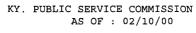

### ORDER

On April 19, 1999, Big Bear Wastewater, Inc. ("Big Bear") filed its application for Commission approval of proposed sewer rates that would generate additional annual revenues of \$5,349, an increase of 22 percent above normalized operating revenues.

On June 3, 1999, the Commission published a report of Commission Staff's findings and recommendations regarding Big Bear's proposed rate adjustment. In its report, Commission Staff recommended approval of Big Bear's proposed rate increase. On that same day, the Commission directed all parties of record to file any written comments regarding the Staff Report or any requests for a hearing or informal conference within 10 days.

On June 14, 1999, the Commission received a request for an informal conference from The Dens Condominium Association, an intervenor in the case. A conference was held on August 30, 1999. At the conference it was agreed that both parties would file additional information. The Commission received the last of the additional information on November 16, 1999.

After reviewing the additional information Staff prepared an amended report that was issued by the Commission on January 13, 2000. The amended report

recommended that Big Bear be allowed to increase its rates to produce additional annual revenue of \$714 or 2.94 percent over normalized revenues. All parties had 10 days to respond to the amended report. On January 20, 2000, the Commission received a response from Big Bear accepting the amended rate. As of the date of this Order no other responses have been filed.

The Commission, having considered the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that:

- 1. After careful review and examination of the Staff Reports, the Commission finds that the recommendations in the original Staff Report, as revised by the Amended Staff Report, will allow Big Bear sufficient revenues to meet its operating expenses and provide for future equity growth. The Commission therefore accepts the recommendations contained in the original Staff Report as amended by the Amended Staff Report. The recommendations and findings contained in the original Staff Report, including the modifications thereto in the Amended Staff Report, should be adopted as the findings of the Commission in this proceeding.
- 2. The rates in Appendix A will produce annual revenue from sewer service of \$25,022.00.

### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The recommendations and findings contained in the original Staff Report, including the modifications thereto in the Amended Staff Report, are adopted as the findings of the Commission in this proceeding and incorporated by reference into this Order as if fully set out herein.

2. The rates proposed by Big Bear will produce revenues greater than those found reasonable herein and are denied.

3. The rates in Appendix A are approved for service rendered by Big Bear on and after the date of this Order.

4. Within 30 days of the date of this Order, Big Bear shall file with the Commission its revised tariff setting out the rates approved herein.

### AMENDED STAFF REPORT

### BIG BEAR WASTEWATER, INC.

#### CASE NO. 99-114

On April 19, 1999, Big Bear Wastewater, Inc. ("Big Bear") filed its application seeking to increase its sewer rates pursuant to 807 KAR 5:076, the Alternative Rate Adjustment Procedure for Small Utilities. Staff expressed its recommendations with regard to Big Bear's application in a Staff Report issued on June 3, 1999. To discuss the application and the Staff Report an informal conference was held on August 10, 1999. In attendance at the conference were John David Myles and John Stratman, representing The Dens Condominium Association ("The Dens"); Penny Warren, representing Big Bear; and Renee Curry, Anita Mitchell, and Scott Lawless of Commission Staff. During the conference Mr. Myles presented arguments against various aspects of the Staff Report. It was agreed that Big Bear and The Dens would submit additional information pursuant to the conference.

After considering the arguments made at the conference and the information filed subsequent thereto, Staff hereby amends its original report and recommends that the rate approved in this case be a monthly flat rate of \$30.37 per customer. Attachment A of this report details the additional adjustments to Staff's recommended pro forma operating income statement. Attachment B details the calculation of Staff's amended revenue requirement and recommended rate.

- A) Sewer Service Revenues. During the informal conference, The Dens stated that the local marina operates the only boat sewage pump-out station in the area but is charged as a residential customer by Big Bear. The Dens felt that an adjustment to test year revenues was warranted if the marina is accepting high levels of wastewater to be treated by Big Bear's plant. Subsequent to the conference Big Bear reviewed the records of the marina and found that 2 boats had used the pump-out from January 1, 1999, to August 12, 1999. Staff agrees that a residential equivalency factor should be established for any customer discharging more than 12,000 gallons of wastewater per month into a wastewater treatment facility. However, there has been no evidence presented in this case to indicate that the marina is discharging high volumes of wastewater into Big Bear's plant. Therefore, Staff has not made additional adjustments to operating revenues.
- B) <u>Salaries and Wages</u>. During the test year Big Bear paid its employees monthly salaries. The Commission had approved the majority of the salary amounts in Case No. 97-245, Big Bear's previous rate case. To calculate pro forma salaries in this case Staff annualized the test year monthly salaries of all employees at the end of the test year.

In this case The Dens has argued that Staff's calculation in Case No. 97-245 artificially inflated salaries because the months used in the calculation were the busiest months of the year for Big Bear. Therefore, when approving rates in this case the Commission should reduce salary and wage expenses. Staff is of the opinion that an additional adjustment to pro forma salaries and wages is not warranted. Even though Big Bear is operating a seasonal resort community, the treatment plant is in operation

365 days per year and must be serviced routinely. The salary levels recommended by Staff in its original report fall well within the reasonableness range when compared to other similarly situated sewer treatment plant operations.

The Dens further argued that test year salaries and wages were overstated as evidenced by a payroll detail report that was submitted to the Commission by Big Bear on August 9, 1999. Staff concedes that the payroll report does reflect an over payment equal to one months salary for each employee; however, no adjustment is warranted as the overpayment is not reflected in test year or pro forma salaries and wages as shown in the original Staff Report. The amount included as test year salaries and wages in the original Staff Report and the amount reported in the payroll detail report were reconciled as follows:

Test Year Gross Salary in Staff Report \$9,129.67

C) In the original Staff Report depreciation expense was included as a revenue requirement but only to the extent of the plant capacity reserved for existing customers. Upon reviewing Attachment A of Big Bear's filing of November 16, 1999, Staff has determined that the cost of the plant was or should have been recovered by Big Bear Resort's developer, Bear Development, Inc., through the sale of condominiums and special assessments. Therefore, Staff has eliminated depreciation expense included in the June 3, 1999, Staff Report. Bear Development's cost recovery is considered a contribution in aid of construction and should be recorded on the books of the entity currently operating the plant in account 271 – contributions in aid of construction.

## RESPONSE OF BIG BEAR WASTEWATER, INC. TO NEW CLAIM ASSERTED BY THE DENS CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATION IN THEIR COMMENTS

Big Bear Wastewater, Inc. ("Big Bear"), by counsel, for its response to the Comments of The Dens Condominium Association on Informal Conference Memorandum and Comments of Big Bear Wastewater, Inc., states as follows:

On November 12, 1999 counsel for Big Bear received comments from The Dens Condominium Association ("The Dens") in which they claimed for the first time that the actual assessment for the construction of the treatment plant was not \$16,000 as Big Bear had thought, but was, in fact, \$22,734.85. Big Bear subsequently searched its files and learned that The Dens information is correct -- the assessment was \$22,734.85. Any inference that The Dens paid that amount, however, is **not true**. In fact, the total amount of this assessment paid by The Dens is \$11,804.08. More detailed information concerning these calculations and payment is provided below. However, if the Commission Staff uses the figure requested by The Dens of \$22,734.85 to calculate depreciation recoverable by the utility, then The Dens should be ordered to pay immediately to Big Bear the balance of the 1992 assessment of \$10,930.77.

The background for the confusion regarding the assessment is that the initial letter sent to The Dens, a file copy of which is attached as Exhibit A, calculated the Assessment for the new filter system based upon the number of plumbing fixtures in the existing 14 units at that time. Based upon 14 units, The Dens had 44 percent of the total fixture units and were assessed a total of \$16,672.22. The March 4, 1992 letter relied upon by The Dens shows that there was an agreement to calculate the assessment based upon 27 condominiums, rather than 14. (For the convenience of the Commission, a copy of this letter is attached as Exhibit B.) This changed the percentage of fixture units for The Dens to 60 percent of the total assessment. The assessment based upon 27 units at \$842.03 was \$22,734.81 as The Dens claim. However, The Dens only paid the per unit assessment for 14 units, or a total of \$11,804.08. The Dens have never paid the balance of \$10,930.77 which was due for the remaining 13 units.

Accordingly, Big Bear respectfully requests that the Commission Staff use for purposes of reduction in depreciation either the actual assessment paid of \$11,804.08 or that the Commission order that The Dens immediately pay the balance of the assessment due.

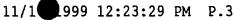

As the developer of the Den's Condominium project, this is a letter which I had hoped I would never have to write. However, due to circumstances beyond my control, I have found it necessary to levy a one-time special assessment against the owners.

Now that the news is out in the open, let me try to explain how this situation came about. Bear Development Inc. has planned from day 1 to pay for the new sewage wastewater treatment plant from funds budgeted from the sales of the Dens Condomintums. This is exactly the time at which we planned to install the plant and we are installing the plant for which we had originally budgeted. Everything as planned;

The filing for this plant, with the Kentucky Division of Water, was initiated over 6 months ago. However, less than 2 months ago, the State of Kentucky implemented a new law requiring stiffer regulations for all treatment plants flowing into waterways in Kentucky. In this new law are provisions that will allow no new plants to be installed in the State of Kentucky which would flow into any waterway! Fortunately the plant at Big Bear was grandfathered BUT had to meet . stiffer standards.

The portion of these standards that will affect you is the result of the above law implementation. In order for the Big Bear Resort treatment plant to adhere to new state regulations, a filter system had to be added to the new plant that we are installing. That, in itself, does not sound too bad. However, the price of this unit now stands to add more than 50% to the cost of the new plant.

The assessment that was determined by the amount of money required for the new equipment only. Big Bear Resort and The Dens Condominium unit owners are being assessed based on the number of plumbing fixtures per each entity. That number is then being divided into the total amount of above budget expenditure. The percentages for Big Bear and the Dens are 56% & \$44 respectively. After applying these figures, the assessment for the Dens comes to \$16,672.22 or \$1190.87 per unit owner. This is on a total project cost of \$115,972.26 and only represents 44% of the additional cost mandated by the state. I am currently looking for a March 1, 1992, date for the assessments from each unit to be paid.

Lat me reiterate that this was a cost that the development company had no control over. I've been through this before with our unit in Florida and I know that this is never a pleasant situation. I fought the battle against the State and loss but no one can say that it wasn't a good fight! ### RESPONSE OF BIG BEAR WASTEWATER, INC. TO REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

Big Bear Wastewater, Inc. ("Big Bear"), by counsel, for its response to the information requested by The Dens Condominium Association ("The Dens"), states as follows:

By Order dated October 25, 1999 Big Bear was ordered to file with the Commission and serve on The Dens the information requested by The Dens on August 3, 1999. The available information was provided to The Dens and to the Commission informally on or before the informal hearing on August 10, 1999. The following is a formal response to each of the requests and includes duplicate copies of the documents previously furnished.

Request No. 1: Provide copies of time sheets, time cards, and any other records of time worked by the employees at Big Bear Wastewater, Inc., as listed in Attachment A to Commission Staff Report Number 99-114 for the calendar year ending December 31, 1998, and copies of the same documents relating to any other persons who were employed by Big Bear Wastewater, Inc., during that period.

Response: The employees of Big Bear Wastewater Inc. are all full-time, salaried employees of Big Bear Resort. These persons are on call 24 hours per day and devote a substantial portion of their time to meeting the needs of the wastewater treatment plant. Because these employees are salaried, no record is kept of the hours which they devote to any particular task or project. The portions of their salaries which are attributed to Big Bear Wastewater Inc. are those

portions approved by the Public Service Commission in the initial rate request except for that of Robert Eastham. Robert Eastham and Dick Eastham are both certified wastewater treatment plant operators and their combined salary attributable to the treatment plant is \$4,176.00, which is substantially less than the price bid by an outside firm for only routine maintenance. Dick Eastham and Robert Eastham do fill in a log sheet for most of their visits to the wastewater treatment plant and a duplicate copy of that log sheet is attached as Exhibit A. On occasion, other Big Bear Resort personnel provide assistance at the wastewater treatment plant, but there has been no charge to Big Bear Wastewater, Inc. for these services. In other words, Big Bear Wastewater Treatment Inc. benefits from the fact that there are full-time employees for Big Bear Resort who are available and do provide all services needed by Big Bear Wastewater Treatment Inc. The cost of the treatment plant would be much higher if these services had to be contracted out, and the services are provided on a more timely basis. A duplicate copy of payroll information for these individuals is attached as Exhibit B. Big Bear notes that the computer program erroneously showed duplicate payments for the month of July.

Request No. 2: Identify any hours for which Big Bear Wastewater Inc. paid its employees which were performed in whole or in part for the benefit of other related (including but not limited to Big Bear Resort Inc. and Big Bear Development Inc.) or unrelated entities other than Big Bear Wastewater, Inc.

Response: As noted above, these salaried employees do not keep hourly records by task. The portions of their salaries which are allocated to Big Bear Wastewater Inc. are those portions approved previously by the Public Service Commission. It is believed that if records were kept for each task, a greater portion, rather than a lesser portion, of each salary would need to be allocated to Big Bear Wastewater Inc.

Request No. 3: Provide the hourly rates paid to each employee of Big Bear Wastewater Inc. during calendar year 1998.

There are no hourly employees of Big Bear Wastewater, Inc.

# ORDER

On August 3, 1999, The Dens Condominium Association ("The Dens") served an information request on Big Bear Wastewater, Inc. ("Big Bear"). On August 9, 1999, Big Bear provided The Dens with some of the information requested, but filed an objection to the request. As grounds for its objection, Big Bear contends that the information has been previously made available to Staff and made a part of the Staff Report. It also contends that the proximity in time of the information request to the hearing date prevented it from filing all the information. Big Bear requests the Commission to issue an order directing that Big Bear not be required to produce the information requested or, in the alternative, that it be given a reasonable time in which to produce the information. The Dens filed a response to the objection on August 10, 1999 clarifying that the case had been set for an informal conference, not a hearing, and asserting that it must be given access to all appropriate information in order to comment effectively on the rate proposal.

After consideration of the record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that:

1. The information request is reasonable and within the scope of the proceeding.

- 2. No compelling reason has been advanced to restrict or deny the information requested.
- 3. The Dens should be permitted a reasonable time to review the information and provide additional written comments to the Staff Report of June 3, 1999.

# IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- Within 10 days from the date of this Order, Big Bear shall file with the Commission, with a copy to The Dens, the information requested by The Dens on August 3, 1999.
- 2. The Dens shall have 20 days from the date of this Order to provide additional written comments to the Staff Report of June 3, 1999.

# COMMENTS BY BIG BEAR WASTEWATER, INC. ON INFORMAL CONFERENCE ISSUES

Big Bear Wastewater, Inc. ("Big Bear"), by counsel, offers the following comments on the issues raised at the Informal Conference.

1. The Dens Condominium Association ("The Dens") complained that the total of \$9,576.00 which Big Bear pays annually in salaries for Owner/Manager Fee and operations personnel was too high. It further complained that a print out of payroll showed double entries for all personnel in July and that Robert Eastman's time sheet shows fifteen hours per month for bookkeeping, but Janet Caldemeyer is also paid for bookkeeping.

As Mr. Lawless pointed out at the informal conference, the Commission carefully reviewed and approved the salaries in Big Bear's recent rate case (97-245). The only subsequent adjustment was to increase the total by \$446 to reflect current pay levels. The 1997 bid Big Bear obtained for routine plant operation and maintenance, not including any time for repairs or sludge removal, was \$11,400 and would be even higher today. Moreover, in Mr. Lawless' experience, the salaries are reasonable for plants of this size. In summary, The Dens' complaint about salaries is totally without merit. Nonetheless, the details of the complaint are addressed more fully below.

Big Bear's Application for Rate Adjustment ("Application") shows that the monthly salary for each employee was multiplied by 12 to arrive at the pro forma total of \$9576 (Application Attachment A). These same totals were used in the Staff Report (Page 2). Thus, these salary totals

were not determined by nor affected in any way by the payroll print out with the erroneous double entry for July. Big Bear acknowledges there was an error in the payroll document produced to The Dens in response to a request for documents. However, this error did not affect any of the salaries in the Application or Staff Report, as the erroneous document was not used for either.

Regarding Mr. Robert Eastman's time entries for bookkeeping, Big Bear states the term was used in a more generic sense than its common meaning. The activity Mr. Eastman was describing would more accurately be characterized as the record keeping and logs required by various laws and regulations for wastewater treatment plants.

Finally, The Dens argued that treatment plant volume fluctuates with the seasons and that salaries should be reduced during lower usage months. This claim presumes that certified wastewater treatment plant operators could be hired on an hourly basis and that the total hourly pay on an annual basis would be less than the proportion of the current full-time employees' salaries allocated to the treatment plant. It further presumes that routine operation and maintenance can be omitted when volume is reduced. These assumptions are without any factual support and are fatally flawed. The plant must operate year round and the employees must be available for maintenance and repairs year round. The 1997 bid for routine hourly work was substantially higher than the present salaries and did not include much of the necessary work currently being performed by Big Bear personnel. The Staff Recommendation regarding salaries is supported by the Commission's careful review during the recent rate case, by outside bids, and by staff experience. The Recommendation should be accepted.

2. The Dens complained that the allocation of depreciation to the Dens was excessive when compared to actual water usage by The Dens and potential usage by a marina pump out for boats which also uses the wastewater treatment plant. Big Bear reviewed usage of the marina pump out for the period January 1, 1999 to August 12, 1999 and found that only **two** boats used the pump

out service during that time. No reallocation of depreciation is warranted based on this minuscule use.

Moreover, Mr. Lawless explained the Division of Water standards for water usage by residential users on which he based his allocation of depreciation. He further noted that Big Bear is not being allowed to include all of its annual depreciation in its pro forma operations, since the plant was sized by the state for future growth (Report page 7).

The Dens' request that depreciation be allocated in accordance with actual water usage by the condominium residents is but a variation of the argument above that salaries for plant operations should be reduced in low volume months. Actual water usage for The Dens' residents may be low in the winter months, but the plant must continue to operate and be maintained all year round. It cannot be turned on and off each time a resident uses water, nor can it be shut down during months of low water usage. Moreover, Big Bear must have the capacity available all year in order to meet the high volume demands of The Dens' residents in the summer months. Capacity must be based on peaks, rather than average annual use, especially when monthly use fluctuates widely as it does here. Big Bear respectfully submits that the Staff Recommendation regarding allocation of depreciation is sound and is based upon logical, objective criteria. The Recommendation should be adopted.

Mr. Lawless raised the issue of whether the useful life of the plant should be extended because of the low usage in winter months and said he would seek advice from a staff engineer. Although Big Bear does not have the engineer's recommendation at this time, it is our understanding that the twenty-year life of the plant which was used for depreciation purposes is an "average" life and would be based upon a long history of experience. Absent solid evidence that some longer standard is more representative of the anticipated useful life of this plant, Big Bear respectfully submits that the twenty-year estimated useful life should not be changed. Wastewater treatment

plants involve metal structures standing in a corrosive environment. Twenty years may be the maximum time before rusting will likely result in substantial failure. It is also logical that periods of low flow could increase the corrosive environment and shorten the useful plant life. In any event, the Commission should not merely assume that variable flow will extend the useful life of the plant.

3. Finally, The Dens mentioned for the first time a \$16,000<sup>1</sup> "assessment" for the plant paid by Condo buildings 1-4. This contribution made several years ago toward the cost of the plant was overlooked by mistake when the rate application was filed. The purpose of the assessment was to cover the cost of a dissolved oxygen filter which was required as a result of the passage of new legislation the week the plant was approved. Upon reviewing the Purestream invoices on which the cost of the plant was based in the Staff Recommendation, Big Bear discovered after the informal conference that the filter cost was included in those invoices. This contribution in aid of construction should reduce the plant cost from \$95,604 to \$79,604 and depreciation should be reduced accordingly.

On August 10, 1999, the Commission held a conference in this case at the Commission's offices in Frankfort, Kentucky. Present were:

Beginning the conference, Anita Mitchell stated that Commission Staff would prepare minutes of the conference for the case record, that a copy of the minutes would be provided to all parties, and that all parties would be given an opportunity to submit written comments upon the minutes.

Mr. Myles, attorney for The Dens Condominium Association ("The Dens"), began the discussion by commenting on the objection to production request and motion for protective order filed by Big Bear. He provided Staff with a copy of the response to the objection and motion he filed that date on behalf of The Dens. Mr. Myles then discussed the issues raised in the comments to the Staff Report filed by The Dens on June 24, 1999. He asserted that the salaries paid to the employees of Big Bear Wastewater, Inc. ("Big Bear") are too high, as they appear to be annualized figures taken from the high usage months. He then pointed out some items of concern noted on the time sheets provided by Big Bear. He stated that there appear to have been double payments made in July to every employee for a total of \$797.97. Ms. Penny Warren, attorney for Big Bear, was unable to provide an explanation for this, but agreed to check with her client and provide an explanation. Mr. Myles also questioned the timesheets for Robert Eastman. He pointed out that the timesheets indicate that Mr. Eastman is recording 15 hours per month for bookkeeping. He questioned what bookkeeping Mr. Eastman would be doing since others are paid for bookkeeping as well.

Mr. Myles also addressed the allocation of depreciation costs. He asserted that based on actual water usage the Commission Staff has allocated too much capacity to The Dens customers.

Scott Lawless, an employee of the Commission, addressed the issues raised by Mr. Myles. He explained that he performed the financial review of the utility and that, since the salaries were carefully reviewed and approved in Big Bear's previous rate case (97-245), he did not re-evaluate them. He stated that while he was not aware there had been double payments made to the employees in July, the extra payments would not change his calculations because he simply took the amount paid each employee per month and multiplied by 12 to calculate pro forma expenses. He stated that, based on his experience with similarly situated small wastewater utilities, he believes the salary levels at Big Bear are reasonable. He acknowledged the seasonal nature of the community served, but explained that the utility is still required to operate during the off season. In addition, he stated that Big Bear had sought and received a bid for plant operation and maintenance, which did not include sludge removal, from Purchase Public Development in 1997 for \$11.400.

Mr. Lawless then addressed the issue of the allocation of depreciation costs raised by Mr. Myles. He explained that in Big Bear's previous rate case the Commission did not allow recovery of the plant because Big Bear Wastewater, Inc. did not own the plant. In 1998 Big Bear sought and received approval to transfer the plant from Big Bear Resorts to Big Bear Wastewater and then filed this case to recover cost of plant. Mr. Lawless explained that he based his calculations on the Division of Water's predetermined gallon usage of 12,000 per month for residential users and not on actual usage as Mr. Myles suggested it should be based. Mr. Lawless mentioned that the Department of Water does use different figures for apartments and asked Mr. Stratman if he knew how many 2, 3 and 4 bedroom units made up The Dens. Mr. Stratman stated he does not have the information, but believes all units are 1800 square feet.

Mr. Lawless then stated that he did not take into consideration whether the low usage could extend the depreciation period on the plant. He stated that he would have to seek advice from an engineer on staff.

Mr. Stratman then expressed two concerns. He stated that it was his recollection that The Dens contributed \$18,000 toward the plant. Mr. Lawless responded by stating that if The Dens contributed to the plant, the contribution would have an impact on the amount recovered by Big Bear. Mr. Stratman agreed to look into the matter and provide documentation of the contribution if available. Mr. Stratman then mentioned that the marina has the only pump out station in the area and is allowing non-residents to use the system. He stated that since the law on discharge has changed, he believes this use of the pump station will increase. Mr. Lawless explained how customers are charged and that if the marina is using more than 12,000 units, it should be charged as more than one customer. Ms. Warren is to contact client and attempt to establish the amount used by the marina.

Commission Staff agreed to set forth in these minutes the information the participants agreed to produce. Ms. Warren agreed to provide an explanation for the payments made to the employees in July, 1998. She also agreed to contact her client

and provide, if possible, water usage information on the marina. Mr. Statman agreed to provide documentation of any contributions made by The Dens to the plant.

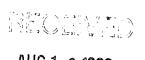

# RESPONSE TO OBJECTION TO PRODUCTION REQUEST AND MOTION FOR PROTECTION ORDER

Comes now the Intervenor, The Dens Condominium Association, by Counsel, and for its Response to the objections of Applicant, Big Bear Wastewater, Inc., states as follows:

To the knowledge of Intervenor, this matter has not been set for hearing but rather, has been set for an informal conference with Commission Staff. Therefore, any objection based on the proximity in time of the Intervenor's production request and the hearing date is at least unavailing.

Counsel for the Applicant also appears to argue that it should not be required to produce the information sought because it has already given Commission Staff access to the information and Staff's analysis is set forth in its Staff Report. If this approach were the law, it would render intervention moot. However, an alternative rate filing does not relieve the utility of its burden of proof to show at hearing that its proposed rate increase is just and reasonable. See, KRS 278.190 (3). Intervenors can only contest this issue if they are given access to appropriate information upon which the rate proposal is based.

While Intervenor has no objection whatsoever to allowing Applicant a reasonable time in which to respond to the pending data request and any further data requests which may be appropriate prior to hearing in this matter, Intervenor strongly objects to any protective or protection order being entered at this time.

### MOTION FOR INFORMAL CONFERENCE OR, IN THE ALTERNATIVE. MOTION FOR FORMAL HEARING

Comes now The Dens Condominium Association, by counsel, and for its motion states as follows:

After review of the Commission's June 3, 1999, Order and accompanying Staff Report concerning the proposed rates of Big Bear Wastewater, Inc., the Dens hereby requests that an informal conference be scheduled. The Dens would prefer to reserve the right to request a formal hearing until after the informal conference. However, if the request must be made at this time, the Dens would ask the Commission to consider this motion as a request for a formal hearing.

Although other issues may arise due to investigation and discovery, two issues can be identified at this time which require further consideration by the Commission. The twenty-seven members of the Dens receive a single water bill from the North Marshall Water District. North Marshall bills on a bi-monthly basis and bills per one hundred (100) gallons of usage. Attached to this motion as an exhibit is a billing history for the Dens from North Marshall for the years 1997 and 1998 and the first four months of 1999. Not

to belabor the point but it is imperative to remember that this is the bill for all 27 members of the Dens and it illustrates and supports the two primary problems with Staff's analysis of Big Bear's rate proposal.

First, members of the association believe that the salaries allowed for Big Bear employees in its prior rate case were based on annualized figures taken from the high usage months for this seasonal community. 46% of the Dens members' 1997 usage occurred in the months of July and August and 45% of 1998 usage occurred in those two months. Usage during the "off-season" of November through April in those years was approximately 16 gallons per day in 1997 and 11 gallons per day in 1998. The Dens believes that usage for other customers of the system would show similar patterns, demonstrating that the salaries paid to Big Bear's employees are too high by at least half. Put another way, during at least half of each year, the place is a ghost town and there is little if anything for the Big Bear employees to do.

The Dens also has serious questions concerning the Staff allocation of depreciation costs. The Staff Report allocated 3,888,000 gallons of capacity per year to the 27 customers of the Dens. In 1997, the total water usage for the 27 units of the Dens was 322,500 gallons and for 1998, the figure was 302,100. These figures are 8.2% and 7.7%, respectively, of the capacity allocated to the Dens customers by Staff. Even during the high usage months of July and August, the Dens members' usage was 23% of the capacity allocated in 1997 and 21% in 1998. While it may be appropriate for the Dens members to be responsible for depreciation for the capacity that they use, it clearly inappropriate and inequitable for them to pay the cost of capacity installed for future development purposes by Big Bear.

For these reasons, the Dens requests that the Commission establish a procedural schedule including a date for an informal conference at which these issues may be discussed, and if necessary, including a date for a formal hearing in this matter.

On September 14, 1998, the Public Service Commission ("Commission") received a letter from Big Bear Wastewater, Inc. ("Big Bear") requesting Commission assistance with the preparation of a rate application. Commission Staff ("Staff") provided that assistance by performing a limited financial review of Big Bear's test year operations, the calendar year ending December 31, 1998. The scope of Staff's review was limited to obtaining information as to whether the test period operating revenues and expenses were representative of normal operation. Insignificant or immaterial discrepancies were not pursued and are not addressed herein.

Upon completion of the review, Staff assisted Big Bear in the development and preparation of a rate application. The application included an adjusted pro forma operating income statement wherein adjustments were made to test year operating revenues and expenses that were known and measurable and deemed to be reasonable. The rates proposed in the application were based on the pro forma income statement. The pro forma income statement supports a revenue requirement of \$29,657. The rate proposed to meet that requirement is a flat monthly fee of \$35.99 per customer. The proposed rate is a 22 percent increase over the current monthly fee of \$29.50. The proposed rate was calculated by dividing the revenue requirement of \$29,657 by the total number of pro forma bills of 824. The number of bills was calculated using the test year end number of customers of 73. Of those customers 60

were year round customers and 13 were campsites that were billed for only 8 months of the year. Thus, the calculation appears as follows: (60x12)+(13x8)=824.

On March 23, 1999 Big Bear submitted the rate application to the Commission for consideration. The application was considered filed on April 19, 1999, when all filing deficiencies were cured.

The pro forma income statement and explanation of adjustments have been attached to this report as Attachment A. Attachment B details the calculation of the revenue requirement and the recommended rate. Renee Curry is responsible for all revenue adjustments and the calculation of the recommended rate. Scott Lawless is responsible for the determination of the revenue requirement. Based on the information included in this report, Staff is of the opinion that the rate proposed by Big Bear in its application is reasonable and should be approved by this Commission.

A) <u>Sewer Service Revenues</u>. Big Bear reported test year operating revenues of \$22,629. Staff increased test year revenue to \$24,308 so that pro forma operations at present rates would reflect the number of customers hooked onto the system at the end of the test year. The amount was calculated as follows:

B) <u>Salaries and Wages</u>. Test year salaries expense of \$9,130 was increased by \$446 to reflect the following current pay levels:

The salary levels listed above were approved by this Commission in Big Bear's previous rate case (Case No. 97-245) except for that of Robert Eastham. Robert and Dick Eastham are both certified wastewater plant operators and their combined annual salary was \$4,176. Based on Staff's prior experience with similarly situated small wastewater utilities, Staff is of the opinion that the salary levels included in pro forma operations are reasonable including that of Robert Eastham and recommends that they be accepted in this case.

C) <u>Sludge Hauling</u>. Test year sludge hauling was reported at \$2,060. This amount was excessive relative to the three prior years of operation. Sludge hauling for the years 1997, 1996, and 1995 was reported at \$800, \$0, and \$500, respectively. To normalize

the test year expense a decreasing adjustment of \$1,220 was made so that pro forma sludge hauling equaled the average annual expense of the four years analyzed. Pro forma sludge hauling of \$840 was calculated as follows: (\$2,060+\$800+\$0+\$500)/4=\$840.

D) <u>Materials and Supplies</u>. Included in test year materials and supplies expense was the cost of a motor and sand for a filter in the amounts of \$266 and \$1,157, respectively. These items are not annual expenses and should therefore be amortized. The expected life of each was determined to be five years. A decreasing adjustment to test year expenses of \$1,138 is required to reflect their five-year amortization. The adjustment was calculated as follows:

E) <u>Contractual Services</u>. Test year contractual services expense included \$1,743 directly related to transferring the ownership of the wastewater treatment plant from Big Bear Resort, Inc. ("Resort") to Big Bear in Case No. 98-089. That amount included legal, survey, and accounting fees of \$1,027, \$686, and \$30, respectively. The transfer of the plant was negotiated between related parties and afforded no benefit to the customers of Big Bear. Therefore, all costs related to the transfer have been eliminated from test year operations.

Also included in test year contractual services were legal fees of \$1,691 that were paid for services related to Big Bear's previous rate case (Case No. 97-245). Rate case expense should not be an annual expense to Big Bear. Therefore, this expense has been amortized over 5 years by decreasing test year expenses by \$1,353. The adjustment was calculated as follows:

The net decreasing adjustment to contractual services was \$3,096 (\$1,743+\$1,353).

- F) Insurance. Test year expenses did not include an allocation of property and workers compensation insurance. The Resort paid for these expenses. Test year expenses have been increase by \$1,589 to include their allocation. The total included \$1,218 for property insurance and \$371 for workers compensation. R. Barga & Co., Big Bear's insurance carrier, provided the allocated amounts.
- G) <u>Miscellaneous</u>. Test year miscellaneous expenses were reported at \$477 and were increased by \$466 to calculate pro forma operating expenses. The \$466 net increase includes the following adjustments:
  - 1) Land lease: On September 21, 1998, the Commission issued a Final Order in Case No. 98-089 wherein approval was granted for the Resort to transfer title of the wastewater treatment plant to Big Bear. That Order required Big Bear to file a lease agreement wherein Big Bear would lease

the land on which the treatment plant is situated from the Resort. The lease was required because title to the land was not being transferred along with the plant. Test year expenses were increased \$600 to reflect the monthly lease payment of \$50.

- 2) Postage: Postage of \$11 was paid to deliver information regarding the transfer case (Case No. 98-089). That amount has been eliminated from test year operations. Refer to item E of this attachment for an explanation of the elimination of expenses related to this transfer case.
- 3) Bad check charge: A \$25 bad check charge was included in test year operations. This charge should be paid by the stockholders of Big Bear and has therefore been eliminated.
- 4) Big Bear maintains two checking accounts for which it paid \$196 for service charges during the test year. One checking account for a utility of Big Bear's size should be adequate. Therefore, half of the service charges, or \$98, were eliminated.
- H) <u>Depreciation</u>: Big Bear did not record depreciation expense on the treatment plant during the test year as the title had not been transferred until the latter part of 1998. Now that the plant has been properly transferred to Big Bear, it should be allowed to recover the plant's original cost through rates.

The plant was originally purchased by Big Bear Development, Inc. ("Development") from Purestream, Inc. in 1991 to replace the existing facility. The new plant was to serve Big Bear's existing and future customers. The purchase price was

originally financed through a capital investment from the Development's stockholders. In 1992 the plant was traded to the Resort in exchange for other real property. In 1998 the Resort sold the plant to Big Bear through the negotiation of an interest bearing note payable in the amount of \$115,849.

Big Bear, the Resort, and the Development are all related parties. Big Bear would have to prove that any expenses resulting from transactions between these parties were performed at "arm's-length" before they could be included in pro forma operations. Staff is of the opinion that the original purchase of the plant was a prudent expenditure and should be given rate consideration. Depreciation calculated on the original purchase price should be allowed since the plant was originally funded through additional paid-incapital and not through a contribution in aid of construction from the developer or Big Bear's customers. However, no interest expense stemming from the sale of this plant between these related parties should ever be included in revenue requirements. The interest was created through a series of related party transactions that wasn't necessary. Since the stockholders of the Development and Big Bear are the same, the interest charges could have been avoided if the capital to purchase the plant had been initially invested in Big Bear instead of the Development.

To determine the original cost of the plant to be depreciated the original purchase invoices were analyzed. Big Bear presented two invoices from Purestream that totaled \$95,064. Even though plant valued at \$155,659 was recorded in Big Bear's records as a result of the transfer case (Case No. 98-089), pro forma depreciation expense was calculated using the Purestream invoice total since that was the only amount evidenced

by independent supporting documentation. The estimated useful life of the plant was assumed to be 20 years. The annual depreciation is therefore \$4,753 (\$95,064/20).

Since the new plant was sized to allow for future growth, the annual depreciation to be included in pro forma operations was limited to the plant capacity necessary to serve existing customers only. As new customers are added to the system and charged the rate recommended herein, additional revenue will be generated to cover the additional capacity used. The calculation is as follows:

During 1991 a development corp. affiliated with Big Bear Wasterwater, Inc. purchased a wastewater treatment plant to serve the Big Bear Resort area. In 1992 the plant was traded to the resort corp. and was subsequently sold to the wastewater corp. in 1998. The new plant replaced an old existing plant that had become inefficient and was operating at maximum capacity. The Division of Water instructed the replacement of the plant.

The new plant was purchased not only to serve customers on-line at the time it was installed but also to serve future development areas of the resort. Gradually, new customers have come on-line and will continue to come on-line as the development corp. continues to build and sell condominiums. The sewer plant has the capacity to serve 88 residential customers but currently serves only 73. For rate-making purposes depreciation has been calculated on a per customer basis and included in pro forma expenses only to the extent of the number of customers currently on-line. This approach will allow current and future customers to pay for their share of the plant capacity. As each new customer comes on-line and pays the rate proposed herein, the utility will recover the plant depreciation associated with serving that customer.
