REVISION OF: Sheet 1, Section 1, "BILLING", Paragraph A., lines #7, #8 & #9 to read the following:

" All water bills become due on the tenth (10) of the month following the billing month. A ten percent (10%) penalty will be added to all accounts past due."

The District's Rules and Regulations, Sheet 1, Section I "BILLING", Paragraph A., lines #7, #8 & #9 state that the penalty date is the 17th of the billing month. The District's Board of Commissioners, by motion, changed the penalty date to the 10th of the month following the billing month. Therefore, the billing month has been changed also. SECTION I BILLING

A. Water to all services must be metered. Meters a furnished by the District and read by the District on a bi-monthly basis. Bills are rendered at regular intervals in a bi-monthly period. Estimated bills are rendered when meter readings are not obtained. Estimated bills will be based upon recorded usage and seasonal conditions. Estimated bills will be rendered for three billing periods after which time it may be cause to discontinue water service and/or a service charge to obtain the meter reading. All water bills become delinquent after the seventeenth (17th) of the billing month. A ten percent (10%) penalty will then be added to the delinquent account.

1A. When a customer's service is disconnected at one location and then connected at another, the balance due at the original location will be transferred to the account of the new location. The service to the new location may then be disconnected if the customer becomes delinquent in the payment of the original balance.

B. High bills or unnecessary waste of water. The customer shall be billed for all metered water whether or not intentionally taken or inadvertently or mistakenly wasted, by a leak or otherwise.

C. Bills are payable at the District office from 8:30 A.M. to 4:30 P.M. except on holidays, Monday through Friday or at such other offices as may be designated and at the night depository located at the District Office or by mail, Route 7, Box 184, Benton, KY. 42025.

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OF KENTUCKY
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SECTION II DEFAULT IN PAYMENT

A. A customer is in default of payment for water services if the payment is not made on or before the due date. If a customer's check is not honored by the bank for any reason and if their bill has become delinquent at the time of payment shall be cause for discontinuance of service in compliance with 807 KAR 5:006, Section 11. The District shall demand cash payment under these conditions.

B. Failure to pay for service and such other costs, present or prior address, as may accrue against said customer in accordance with statements issued from the office of the District, as they become due and payable, shall cause the service at such property to be discontinued and a service fee must be paid, in addition to the regular statement, before the water will be reconnected at said service. Discontinuance of service for failure to pay will be done in compliance with Public Service Commission's Rules and Regulation, 807 KAR 5:006, Section 11.

SECTION III UNAUTHORIZED USE OF WATER

A. The obtaining of water service so as to avoid payment for such service, including but not limited to tampering with the meter, installing a bypass around the meter, connections for service without a meter, or by any other method, is prohibited and shall be cause for termination of service.

SECTION IV CUSTOMER RESPONSIBILITY

A. The customer is responsible for the maintenance of the area around the meter box location to the extent that the meter may be found and read without the necessity of cutting bushes, vines, etc.. It is also the responsibility of the customer to provide access to meter locations that are beyond fences, gates or stiles. The customer is responsible for leaks beyond the customer's connection to the meter.

B. Water leaks cost you money, therefore, keep your plumbing in good repair. Services after this date shall include a ball valve outside or inside the meter box for customer use. The yoke valve before the meter and on the yoke is for District Personnel use only.

SECTION V DEPOSITS

A. Applicant agrees to make a security deposit with the District for the purpose of establishing or maintaining credit, such an amount not to exceed two-twelfths (2/12) of the estimated annual bill of such customer. The District agrees to pay interest at six per cent (6%) annually on deposits. For deposits retained over six months customers may request a recalculation of their deposit. Such customers shall be notified of their right to a recalculation.

B. The deposit, with any accrued interest, shall be returned to the applicant at the time a final bill is issued if no delinquency exist against the account. Any amounts due for water service and other charges that may have accrued against the applicant, will be deducted from the refund otherwise due the applicant. The balance, if any, will be refunded to the applicant.

SECTION VI WATER METERS

A. GENERAL

All water shall be metered.

Each individual residence must have its' own meter. Sub-service from another metered service line is not permitted. Water service lines MAY NOT be extended to serve another residence or place of business or in reverse. However, the General Manager may, by approval from the District's Board, permit an extended service from a home owner's service line to serve a mobile home occupied by a member of the home owner's immediate family located on the home owner's property.

C. APARTMENTS, DUPLEXES and CONDOMINIUMS

Each building must have at least one individual meter that does not take water from another metered line or building. Additional meters may be installed with the proper application at the District office. Multi-metering systems shall be installed with remotes near the service entrance to the building and no meter shall be a sub-meter. Central metering of more than one building in a complex is not permitted. District meters measuring the total flow of any water main shall not be considered as a central meter.

D. SHOPPING CENTERS

1. Separate meters are required for individual buildings not under the same roof.
2. Additional meters may be installed for tenants or for other purposes in the same building provided there is separate applications made for each meter. The additional meters can not be sub-meters.
3. Individual meters for each tenant may be installed provided there is an individual service from a main or authorized service to each unit.

E. OWNERSHIP

All meters are the property of the District.

F. INSTALLATION AND REMOVAL

All meters shall be set and reset by a District employee

1. The meter shall be located on the customer's property (premises) either in an outdoor meter box or inside the customer's building.

1A. When the meter is to be installed in an outside meter box, the box shall be located in a convenient and readily accessible location. The customer may request the location of the meter box, if feasible and within the rules and regulations the meter shall be located at that point. The box shall be located in an area to prevent damage from vehicular traffic.

1B. When a meter is to be located inside a building the meter shall be located within three feet of where the service enters the building and not less than six inches above the floor or excavation level. The meter shall have a remote register and must be accessible for inspection and removal for testing.

H. METER TESTING

1H. The District shall upon written request by a customer test a water meter 3/4 inch or smaller for a \$15.00 service charge. The service charge must be paid in advance. The customer should be present during the removal of the meter and during testing.

2H. If the accuracy of the meter is found not to be within the limits required by the Kentucky Public Service Commission, the meter shall be replaced with an accurate meter and the service charge shall be refunded to the customer.

3H. If the meter is found to be inaccurate beyond the required limits the customer shall be refunded or back billed as set out in 807 KAR 5:006, Section 9.

I. DAMAGE TO WATER METERS

PURSUANT TO KAR 5:006, SECTION 9(1)

1I. Water meters damaged by the customer from their attempts to thaw, alter or change the meter readings in any way, shall be replaced by the District and the customer shall be charged, based on the actual cost of labor and materials, for the removal of the damaged meter and installation of the new meter.

2I. The customer shall be charged for damage to the remote read-out and cable when caused by customer's neglect, customer's animals, and attempt to alter the remote read-out. If a metal sheath cable has to be installed for cable protection, it shall be at the customer's expense. The charge shall be based on the actual cost of labor and materials.

J. OWNERSHIP

1J. The District owns and maintains all meters, meter setters, meter boxes, meter box rings and lids and main stop cock and service line to the meter.

2J. The customer owns and is responsible for the repair and maintenance for the service line from the meter to his premises.

SECTION VII PUBLIC AND PRIVATE FIRE HYDRANTS

A. OPERATION of FIRE HYDRANTS

1A. Hydrants may be used by others by license agreement with the District under the conditions and rates established by the Board of COMMISSIONERS for such services. Hydrants shall not be used for any other purpose without expressed permission of the District.

B. PENALTY FOR UNAUTHORIZED USE

Anyone who shall operate or attempt to operate a fire hydrant without permission of the District may be prosecuted as provided by law.

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C. RELOCATION OF HYDRANTS

1C. Where an existing fire hydrant interferes with a property owner's use or purpose of their property, the hydrant may be relocated by the District at the expense of the property owner making the request.

2C. Where the grade of an existing road, street or property is changed, at the request of the property owner, such that the existing hydrant will not be at proper elevation with respect to the ground, the hydrant will be lowered or raised at the expense of the property owner.

D. OBSTRUCTION of HYDRANTS

1D. Nothing shall be erected or planted which shall interfere with the use of a hydrant. Sufficient clearance shall be maintained around the hydrant to permit easy connection of hoses and full circle operation of the hydrant using regular hydrant wrenches and hose spanners.

2D. Shrubs, Trees, flowers or weeds shall not be permitted to grow around or close to a hydrant so as to prevent full view of a hydrant from the street or road.

E. PRIVATE FIRE PROTECTION

Private fire protection consists of a fire service connection to the District water main and any of the following: automatic sprinkler system(s), standpipe(s), fire pump(s) fire hydrant(s).

F. OPERATION of PRIVATE FIRE PROTECTION SYSTEMS

Private fire protection systems are installed primarily for fire protection for the property on which they are installed and are not to be used for any other purpose with out expressed permission of the District.

I. PENALTIES for IMPROPER USE

1I. When the owner(s) or occupant(s) of any premises or property are found to be using water from a private fire protection system for other purposes than fire protection, the District reserves the right to require the installation of an approved fire line water meter, at the owner's expense, or an additional line and meter at the owner's expense.

SECTION VIII

APPLICATION FOR SERVICE

A. APPLICANT

1A. Any plumber or contractor desiring a permit to extent (install) a water service to a premise to supply water by meter thereto, must apply in writing at the office of the District on forms prescribed and furnished therefor, stating therein the lot number, the street and house number, size of service and property location (addition/subdivision) road, route and box number.

2A. An application is necessary for each meter. If a tap is designed to service or supply more than one meter or additional taps for one meter a separate application must be taken for each tap (service) and each meter. Where premises consist of detached or more than one building on property abutting on water mains, there shall be at least one tap at the main for each service installed and thereby an application is required for each service. It shall be illegal to run a service from one building to another.

3A. The District reserves the right to inspect the service before the water is turned on at the main corporation stop and/or the meter.

SECTION IX SERVICE and TAPS

A. SIZE OF TAP

1A. The District reserves the right to determine the size of the service connection (tap) to be installed, giving consideration to the needs of the applicant and the capacity of the main to which the service is to be connected. No service connection shall be approved of a size larger than can be supplied by the water main without adversely affecting service to other customers.

2A. In the event an existing water main is determined to be inadequate to meet the requirements of an applicant (customer) and a main extension will provide for those requirements, provisions of these rules applying to water main extensions will be followed.

3A. Whenever two mains are available from which services can be provided, the District shall, at its option, determine the water main to which the service tap will be made.

4A. New services shall include a ball valve outside the meter box for customer's use.

SECTION X TAPS and CONNECTIONS

A. TAPS

All taps and/or connections to a District water main shall be made by the District. This includes the installation of the corporation stop, tapping sleeve and gate valve at the water main. Taps will only be made after application for service is completed at the District office.

B. LOCATION OF TAPS

- 1B. All taps shall be made in the main directly abutting the entire property to be served.
- 2B. Taps shall not be located closer together than 18 inches and shall not be located on hydrant branches or within intersections.
- 3B. Taps shall not be made closer than one foot of a bell or flange connection.

C. SIZE of TAP

- 1C. The minimum size shall not be less than 3/4 inch.
- 2C. Any main 2 inches or smaller a tapping saddle and valve is used for taps.
- 3C. When one tap will not supply sufficient water, two taps may be installed. These taps must be a minimum of 18 inches apart and have separate connections to a manifold or header before the curb stop or valve at the property line.
- 4C. Taps larger than one inch must have the approval of the District Manager.

D. EXCAVATION for TAP

- 1D. The excavation shall be no smaller than 18 inches wide and 5 feet long. A minimum depth of cover of 30 inches is required. If required, the sides shall be shored according to state and OSHA regulations. The excavation shall extend under and entirely around the main to leave a clearance of 6 inches x 12 inches. (See drawing # 1)

E. REMOVAL of TAP or CONNECTION

- 1E. When a service is to be removed and/or abandoned it shall be at the expense of the owner, the service shall be disconnected from the main corporation stop or valve and capped by the District.
- 2E. If the service is performed by the District there shall be a charge for excavation, turn-off and capping.
- 3E. If the same shall require a reconnection at a later date, the District shall make a new tap or connect to the old valve or corporation stop, there will be a tapping charge as for a new tap.

SECTION XI WATER SERVICE INSTALLATION

A. DESCRIPTION:

1A. A service line is the piping and related appurtenances installed to convey water from the District's water main to the customers property (premises) and to the District water meter.

B. LOCATION of SERVICE LINE REQUIREMENTS

1B. The water service shall be installed perpendicular to the water main when possible.

2B. Service lines shall have a cover not less than thirty inches.

3B. No other pipes or conduits shall be permitted in the same trench with the service line, nor in a parallel trench less than two (2) feet distance from the service line. A vertical distance of not less than ten (10) inches from the service line for any pipe, cable or conduit crossing the service.

4B. All service lines shall be installed with sufficient slack to provide for settlement and frost action. Care shall be taken when back-filling to prevent stress on the corporation cock in the main.

C. SIZE of WATER SERVICE LINES

1C. Residential service lines shall be not less than three-quarters inch (3/4") in inside diameter. Where the service is more than one hundred (100') feet long, the service shall be one inch (1") or greater inside diameter.

2C. Commercial, industrial and fire services shall be properly sized by the Engineer and the District.

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SECTION XII WATER MAIN EXTENSION POLICY

A. Authorization

1A. No water mains, extensions or appurtenances shall be installed or connected to the distribution system except in accordance with regulations established by the North Marshall Water District.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1B. The installation of water main extensions to serve new customers shall be considered by the District upon request by the customer(s) or developer of a new subdivision. The District may require an application signed by the customers and the developer before the District shall proceed with an analysis and estimate of the proposed new water main extension.

C. DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION

1C. In order to assure an adequate supply of water, the design and construction of water mains and appurtenances shall be under the control and direct supervision of the District. Such control shall include determination of the size and type of pipe, and selection of points in connection to the existing system. Extensions must be connected at not less than one point with existing lines of equal or greater size and having sufficient capacity to serve the extension, even though this requires bypassing or paralleling other existing mains. The minimum size of pipe used in the extension will be dictated by the demand of the new customers or may be set by the Commissioners, larger sizes may be required if so determined by the District. In all cases the design shall be at least equal to the standards established by good engineering practices for water districts.

D. COST OF EXTENSIONS

1D. The cost of extensions shall be paid by the applicants. The District will make an estimate of cost for each extension. The applicants may be required to deposit with the District the total estimated cost, less the District's portion, or pay the actual cost upon completion of the extension. Applicants agreeing to pay after construction will be required, by the Board of Commissioners, to sign an agreement to pay the District in full the cost of the main extension plus all additional cost incurred by the District during the course of construction. This cost shall be exclusive of the water connections. Upon completion of the work a final determination of the actual cost will be made by the District and any necessary adjustment made of funds so contributed.

2D. The cost of extensions shall include all items of material, labor, engineering, and general office expense pertaining to the preparation of drawings and specifications, and the purchase, storage, delivery, and installation of pipe, valves, and all accessories, including any extraordinary costs occasioned by the opening of pavement, unusual soil conditions, frost, obstructions, or other cause. It shall also include the cost of any portion of the extension constructed parallel to existing mains of insufficient capacity to support the extension, considered by the District to be presently adequate for the services of abutting properties, whether or not such properties are actually being served.

3D. The cost of the extension will not include costs for any portion of the extension which abutts property presently served by connections to existing mains considered unsatisfactory by the District for the connected load, provided the extension will make unnecessary any improvements to the existing main which would otherwise be required, except that the front footage cost so excluded shall not exceed 250 feet for each such service.

4D. In the event the District elects to install a main larger than would be recommended by the engineers or than would be necessary to meet the applicants estimated requirements, in order to strengthen the distribution system or to provide capacity for further extensions, cost will not include the estimated difference in cost between the size pipe required and that actually installed.

E. REFUNDS TO CONTRIBUTORS

1E. Property owners (non customers who are property owners on the main extension may also contribute yet choose not to have a meter connected) or developers who contribute funds toward the financing of main extensions will be eligible to receive refunds on their contribution when additional consumers (customers) are served from the extension within a period of ten (10) years after execution of a main extension agreement (contract) between the District and the contributors.

2E. For the purpose of refund, an additional customer shall be defined as one who satisfies the following conditions:

- a. His service must be connected to the new main or to a parallel main considered adequate for such connection by reason of the strengthening effect of the new main.
- b. He shall not have been previously served at his present premises by either existing mains.
- c. He shall not have contributed to the initial investment in the main.
- d. His property shall not have been included in a contributor's development.

4E. For a period of six (6) years after the original acceptance and execution of agreement with the original applicants of the main extension each additional customer directly connected to each particular extension will be required to contribute to the cost of that water main extension based on a recomputation of both the District's portion of the total cost and each customer's contribution as set out under COST OF EXTENSION. The District shall refund to those customers that have previously contributed to the cost of each main extension itself that amount necessary to reduce their contribution to the currently calculated amount for each customer connected to that extension.

5E. All customers directly connected to each main extension for a period of six (6) years after execution of agreement and or acceptance of the main shall contribute equally to the cost of construction of the water main extension itself. In addition each customer must pay the approved "Tap-on-fee" applicable at the time of their application for the meter connection. The "Tap-on-fee" is not part of the refundable cost of the extension and may be changed during the refund period. After the six year refund period expires, any additional customers applying for service on each main extension shall be connected for the amount of the approved "Tap-on-fee" only.

6E. SUB-DIVISION DEVELOPMENT WATER MAIN EXTENSION CONTRACTS.

The Developer will pay the total cost of the water main extension. The District will pay the tap on charge to the supply main.

The District will refund to the Developer \$100.00 for each customer application and tap. The customer shall not be charged for any portion of the cost of the main extension.

The refund period will be for ten (10) years. The Developer shall not be refunded more than the total cost of the main extension.
