adjusted upward or downward after twelve months of operation. Based on the average usage of the last three months (of the twelve month period) average usage.

4. All charges and/or fees established by this ordinance shall be applicable to those users applying for connections as of the effective date of the ordinance.

5. At the end of each calendar year and no later than the 15th of January, the fee shall be reviewed by the Commission and adjusted as necessary with approval of the City Council.

At the same time the cost of new meter settings (5/8" and 1") shall be reviewed. Meter setting costs are determined by actual costs on a calendar year basis.

6. Revenue collected from the System Development Charge shall be deposited in a special account known OFKENUCKY "Water/Wastewater Facilities Expansion Account." EFFECTIVE

Section 4.

GENERAL REQUIREMENT FOR SEWER SERVICE CHARGES SEP 02 1994

1. Sewer service charges shall be charges 184884411 UDEORMAR 5011, users who discharge, cause or permit the discharge of sewer feelow and the public sewage treatment system. Rates or charges (for sewer, f service shall be based upon the quantity of water messered by the water meter supplied to the respective building or premises.

2. Sewer service charges shall be comprised of a system of user charges, excessive strength surcharges, a system of charges for debt service and may include return on investment.

<u>3.</u> User charges shall mean charges levied on users of the sewage system to offset the cost of operations and maintenance of the system including simple replacement costs.

4. Excessive strength surcharges shall mean charges levied on users of the sewage treatment system whose contributions contain conventional pollutants in concentrations which exceed limits specified herein for such pollutants and who are permitted to make such contributions to the system by decision of the Municipal Water and Sewer Commission. In the even that the Commission shall permit a user to discharge wastes to the sewage works having an average biochemical oxygen demand (BOD5) in excess of 250mg/1, and/or an average suspended solids (TSS) content in excess of 250 mg/1, and /or an average ammonia nitrogen (NH3-N) content in excess of 25 mg/1, the user shall pay a surcharge based upon the excess strength of its wastes.

5. Charges for debt service shall mean charges levied on users of the sewage treatment system to support the annual debt service obligations of the system.

6. No reduction in sewage service charges, fees, or taxes shall be permitted because of the fact that certain wastes discharged to the sewage works contain less than the 250 mg/1 of BOD5, 250 mg/1 of TSS, or 25 mg/1 of NH3-N.

7. The Commission shall review not less often than every two years the sewage contribution of users, and the total cost of operation and maintenance of the sewage works, and user charges. Based on such a review, the Commission shall recommend to the City, when necessary, a revised schedule of user charges which shall accomplish the following:

A. Maintain the proportionate distribution of operations and maintenance costs among users of the treatment system.

B. Generate sufficient revenues to offset the costs associated with the proper operation and maintenance of the system.

<u>C.</u> Generate sufficient revenues to support the annual debt service of the system.

D. Review excessive strength surcharges every 2 years.

### AMENDMENTS

# SECTION 7.

# ORDINANCE IN FORCE

This ordinance becomes effective immediately upon its adoption, approval, and publication as provided by law. The meter setting fees for new water connections shall become effective on August 1, 1994. The water and sewer rates set forth herein shall become effective for services provided after the August meter reading period, and will be reflected on the October, 1994 Bill.

Publication of this Ordinance shall be satisfied by publication in summary.
