Re: Big Sandy RECC Renewable Energy Program - Envirowatts (Revision)

Dear Mr. Derouen:

Please see attached for electronic filing with the Commission, Big Sandy RECC's revisions to the tariff referenced above.

As part of the settlement agreement between all parties to Case No. 2010-00238, East Kentucky Power Cooperative, Inc. ("EKPC") initiated a Collaborative among EKPC, its 16 member cooperatives, the Sierra Club, Kentuckians for the Commonwealth, Kentucky Environmental Foundation, Gallatin Steel Company, the Attorney General, and other organizations and entities representing relevant and appropriate interests. The purpose of the Collaborative was to "evaluate and recommend actions to expand deployment of renewable energy and demand-side management, and to promote collaboration among the Parties in the implementation of those ideas."

The Collaborative recently concluded its business and by unanimous vote, recommended that EKPC expand its renewable energy program, Envirowatts, to include energy generated by renewable resources other than the existing land-fill gas offering.

On August 18, 2014, the Commission approved EKPC's proposed Envirowatts tariff changes expanding the Envirowatts program to offer solar, wind, hydroelectric, and land-fill gas types of renewable resources. Big Sandy RECC requests Commission approval to implement similar changes to its Envirowatts tariff. The attached tariff revision from Big Sandy RECC incorporates the EKPC Envirowatts tariff changes at the retail level.
