Re: **Inter-County Energy – Interruptible Service Tariff**

Dear Mr. Derouen:

Please find enclosed for filing with the Commission, via the electronic tariff filing system, the above-referenced tariff.

Inter-County Energy currently administers a tariffed Interruptible Service program that provides a discount to participating end-use cooperative members (“end-use members”) who agree to reduce demand, when requested, for economic or reliability reasons. Currently, Inter-County Energy has no participants utilizing the Interruptible Service Program.

Inter-County Energy’s current tariff provides for two notice periods of interruption - a 10-minute notice and a 60-minute notice - to participating end-use members. Due to East Kentucky Power Cooperative, Inc.’s (“EKPC”) participation in the PJM Interconnection, LLC (“PJM”) Demand Response Program, effective June 1, 2015, PJM requires a single 30-minute notice period be used for all PJM required reliability interruptions. In order to accommodate this PJM requirement and for program simplicity, Inter-County Energy has revised its tariff to show only one 30-minute notice period. Subsequently, the demand credits payable to participating end-use members for the contracted hours of interruption, which were calculated based on EKPC’s avoided capacity cost, have been revised by assigning the most accurate credits in the current tariff (those credits at the 10-minute notice period) to the new 30-minute notice period. The numbers of contracted hours of interruption – 200, 300 and 400 – remain the same from the current tariff to the revised tariff. This tariff will keep Inter-County Energy’s Interruptible Service tariff consistent with that of EKPC’s recently amended Interruptible Service tariff.

Pursuant to KRS 278.180, Inter-County Energy must give at least 30-days' notice to the Commission. Therefore, the proposed effective date of the interruptible service tariff will be October 12, 2015.

Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:011, Inter-County Energy has posted the requisite notice at its offices located at 1009 Hustonville Road, Danville, Kentucky 40422 and 46 Old Kentucky 68, Lebanon, KY 40033. Inter-County Energy will also post the requisite notice on its website no later than five (5) business days from today's date, which will include a hyperlink to the Commission's website where the tariff can be found.

Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:011 Section 8, Inter-County Energy provided notice of this proposed tariff to its end-use members by publishing the same in the September 2015 issue of the Kentucky Living Magazine. A copy of the notice and the Affidavit of Mailing is enclosed with this letter.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION SEEKING REVISION OF AN INTERRUPTIBLE RIDER TARIFF

Pursuant to the Kentucky Public Service Commission's ("Commission") regulation 807 KAR 5:011, Section 8, Inter-County Energy Cooperative ("Inter-County Energy") gives notice that a revision to Inter-County Energy's Interruptible Tariff will be submitted to the Commission on or after September 1, 2015.

The proposed tariff effective date will be at least 30 days after the date of filing the application, at which time contracted Schedule 4, Industrial B rate and Industrial C rate end-use members of Inter-County Energy who agree to reduce demand, when requested, for economic or reliability reasons, will receive a demand credit based on the contracted number of annual hours of interruption. A person may examine this tariff filing at Inter-County Energy's offices located at 1009 Hustonville Road – Danville, KY 40422 and 46 Old Kentucky 68 – Lebanon, KY 40033.

A person may also examine this tariff filing at the Commission's office located at 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, KY, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., or through the Commission's website at <http://psc.ky.gov>. Comments regarding this tariff filing may be submitted to the Commission through its website at <http://psc.ky.gov>, or by mail to Public Service Commission, P. O. Box 615, Frankfort, KY 40602. The credit contained in this tariff filing is the credit proposed by Inter-County Energy, but the Commission may order a credit that differs from the proposed credit contained in this tariff filing.

A person may submit a timely written request for intervention in this tariff filing to the Public Service Commission, P. O. Box 615, Frankfort, KY 40602, establishing the grounds for the request and including the status and interest of the person requesting intervention. If the Commission does not receive a written request for intervention within thirty (30) days of this notice, the Commission may take final action on the tariff filing.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION SEEKING APPROVAL OF PREPAY PROGRAM RIDER TARIFF

Pursuant to the Kentucky Public Service Commission's ("Commission") regulation 807 KAR 5:011, Section 8, Inter-County Energy Cooperative ("Inter-County Energy") plans to file an Application on or after September 1, 2015 seeking approval of a Prepay Program Rider Tariff. The proposed effective date for the Prepay Rider Tariff will be at least 30-days after the date of filing the Application.

The proposed Prepay Program Rider Tariff is a voluntary option to be made available to Inter-County Energy's Residential Schedule 1, Farm and Home Service Rate, excluding accounts on Levelized billing, automatic draft, net metering, accounts with ancillary services, three-phase accounts, and accounts with greater than 200-amp service. Members who qualify for winter hardship, certificate of need or have medical certificates are also excluded.

A participating member must complete and sign a Prepay Service Agreement, which sets out the terms and conditions of the program. The member must be able to receive some form of electronic communications, which can include texting.

Prepay accounts will be billed electronically at least once per day and will then show the remaining balance in the Prepay account. All charges will be calculated, prorated and charged or credited to the account daily.

Pursuant to the proposed Prepay Program Rider Tariff, at the time the Prepay account is activated an initial minimum payment must be made. Participants can then apply funds of a minimum amount to the Prepay account as many times per month as they choose. When the amount of funds remaining in the Prepay account reaches a minimum balance, an automated message will be sent to the member. Under the terms of the Agreement, the Prepay account will not be subject to deposits, late fees, disconnect fees and reconnect fees.

A current member of Inter-County Energy who has been disconnected for non-pay and chooses the Prepay service option for reconnect shall be offered a debt management plan for the outstanding balance. A portion of any payment made in the Prepay program will be credited toward future purchases while the remaining balance of any payment will be applied toward retirement of the outstanding balance.

A prior member of Inter-County Energy who owes an uncollectible account and wishes to reconnect service with Inter-County Energy may be offered a debt management plan if the prior member is unable to pay the account balance in full. A portion of any payment made in the Prepay program will be credited to future purchases while the remaining balance of any payment will be applied toward retirement of the uncollectible account.

A person may examine this tariff filing at the offices of Inter-County Energy Cooperative Corporation located at 1009 Hustonville Road, Danville, KY and 46 Old Kentucky 68, Lebanon, KY. This tariff filing may also be examined at the Commission's office located at 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, KY, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., or the Commission's Web site at <http://psc.ky.gov>. Any comments regarding this tariff filing may be submitted to the Public Service Commission through its website or by mail to Public Service Commission, P.O. Box 615, Frankfort, KY 40602.

A person may submit a timely written request for intervention to the Public Service Commission, P.O. Box 615, Frankfort, KY 40602, establishing the grounds for the request, including the status and interest of the party. If the Commission does not receive a written request for intervention within thirty (30) days of the initial publication or mailing of the notice, the Commission may take final action on the tariff filing.
