14. DEPOSITS

- (T) (a) No deposit is required for residential, industrial, other public authority or resale customers for initiation of water service unless a customer has an unpaid bill from a previous account. A customer may call the office and a Kentucky-American Water Company service representative will mail out a contract which must be completed, signed and returned to the office within ten (10) days of date contract is mailed.
- (T) Any residential, industrial, other public authority or resale customer who has had a previous account charged off or who has an account with an unpaid balance in excess of \$10.00 must come into the office and pay the unpaid balance plus a deposit equivalent to one and one-third times the estimated average quarterly water bill or two times the estimated average monthly water bill before service can be initiated.
- (C) A deposit will be required from any new commercial customer in the amount of one and one-third times the estimated average quarterly water bill or two times the estimated average monthly water bill. The deposit will be based on the average bills of similar customers and premises in the system.
- (b) A deposit is required to reestablish service to a customer whose service has been shut off for nonpayment of bills two times consecutively, or three times within the last two-year period. The Company will require a deposit equivalent to one and one-third times the estimated average quarterly water bill or two times the estimated average monthly water bill.
- (T) Any customer who has a check returned unpaid by the bank due to insufficient funds may be required to pay a deposit calculated by the above mentioned criteria.
- (c) Simple interest at six percent (6%) will be paid on any deposit Kentucky-American Water Company retains. Interest will be paid annually. Deposit refunds are made one year from the date of the deposit to residential, industrial, other public authority and resale customers provided the customer has a satisfactory payment record for that period. The deposit and any accumulated interest thereon may be applied to any unpaid final bill of such customer.
- (T) deposit to residential, industrial, other public authority and resale customers provided the customer has a satisfactory payment record for that period. The deposit and any accumulated interest thereon may be applied to any unpaid final bill of such customer.

Interest will not be paid after discontinuance of service to the Customer if the Company has made reasonable effort to return the deposit to the Customer. Reasonable effort will have been made by the Company by mailing the deposit to the Customer at his last known address.

- (d) The Company will issue a Certificate of Deposit to every customer from whom a deposit is received and will provide reasonable ways and means whereby a Customer shall not be deprived of the return of his deposit because he may be unable to produce the original Certificate of Deposit.
- (e) If a customer files a petition in bankruptcy, consistent with 11 U.S.C. 366(B), Kentucky-American Water Company will require all such customers, within twenty days after the date of the filing of the petition, to furnish adequate assurance of payment in the form of a cash deposit for the continuation of service. Adequate assurance of payment shall be a deposit equivalent to one and one-third times the estimated average quarterly water bill of the customer or two times the estimated average monthly bill of the customer.

14. DEPOSITS

- (T) (a) No deposit is required for initiation of water service unless a customer has an unpaid bill from a previous account. A customer may call the office and a Kentucky-American Water Company service representative will mail out a contract which must be completed, signed and returned to the office within ten (10) days of date contract is mailed.

Any customer who has had a previous account charged off or who has an account with an unpaid balance in excess of \$10.00 must come into the office and pay the unpaid balance plus a deposit equivalent to one and one-third times the estimated average quarterly water bill or two times the estimated average monthly water bill before service can be initiated.

- (T) (b) A deposit is required to reestablish service to a customer whose service has been shut off for nonpayment of bills two times consecutively, or three times within the last two-year period. The Company will require a deposit equivalent to one and one-third times the estimated average quarterly water bill or two times the estimated average monthly water bill.

Any customer who has a check returned unpaid by the bank two times in a two-year period will be required to pay a deposit calculated by the above mentioned criteria.

- (T) (c) Simple interest at six percent (6%) will be paid on any deposit Kentucky-American Water Company retains. Interest will be paid annually. Deposit refunds are made one year from the date of the deposit provided the customer has a satisfactory payment record for that period. The deposit and any accumulated interest thereon may be applied to any unpaid final bill of such customer.

Interest will not be paid after discontinuance of service to the Customer if the Company has made reasonable effort to return the deposit to the Customer. Reasonable effort will have been made by the Company by mailing the deposit to the Customer at his last known address.

- (d) The Company will issue a Certificate of Deposit to every customer from whom a deposit is received and will provide reasonable ways and means whereby a Customer shall not be deprived of the return of his deposit because he may be unable to produce the original Certificate of Deposit.
