13. Deposit

The District reserves the right to require that a nominal amount be placed on deposit with the district for the purpose of insuring the payment of bills. The deposit will not exceed two-twelfths (2/12) of the customer's estimated annual bill. Upon payment of deposit, the district shall issue to the customer a certificate of deposit, showing the name of the customer, the location of the initial premises occupied by the customer, and the date and amount of the deposit. The district will pay interest on the customer's deposit at the rate of six percent (6%) per annum, until the date of it's refund to the customer. Interest will be refunded or credited to the customer's bill annually.

The deposit may be waived upon a customer's showing of satisfactory payment history, and required deposits will be returned after one year if the customer has established a satisfactory payment record for that period. If a deposit has been waived or returned and the customer fails to maintain a satisfactory payment record, a deposit may then be required. The company may require a deposit in addition to the initial deposit if the customer's classification of services changes or if there is a substantial change in usage. Upon termination of service, the deposit, any principal amounts, and any interest earned and owing will be credited to the final bill with any remainder refunded to the customer.

14. Adjustment Relative to Erroneous Meter

If a meter is inaccurate in excess of +-2%, whether upon periodic testing or upon requested testing, additional tests shall be made at once to determine the average error of the meter, and the adjustments shall be made in the customer's water bills as follows:

A. If the result of such test shows an average error greater than 2% fast, the customer's bill for the period during which the meter error is known to have existed, shall be recomputed and the account adjusted on the basis of the test. In the event the period during which the meter error existed is unknown, then the customer's bill shall be recomputed for one half of the elapsed time since the test, or for the last twelve month period, whichever is less.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

13. Deposit

The District reserves the right to require that a nominal amount be placed on deposit with the District for the purpose of establishing or maintaining any customer's credit. The deposit will not exceed two-twelfths (2/12) of the customer's estimated annual bill. Upon payment of deposit, the District shall issue to the customer a certificate of deposit, showing the name of the customer, the location of the initial premises occupied by the customer, and the date and amount of the deposit. The District will pay interest on the customer's deposit at the rate of six percent (6%) per annum, until the date of it's refund to the customer.

14. Adjustment Relative to Erroneous Meter

If a meter is inaccurate in excess of $\pm 2\%$, whether upon periodic testing or upon requested testing, additional tests shall be made at once to determine the average error of the meter, and the adjustments shall be made in the customer's water bills as follows:

- A. If the result of such tests shows an average error greater than 2% fast, the customer's bill for the period during which the meter error is known to have existed, shall be recomputed and the account adjusted on the basis of the test. In the event the period during which the meter error existed is unknown, then the customer's bill shall be recomputed for one half (1/2) of the elapsed time since the last previous test, or for the past twelve (12) month period, whichever is less.
