**COLLECT CALL<sup>1</sup>**

The procedure by which certain messages, upon request, may be reversed (charged to the called station) upon acceptance of the call at the called station.

**COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS**

Channels or other facilities which are capable, when not connected to exchange telecommunications services, of two-way communications between customer-provided terminal equipment or Company stations.

**COMPANY**

Whenever used in this Tariff, the term "Company" or the name South Central Bell Telephone Company refers to BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Kentucky or AT&T Southeast, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

**COMPLETED CALL**

A completed call is a calling attempt by the subscriber that results in an off-hook condition at the receiving end. Such conditions shall include the following actions:

- (1) the called party responds by personally answering the call;
- (2) a customer controlled automatic answering device responds by answering the call;
- (3) a Company recording, under the control of the called party, responds to the calling attempt, except for attempts defined as incomplete calls (e.g., Call Block and other similar services would be completed calls.);
- (4) the calling attempt, when under the control of the called party, (e.g., Call Forwarding Busy Line, Call Forwarding Don't Answer, etc.) is forwarded to another telephone number that results in one of the conditions described in (1), (2), or (3).

**CONFORMANCE NUMBER**

The term conformance number denotes an identifying number assigned by the Company to a particular model of conforming answering device incorporating an authorized protective connecting module when the model of device is in conformance with the provisions set forth by the Company in its technical reference for conforming answering devices.

**CONFORMING ANSWERING DEVICE**

The term conforming answering device denotes a customer-provided device which automatically answers incoming calls; transmits a prerecorded voice message or appropriate audible signal to the calling party; records a voice message from the calling party if so designed and arranged; and automatically disconnects from the line in a prearranged manner on completion of the last of the functions for which it was designed and arranged as described in this paragraph. The conforming answering device may include remote interrogation and/or device function control. A conforming answering device must incorporate an authorized protective connecting module and must bear a valid conformance number.

**CONNECTING ARRANGEMENT**

The equipment provided by the Company to accomplish the direct electrical connection of customer-provided facilities with the facilities of the Company.

CONNECTING COMPANY

A Corporation, association, firm or individual, licensed and operating as a communications common carrier, owning and operating a toll line and/or one or more central offices providing local exchange telephone service to the public and with whom the Company interchanges traffic.

## A1. DEFINITION OF TERMS

### CUSTOMER-PROVIDED TERMINAL EQUIPMENT

Devices, apparatus and their associated wiring provided by a customer, which are used with the network control signaling unit, or other station equipment furnished by the Company and not including customer-provided communications systems.

### DEMARCATION POINT

The point of demarcation and/or interconnection between Company communications facilities and terminal equipment, protective apparatus or wiring at a subscriber's premises. Company installed facilities at, or constituting the demarcation point shall consist of wire or a jack conforming to Subpart F of Part 68 of the Federal Communications Commission's rules. "Premises" as used herein generally means a dwelling unit, other building or a legal unit of real property such as a lot on which a dwelling unit is located, as determined by the Company's reasonable and nondiscriminatory standard operating practices.

### DIRECT ELECTRICAL CONNECTION

A physical connection of the electrical conductors in the communications path.

**DROP WIRE**

Wires used to connect the circuits of open wire, aerial or underground distribution facilities to the point where connection is made with the inside wiring.

## A1. DEFINITION OF TERMS

### EXCHANGE SERVICE

Telecommunications service provided to subscribers within a specified geographical area for local calling and access to toll services. Exchange service is provided on either *a* flat, measured or message rate basis, for individual or party line service or other exchange access facilities.

a. Flat

(1) Flat Rate Service:

A classification of exchange service for which a stipulated charge is made, regardless of the amount of use for calls to the Limited Local Calling Area.

c. Individual and Party Line

(1) Individual Line Service:

A classification of exchange service which provides that only one main station shall be served by the line connecting such station with the central office or other switching unit.

(2) Party Line Service:

A classification of exchange service which provides that two main stations may be served by the same central office line. This service is also referred to as two-party line service. Effective July 10, 1993, this service is not offered for new installations or transfers of service to a new location.

LOCAL ACCESS AND TRANSPORT AREA (LATA)

A geographic area established for the administration of communications service. It encompasses designated exchanges which are grouped to serve common social, economic and other purposes.

LOCAL CALLING AREA

See "Local Service Area".

LOCAL SERVICE

A type of localized calling whereby a subscriber can complete calls from his station to other stations within a specified area without the payment of long distance or other related charges.

LOCAL SERVICE AREA (LIMITED LOCAL CALLING AREA AND FULL LOCAL CALLING AREA)

The areas within which local telephone service is furnished to subscribers under a specific schedule of exchange rates and without long distance charges. A local service area may include one or more exchange service areas.

### MILEAGE AND ZONE CHARGES

A charge applying for the use of part or all of a line furnished by the Company.

a. Airline Measurement:

The shortest distance between two points.

c. Foreign Central Office Mileage:

The measurement applying to a line within the exchange connecting a subscriber's main station, PBX, or Centrex Type Services system with a central office other than that from which he would normally be served, for the use of which a separate circuit charge is made in addition to the base rate, plus locality charges if any apply.

d. Foreign Exchange Mileage:

The measurement applying to a line connecting a subscriber's main station, PBX, or Centrex Type Services system with a central office of an exchange other than that from which the subscriber would normally be served, for the use of which a separate charge is made in addition to the base rate, plus locality charges if any apply.

e. Route Measurement:

The actual length of a circuit between two points.

### MISCELLANEOUS COMMON CARRIERS

Miscellaneous Common Carriers, as defined in Part 21 of the Federal Communications Commission Rules, are communications common carriers which are not engaged in the business of providing either a public landline message telephone service or public message telegraph service.

### NETWORK CONTROL SIGNALING

The transmission of signals used in the telecommunications system which perform functions such as supervision (control, status, and charging signals), address signaling (dialing), calling and called number identification, audible tone signals (call progress signals indicating reorder or busy conditions, alerting, coin denominations, coin collect and coin return tones) to control the operation of switching machines in the telecommunications system.

### NETWORK INTERFACE

Network Interface is a FCC approved standard registration program jack provided by the Company as a part of exchange access or WATS services for the connection of customer inside wire and/or equipment to the network. The Network Interface will be located at the demarcation point.

### NONSENT-PAID CALL<sup>1</sup>

A call that is billed collect, third number or other Company approved identification number. See "Sent-Paid Call".

### NORMAL SERVING

A term applied to the exchange area, central office area and/or other serving unit from which service would normally be furnished under general provisions of the Company's tariffs and the Company's administration thereof, e.g., the normal serving exchange for exchange service is that exchange in which a subscriber's premises is physically located.

### PARTY LINE SERVICE

See "Exchange Service".

### PREMISES (SAME)

The term "same premises" shall be interpreted to mean:

- a. the building or buildings, together with the surrounding land occupied or used in the conduct of one establishment or business, or as a residence, and not intersected by a public thoroughfare or by property occupied by others; or
- b. the portion of the building occupied by the subscriber, either in the conduct of his business or as a residence, and not intersected by a public corridor or by space occupied by others; or
- c. the building or portion of a building occupied by the subscriber in the conduct of his business and as a residence provided both the business and the residence bear the same street address.

In connection with inside moves, the term "same premises" is to be interpreted to mean the building or portion of a building occupied as a unit by the subscriber in the conduct of his business or residence, or a combination thereof, and not intersected by a public thoroughfare, a corridor, or space occupied by others.

In connection with resale and sharing of Basic Local Exchange Service, "premises" is interpreted to mean the resale area as defined by layout maps, if required, and may be intersected by public thoroughfares provided that the property segments created would be continuous in the absence of the thoroughfares.

### PRIMARY CLASS OF SERVICE

Any of those classes of exchange service which the Company undertakes to furnish at a rate common to all applicants for the same class.

### PRIMARY SUBSCRIBER

This term has the same connotation as "subscriber" and is used in those cases where it is desirable to stress the distinction between the main subscriber to telephone service and others who may have joint use of the service or who may qualify for additional listings.

### PRIMARY WIRE CENTER

The building in which a foreign exchange channel is terminated.

## A1. DEFINITION OF TERMS

### SELECTIVE CLASS OF CALL SCREENING SERVICE

The restriction of outgoing toll calls from station users to certain types of calls, such as those which are charged to the called number<sup>1</sup> or a third number<sup>1</sup>, said restriction being accomplished by means of Company operator identification.

### SENT-PAID CALL

A call that is either paid at or billed to the originating station line. See "Nonsent-Paid Call".

### SERVICE CHARGE

A nonrecurring charge applying to the establishment of basic service for a subscriber and certain subsequent additions or changes to that service.

### SERVICE LINE

An exchange line associated with multiple data station installations to provide monitoring and testing of both customer and Company data equipment. The service line may be connected to a PBX, Centrex Type Services, or individual line (main or extension station) as long as direct station access is provided.

### SERVICE POINTS

When used in connection with customer provided communication channels denotes the points on the customer's premises where such channels or facilities are terminated in switching equipment used for communications with stations or customer provided terminal equipment located on the premises.

### SERVING CENTRAL OFFICE

The building that contains the central office that serves a station location.

### SINGLE ENDED TERMINAL DEVICE

The term "Single Ended Terminal Device" denotes a terminal device which terminates only one line at a given time (e.g., headset).

### STATION

A station is comprised of two elements, a station line and station equipment.

### STATION LINE

See "Exchange Line".

### SUBEXCHANGE AREA

A central office area or other defined territory within and no larger than an exchange area.

### SUBSCRIBER

Any person, firm, partnership, corporation, municipality, cooperative organization or governmental agency furnished communication service by the Company under the provisions and regulations of its tariffs.

### SUSPENSION OF SERVICE

An arrangement made at the request of the subscriber, for temporarily discontinuing service without terminating the service agreement or removing the equipment from the subscriber's premises.

### TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

The various services offered by the Company as specified in this General Subscriber Services Tariff and/or other Company Tariffs and/or Guidebooks.

### TELEPHONE NUMBER

A designation assigned to a telephone service for convenience in operating.

### TERMINATION CHARGE

A charge applying when a subscriber discontinues an item of service or equipment prior to the expiration of the initial service period designated for such item. The basic termination charge is an amount established for an individual item of service or equipment from which the termination charge is computed.

WIDE AREA TELEPHONE SERVICE

The furnishing of facilities for dial type communication between a wide area service access line and other exchange and toll station telephones in the area prescribed in the tariff.

WIRE CENTER

A "Wire Center" is a Company facility that houses Company equipment necessary for the provision of switched and non-switched service to customers in a defined geographical area. The facility is identified with V&H coordinates and is assigned one or more NXX's for use in providing switched services to customers located in the specified geographical area. The Company equipment located at a Wire Center may consist of switching equipment or non-switched equipment working with a distant host switch as well as equipment used to terminate dedicated non-switched services.

WIRE CENTER SERVING AREA

The term "Wire Center Serving Area" denotes, in most cases, that area of the exchange served by a single wire center. In certain highly concentrated exchanges where wire centers are in close proximity, more than one wire center may be included in the wire center serving area.

WORKING SERVICE POINT

As used in this Tariff, denotes an outlet (a Company provided standard miniature modular jack or equivalent) on the Company facilities through which terminal equipment may be connected to the telecommunications network.

ZONING (OUTSIDE BASE RATE AREA)

The partitioning of Outside Base Rate Area local exchange service subscribers into defined areas based upon either distance from the Base Rate Area boundary (Band Zoning) or geographic factors as shown by filed Tariff maps (Geographic Zoning) for the purpose of applying common Outside Base Rate Area charges to all subscribers within a zone having the same class of service.

##### C. Nonrecurring Charges

###### 1. Determination

Charges for all work performed by the Company or by its authorized representative in connection with the furnishing of pole and/or anchor accommodations as covered by this Tariff shall be based upon the full cost, plus 10 percent of such amount, to the Company for performance of such work. Such charges will apply for, but not be limited to, pre-authorization survey, make-ready work, rearrangement, inspection and removal of attachee's facilities, and supervision, at the option of the Company, of attachee performed work in and around the immediate vicinity of the pole and/or anchor accommodations.

###### 2. Replacement Of Facilities

The charge for replacement of a pole or anchor required to accommodate attachee's facilities shall be based on the Company's fully installed costs less salvage value, if any.

##### D. Composite Rate

###### 1. General

- a. A composite rate based on relative pole population, as specified by the commission order, will be used until accurate records can be obtained from a survey of existing attachments.
- b. This rate will be effective until completion of the survey at which time retroactive billing adjustments will be made.

#### A5.12.1 Application Of Tariff

(M)

This Tariff contains the rates, terms and conditions (regulations and rates) applicable to conduit occupancy accommodations granted to addressee by the South Central Bell Telephone Company, hereinafter referred to as the Company. (M)

#### A5.12.2 Definitions Of Terms

##### ATTACHEE

The InterLATA Carrier or cable television system operator authorized by the Company to place its facilities in a conduit system.

##### ATTACHEE'S FACILITIES

All facilities, including but not limited to cables, equipment and associated hardware, owned and utilized by the addressee which occupy a conduit system.

##### CABLE TELEVISION SYSTEM

A nonbroadcast facility consisting of a set of transmission paths and associated signal generation, reception, and control equipment, under common ownership and control, that distributes or is designed to distribute to subscribers the signals of one or more television broadcast stations.

##### CABLE TELEVISION SYSTEM OPERATOR

The business entity, whether a natural person, partnership, corporation, or association, which offers for sale the services of a cable television system.

##### CATV

Cable Television or Cable Television System

##### CONDUIT

A structure, usually underground, containing one or more ducts.

##### CONDUIT OCCUPANCY

Occupancy of a conduit system by any item of addressee's facilities.

##### CONDUIT SYSTEM

Any combination of ducts, conduits, manholes, handholes, and vaults joined to form an integrated whole, which is owned by the Company.

##### DUCT

A single enclosed raceway for conductors or cables.

##### INTERLATA CARRIER

The term "InterLATA Carrier" denotes any individual, partnership, association, joint-stock company, trust, governmental entity or corporation engaged for hire in InterLATA communications by wire or radio.

##### INTRASTATE COMMUNICATIONS

The term "Intrastate Communications" denotes any communications within the state subject to oversight by the state regulatory commission as provided by the laws of the state.

##### JOINT USER

A party which may attach to a pole or anchor or occupy a conduit owned by the Company in return for granting the Company equivalent rights of attachment or occupancy to poles, anchors, and/or conduit which it owns.
