2. (Point of Delivery and Pressure) That water will be furnished at a reasonably constant pressure calculated
at 30 psi (min) from an existing eight (8) inch main supply at a point located on

If a greater pressure than that normally available at the point of delivery is required by the Purchaser, the cost of providing such greater pressure shall be borne by the Purchaser. Emergency failures of pressure or supply due to main supply line breaks, power failure, flood, fire and use of water to fight fire, earthquake or other catastrophe shall excuse the Seller from this provision for such reasonable period of time as may be necessary to restore service.
Purchaser shall * 3./ (Metering Equipment) To furnish, install, operate, and maintain at its own expense at point of delivery, the necessary metering equipment, including a meter house or pit, and required devices of standard type for properly measuring the quantity of water delivered to the Purchaser and to calibrate such metering equipment whenever requested by the Resolution but not more frequently than once every twelve (12) months. A meter registering not more than two percent (2%) above or below the test result shall be deemed to be accurate. The previous readings of any meter disclosed by test to be inaccurate
shall be corrected for thesix (6)months previous to such test in accordance with the percentage of inacculacy found by such tests. If any meter fails to register for any period, the amount of water furnished during such period shall be deemed to be the amount of water delivered in the corresponding period immediately prior to the failure, unless Seller
and Purchaser shall agree upon a different amount. The metering equipment shall be read onMonthly . An appropriate official of the Purchaser at all reasonable times shall have access to the meter for the purpose of verifying its readings. and/or Seller
4. (Billing Procedure) To furnish the Purchaser at the above address not later than the 10th day of month, with an itemized statement of the amount of water furnished the Purchaser during the preceding monthly billing
B. The Purchaser Agrees:
1. (Rates and Payment Date) To pay the Seller, not later than the15th day of each month, for water lelivered in accordance with the following schedule of rates:

C. It is further mutually agreed between the Seller and the Purchaser as follows:

- (Term of Contract) That this contract shall extend for a term of _ 40 years from the date of the initial delivery of any water as shown by the first bill submitted by the Seller to the Purchaser and, thereafter may be renewed or extended for such term, or terms, as may be agreed upon by the Seller and Purchaser.
- 2. (Delivery of Water) That _____ days prior to the estimated date of completion of construction of the Purchaser's water supply distribution system, the Purchaser will notify the Seller in writing the date for the initial delivery of water.
- (Water for Testing) When requested by the Purchaser the Seller will make available to the contractor at the point of delivery, or other point reasonably close thereto, water sufficient for testing, flushing, and trench filling the system of the Purchaser during construction, irrespective of whether the metering equipment has been installed at that time, at a gallons

flat charge of \$ 1.40 per 1.000 / which will be paid by the contractor or, on his fallure to pay, by the Purchaser.

- (Failure to Deliver) That the Seller will, at all times, operate and maintain its system in an efficient manner and will take such action as may be necessary to furnish the Purchaser with quantities of water required by the Purchaser. Temporary or partial failures to deliver water shall be remedied with all possible dispatch. In the event of an extended shortage of water, or the supply of water available to the Seller is otherwise diminished over an extended period of time, the supply of water to Purchaser's consumers shall be reduced or diminished in the same ratio or proportion as the supply to Seller's consumers is reduced or diminished.
- (Modification of Contract) That the provisions of this contract pertaining to the achedule of rates to be peid by the Purchaser for water delivered are subject to modification at the end of every one year period. In the event the City increases water rates to its customers, the rates which apply to this contract may be increased. The increase shall not exceed that percentage increase charged all other such customers of the CUC, within the WWS-1 Wholesale Service Classification. Other provisions of this contract may be modified or altered by mutual agreement. (Regulatory Agencies) That this contract is subject to such rules, regulations, or laws as may be applicable to similar agreements in this State and the Seller and Purchaser will collaborate in obtaining such permits, certificates, or the like, as may be required to comply therewith.
 - 7. (Miscellaneous) That the construction of the water supply distribution system by the Purchaser is being financed by a loan made or insured by, and/or a grant from, the United States of America, acting through the Farmers Home Administration of the United States Department of Agriculture, and the provisions hereof pertaining to the undertakings of the Purchaser are conditioned upon the approval, in writing, of the State Director of the Farmers Home Administration.
 - (Successor to the Purchaser) That in the event of any occurence rendering the Purchaser incapable of performing under this contract, any successor of the Purchaser, whether the result of legal process, assignment, or otherwise, shall succeed to the rights of the Purchaser hereunder.

WHEREAS, such an agreement will be in the best interest of both the City Utilities Commission of the City of Corbin, KY, and the Dewitt Water District of Artemus, KY;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That John L. Daniel, Chairman, is hereby authorized and directed to sign an agreement dated August 11, 1992, between the City Utilities Commission of the City of Corbin, KY, and the Dewitt Water District of Artemus, KY. A copy of same is attached hereto and made a part hereof as if copied at length in full.
