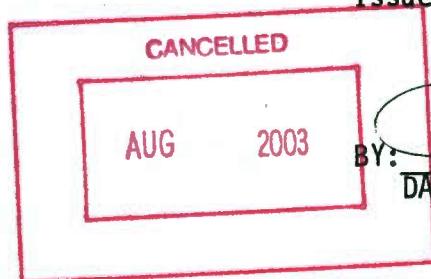

Rates and Classification of Service

1. APPLICATION: This tariff shall cover the entire service area of the Association, which consists of Northeast Boyle County and East and Southeast Mercer County as follows: Bounded on the east by Lake Herrington, Water Works Road and Dix River; on the north by Curdsville Road, Kentucky Highway 342, and Chatham Road; on the west by U.S. 68, the Harrodsburg City Limits and Dry Branch Road and Bluegrass Pike; and on the south by Gentry Lane, Danville City Limits and Kentucky Highway 34.

2. AVAILABILITY OF SERVICE: The Association does not distinguish between classes of customers in making water service available; however, all customers who rent the premises to which service is provided will be required to make the deposit as hereinafter set out and the renter and the actual owner or owners of the premises must sign the water user's agreement; in the event service to the premises is discontinued for failure to pay service will not be restored to the premises, regardless of the person or persons occupying same, until the bill is paid in full.

N All customers will pay equal deposits in the amount of \$20.00. This amount does not exceed the average bill of residential customers served by the Company and is equal to 2/12 of the average annual bill.

In addition to the foregoing rates a temporary construction surcharge of \$4.50 shall be added to each monthly bill for a period of five (5) years from February 1, 1992.

In addition to the foregoing rates and temporary construction surcharge a second temporary construction surcharge of \$1.80 shall be added to each monthly bill for a period not to exceed five (5) years from February 1, 1992, as set out in PSC Order No. 91-326. If the sum total surcharge proceeds and any accumulated interest earned thereon reaches \$155,000.00 before the 5 year period ends, assessment of the surcharge shall cease.

N 3A. The Association will publish a copy of all applicable rates in a newspaper of general circulation once each year at least thirty (30) days prior to the annual membership meeting. A copy of the billing form imposing said rates is attached to this tariff as Exhibit A.

3B. PURCHASED WATER ADJUSTMENT APPLICABLE TO ALL RATE SCHEDULES.

(1) The Rates authorized herein are based upon the wholesale cost of water to the utility pursuant to valid contracts or wholesale tariffs on file with the Commission. For the purposes of this purchased water adjustment clause, the wholesale rate shall be considered as the base rate for purchased water and any increase or decrease in the base rate shall be considered the changed rate. 4. MINIMUM CHARGE: Nine dollars eighty-five cents (\$9.85) minimum charge up to and including the first thousand (1,000) gallons per month.

5. DELAYED PAYMENT CHARGE: Ten percent (10%) penalty for all bills not paid by the 10th of the month following issuance of the bill. No discount for early or pre-payment.

6. SPECIAL CHARGES:

The following charges for special services shall be made:

A. SERVICE RECONNECTION CHARGE: A charge of \$45.00 shall be made for all service reconnections made during regular working hours, except that there shall be no connection charges made for service on the original installation of facilities.

B. METER READING RECHECK CHARGE: A charge of \$20.00 shall be made for a trip to recheck a meter reading when the customer requests the meter to be rechecked for a correct reading and the meter was not misread.

C. METER TEST: Upon request and payment of \$20.00 a customer may have his meter tested provided request by the customer is not more frequent than once each twelve months. If test shows the meter to be more than two percent fast, a refund of the \$20.00 charge shall be made and the bill adjusted accordingly. If the Public Service Commission periodic testing requirement has not been met for the meter tested, no charge will be made for the test regardless of the results of the test.

The following rules and regulations are subject to change by the water association commissioners at any time subject to approval by the Public Service Commission of Kentucky. These Rules and Regulations govern the furnishing of water service by Lake Village Water Association, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the Association and apply to all service received from the Association. No employee or individual Commissioner of the Association is permitted to make an exception to these Rates, Rules, or Regulations. These Rules and Regulations are to be in effect so long as they are not in conflict with the Kentucky Public Service Commission's Rules and Regulations. The Association is subject to all Rules and Regulations of the Kentucky Public Service Commission even though not contained herein.

1. Meters will be read monthly between the 20th and 24th of each month; weather permitting.

7. SCOPE: This Schedule of Rules and Regulations is a part of all contracts for receiving water service from the Association, and applies to all service received from the Association whether the service is based upon contract, agreement, signed application, or otherwise. A copy of this tariff, which includes the Association's Schedule of Rates and Charges shall be kept open to inspection at the office of the Association. The rules are promulgated under direction and authority granted pursuant to Chapter 5 of Kentucky Administrative Regulations which are hereby adopted and included the same as if herein written.

8. REVISIONS: These Rules and Regulations may be revised, amended, supplemented, or otherwise changed from time to time by either of the two (2) following methods:

(A) By order of the Kentucky Public Service Commission upon formal application by the Association, and after hearing as provided by Commission Regulations.

(B) By issuing and filing, on at least twenty (20) days notice to the Kentucky Public Service Commission and the public, all proposed changes in the Rules and Regulations, as provided by Commission Regulations.

9. CONFLICT: In case of conflict between any provisions of the rate schedule and the schedule of rules and regulations, the rate schedule shall apply. Also, should the rules contained herein conflict with Public Service Commission rules in effect the provisions of the Public Service Commission shall take precedence over those contained herein.

10. APPLICATION FOR SERVICE: Any person, firm, agency or governmental entity within the current boundary of the Association may request service. Applications for service must be in writing on a form approved by the Association.

Each applicant for service shall be required to execute and sign the Association's standard water users agreement before service is supplied by the Association. A 5/8" X 3/4" meter shall be the standard customer service meter and should be installed at all points of service unless the customer provides sufficient justification for the installation of a larger meter.

11. NON-STANDARD SERVICE: Each prospective customer requiring a non-standard service (i.e., other than a 5/8" X 3/4" meter) shall present to the Association sufficient justification for same.

12. POINT OF DELIVERY: The point of delivery is the point where the meter or vault is located on the customer's premises. All water lines, plumbing, and equipment beyond the meter shall be installed and maintained by the customer. The Association reserves the right to determine the location of point of delivery; however, the wishes of the prospective customer will be considered.

13. CUSTOMER'S SERVICE LINE: All service lines beyond the metering point should be installed of material consisting of copper, galvanized, PVC or PE pipe with rating not less than 200 psi. The size of service line beyond the point of delivery should not be less than 3/4". The Association will not set a meter on the customer's service line at a point that does not deliver 30 psig at the meter.

Should an applicant for service desire a higher pressure due to his location or need, he may make provision for an individual pressure booster system. The manner of connection, location cross-connection

The customer shall install, own and maintain his service line from meter and/or point of delivery as defined herein.

15. DISCONTINUANCE OF SERVICE BY ASSOCIATION: Water service may be discontinued by the Association for any violation of any rule, regulation, or condition, and especially for any of the following reasons:

A. Misrepresentation in the application or contract as to the property or fixtures to be supplied or use to be made of water.

C. Waste or misuse of water due to improper or imperfect service pipes and/or failure to keep such pipes in a suitable state of repair.

D. Tampering with meter, meter seal, service, or valves, or permitting such tampering by others.

E. Connection, cross-connection, or permitting the same, of any separate water supply to premises which receive water from the Association.

F. Non-payment of bills.

G. When a dangerous condition is found to exist on the customer's or applicant's premises, with reference to the continuation of water service, water service shall be cut off without notice or shall be refused, provided the Association shall notify the customer or applicant immediately of the reasons for the discontinuance or refusal and the corrective action to be taken by the applicant or customer before service can be restored.

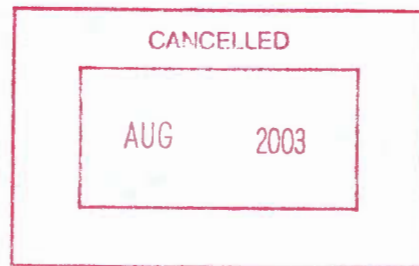

15A: PARTIAL PAYMENT PLANS AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION: The system operator shall be the designated representative to answer customer questions, resolve disputes and negotiate partial payment plans. Any member who does not receive a satisfactory answer, resolution or partial payment plan may present the matter to the next regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Association; which board meets on the first Tuesday of each month.

Partial payment plans which extend for a period longer than thirty (30) days shall be in writing and shall advise customers that service may be terminated without additional notice if the customer fails to meet any of the obligations of the plan.

16. BILLING: Bills and notices relating to the conduct of the business of the Association will be mailed to the customer at the address listed on the "User's Agreement" unless a change of address has been filed in writing with the Association; and the Association shall not otherwise be responsible for delivery of any bill or notice nor will the customer be excused from the payment of any bill or any performance required in said notice.

Bills for water service are due and payable at the office of the Association, or to any designated agent on the date of issue. The past due date shall be the tenth (10th) day after the date of issue. Bills will be dated and mailed on or about the first (1st) of each month.

A bill not paid on or before the past due date shall be deemed delinquent. When a bill has been delinquent for a period of thirty days (30), the Association shall serve the delinquent customer a written final notice of said delinquency, and of the intent of the Association to discontinue service ten days after the date of such notice unless such bill is paid prior to the expiration of such ten days. if, prior to discontinuance of service, there is delivered to the Association, or its employee empowered to discontinue service, a written certificate signed by a physician, registered nurse, or a public health officer that, in the opinion of the certifier, discontinuance of service will aggravate an existing illness or infirmity at the affected premises, service shall not be discontinued until the affected resident can make other living arrangements or until thirty (30) days elapse from the time of the Association receipt of said certification, whichever occurs first.

N 19. DEPOSIT: The company shall require a minimum cash deposit to secure payment of all bills. Service may be refused or discontinued for failure to pay the requested deposit. Interest, as prescribed by KRS 273.392, will be paid annually either by refund or credit to the customer's bill, except that no refund or credit will be made if the customer's bill is delinquent on the anniversary date of the deposit.

The required deposit will be returned after one (1) year if the customer has established a satisfactory payment record for that period and the customer's bill is not delinquent on the anniversary date of the deposit. 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If a deposit is held longer than eighteen (18) months, deposit will be recalculated at the customer's request based on the customer's actual usage. If the deposit on account differs from the recalculated amount by more than \$10.00, the Company may collect any underpayment and shall refund any overpayment by check credit to the customer's bill. No refund will be made if the customer's bill is delinquent at the time of the recalculation.

19A. MONITORING CUSTOMER USAGE: At least once annually the Association will monitor the usage of each customer according to the following procedure:

a. The customer's annual usage for the most recent 12-month period will be compared with the annual usage for the 12 months immediately preceding that period.

b. If the annual usage for the two periods are substantially the same or if any difference is known to attributed to unique circumstances, such as unusual weather conditions, common to all customers, no further review will be done.

In addition to the annual monitoring, the Association will immediately investigate usage deviations brought to its attention as a result of its on-going meter reading or billing processes or customer inquiry.

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A. If the result of such tests shows an average error greater than 2% fast, the customer's bill for the period during which the meter error is known to have existed, shall be recomputed and the account adjusted on the basis of the test. If the period during which the meter error existed cannot be determined, then the customer's bill shall be recomputed for one-half (1/2) of the elapsed time since the last periodic test, but in no event to exceed 12 months. If however, the time for a periodic test has overrun to the extent that one-half (1/2) of the time elapsed since the last periodic test exceeds 12 months, the refund shall be for the 12 months specified above, plus those months exceeding test period. The Kentucky Public Service Commission may not require a refund for the overrun period if failure to make the periodic test was due to causes beyond the control of the Association.

B. If the results of such tests show an average error greater than 2% slow, the customer's bill for the period during which the meter error is known to have existed, shall be recomputed and the account adjusted on the basis of the test. If the period during which the meter error existed cannot be determined, then the customer's bill shall be recomputed for one-half (1/2) of the elapsed time since the last test, but in no event to exceed 12 months.

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C. If the results of such tests mandate making a refund or back billing a customer, the customer shall be notified in writing of the percentage of error, fast or slow, the date(s) of testing, and the amount of charge or credit to be shown on the next bill of the customer.

21. METERS: Apart from the special charge set out in the Schedule of Rates and Classification of Service, all meters shall be installed, renewed, and maintained at the expense of the Association, and the Association reserves the right to approve the size and type of meter used. It shall be the policy of the Association to test each water meter pursuant to Public Service Commission Regulations. In addition, upon written request of any customer, the meter servicing such customer shall be tested by the Association, pursuant to Public Service Commission Regulations.

22. FAILURE OF WATER METER: Where a meter is found to be in error, the customer's bill will be adjusted as set out above. Where a meter has ceased to register, the Association will estimate the monthly bill of the customer for the month that the meter is replaced. The estimated bill will be based upon the previous six months usage.

23. RIGHT OF ACCESS: The customer must agree to permit the Association to lay, maintain, repair, or remove its water lines that are located on the customer's

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property with the right of ingress-and-egress over customer's property. The Association's duly authorized representative and/or other duly authorized employee of the State Health Department bearing proper credentials and identification shall be permitted to enter upon all properties for the purpose of inspection, observation, measurement, sampling and testing, in accordance with the provisions of these Rules and Regulations.

24. INTERRUPTION OF SERVICE: The Association will use reasonable diligence in supplying water service, but shall not be liable for loss, injury, or damage to persons or property resulting from interruptions in service, excessive or inadequate water pressure. The Association does hereby explicitly state that its system is one for rural domestic consumption and is not designed nor intended for use for fire protection in any manner whatsoever. Any customer using same for fire protection does so at their own full and sole responsibility.

The Association shall in no event be held responsible for any claim made against it by reason of breaking of any mains or service pipes or by reason of any other interruption of the supply of water caused by the failure of machinery or stoppage for necessary repairs. No person shall be entitled to damages nor for any portion of a payment refunded for any

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interruption for service which in the opinion of the Association may be deemed necessary.

The Association shall make all reasonable efforts to eliminate interruption of service and when such interruption occur will endeavor to restore service with the shortest possible delay. When the service is interrupted all consumers affected by such interruption will be notified in advance whenever it is possible to do so.

25. BOILERS AND/OR PRESSURE VESSELS: Customers having boilers and/or pressure vessels receiving a supply of water from the Association must have a check valve on the water supply line and a vacuum valve on the stream line to prevent collapse in case the water supply from the Association is discontinued or interrupted for any reason, with or without notice. It is the responsibility of the customer to make provisions for protection of his equipment in case of interrupted or intermittant service.

26. BACKFLOW PREVENTORS: Special services shall have backflow preventors of a type approved by the Association, installed at the cost of the customer or applicant for service.

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27. CROSS-CONNECTION: Kentucky Department of Health, Kentucky Public Service Commission and these Rules and Regulations do hereby explicitly state that cross-connection of the Association's system with any other source is hereby prohibited.

28. RELOCATION OF WATER FACILITY: The Association may, at the request of a customer or other person, relocate, change or modify existing Association owned equipment, mains or appurtenances. Same shall reimburse Association for such changes at actual cost including appropriate legal, administrative, engineering and overhead cost.

29. DAMAGE TO ASSOCIATION'S WATER SYSTEM: No person shall maliciously, willfully, or negligently break, damage, destroy, uncover, deface, or tamper with any structure appurtenance, or equipment which is a part of the Association's water works. Any person violating this provision shall be subject to immediate arrest and/or discontinuation of water service and shall pay the cost of repairing or replacing the pipe or appurtenance.

Any person, firm or organization involved in work around or near Association's distribution mains or appurtenances may request the Association to indicate location of same. However, indication by

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Association of same does not relieve such person of complete responsibility and liability for any and all damages, liability or loss resulting from any act by such person or his assigns and/or agent.

30. ADDITIONAL LOAD: The service connection supplied by the Association for each customer has a definite capacity, and no addition to the equipment or load connected thereto will be allowed except by consent of the Association. Failure to give notice of additions or changes in load, and to obtain the Association's consent for same, shall render the customer liable for any damage to any of the Association's lines or equipment caused by the additional or changed installation.

31. NOTICE OF TROUBLE: The customer shall notify the Association immediately should the service be unsatisfactory for any reason, or should there be any defects, trouble or accidents affecting the supply of water.

32. WATER MAIN EXTENSIONS: Any person desiring an extension to the Association system shall request in writing, in a form approved by the Association, for such extension. Any requested extension may be provided under one of the following options:

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OPTION I: Association shall construct water main extensions under the authority and procedure stipulated in Public Service Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 12; a copy is attached hereto as Appendix I. Any extension made under this option shall be subject to refund as outlined in said regulation.

OPTION II: Applicant may construct and donate to Association the extension as a contribution in aid of construction, meeting all Association's specifications and approval. Association reserves right to stipulate applicable engineering, legal and administrative factors. Applicant shall pay all cost of Association as a contribution in aid of construction. Any extension made under this option shall not be eligible for refund.

The applicant or group of applicants shall have the right to elect the option by which said extensions shall be made. In either case applicant must execute a contract and agreement for line extension on forms approved by the Association.

Each applicant is hereby notified that regardless of option selected all other rules, rates and schedules of fees applicable to size and type of service requested shall be paid in addition to cost of extension.

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33. COMPLAINTS: Complaints may be made to the operator, bookkeeper or the Association's Board of Directors. Decisions of the Association's Board may be brought before the Public Service Commission in accordance with 807 KAR 5:001 Section 11 and 12.

34. SALE OF WATER: Water furnished by the Association may be used by the customer's household or business; the customer shall not sell, donate, give or allow use of such water to any authorized or unauthorized party.

35. SPECIAL CHARGES: Special charges may be assessed to the customer for returned checks, meters rereads, and meter tests at the specified charges shown below:

A. A charge of \$10.00 will be made for each check returned to the Association by the bank.

B. A charge of \$20.00 will be made to reread a meter at the customers request unless such reread reveals that the initial reading was erroneous. No charge shall be made if the initial reading was erroneous.

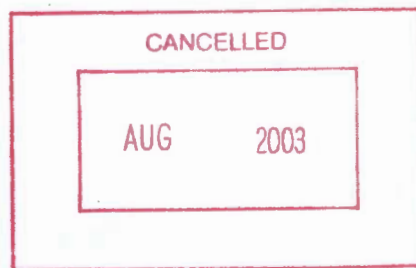
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C. A charge of \$20.00 will be made for a meter test when such test is made at the customer's request unless the meter is found to be faulty. No charge shall be made for a faulty meter, but appropriate adjustments shall be made in accordance with Section 20 of these Rules and Regulations.

35. SPECIAL USER AGREEMENTS FOR NONSTANDARD SERVICE: Each applicant for nonstandard service shall execute to the Association an agreement for special service.

CHAPTER 5

807 KAR 5:066. Water

Section 12. Extension of service.

1. Normal extension:

An extension of fifty (50) feet or less shall be made by a utility to its existing distribution main without charge for a prospective customer who shall apply for and contract to use service for one (1) year or more and provides a guarantee for such service.

2. Other extensions:

a. When an extension of the utility's main to serve an applicant or group of applicants amounts to more than fifty (50) feet per applicant, the utility ~~may if not inconsistent with its filed tariff~~ require the total cost of the excessive footage over fifty (50) feet per customer to be deposited with the utility by the applicant or the applicants, based on the average estimated cost per foot of the total extension.

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b. Each customer receiving service under such extension will be reimbursed under the following plan: Each year for a period of not less than ten (10) years, which for the purpose of this rule shall be the refund period, the utility shall refund to the customer or customers who paid for the excessive footage the cost of fifty (50) feet of the extension in place for each additional customer connected during the year whose service line is directly connected to the extension installed and not to extensions or laterals therefrom, but in no case shall the total amount refunded exceed the amount paid the utility. After the end of the refund period, no refund will be required to be made.

3. An applicant desiring an extension to a proposed real estate subdivision may be required to pay the entire cost of the extension. Each year for a period of not less than ten (10) years the utility shall refund to the applicant who paid for the extension a sum equal to the cost of fifty (50) feet of the extension installed for each additional customer connected during the year but in no case shall the total amount refunded exceed the amount paid to the utility. After the end of the refund period from the completion of the extension, no refund will be required to be made.

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4. Nothing contained herein shall be construed to prohibit the utility from making extensions under different arrangements provided such arrangements have been approved by the Commission.

5. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as to prohibit a utility from making at its expense greater extensions than herein prescribed, should its judgment so dictate, provided like free extensions are made to other customers under similar conditions.

6. Upon complaint to and investigation by the commission a utility may be required to construct extensions greater than fifty (50) feet upon a finding by the commission at such extension is reasonable.

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
