<u>ORDER</u>

On April 28, 1999, J & W Sanitation ("J & W") filed an application for Commission approval of proposed rates. The proposed rates for sewer service would generate additional annual revenues of \$4,458, an increase of 33 percent above normalized test year revenues.

By Order dated June 4, 1999, the Commission issued a Staff Report which was prepared upon review of J & W's test year operations. Staff's report recommended that J & W's requested increase be granted. The Order granted 10 days to file written comments regarding the Staff Report or requests for a hearing or informal conference. No such comments or requests were made.

The Commission, after considering the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that:

1. The recommendations and findings contained in the Staff Report are supported by the evidence of record, are reasonable, and are hereby adopted as the findings of the Commission in this proceeding and are incorporated by reference as if fully set out herein. 2. The rates in Appendix A will produce annual revenue from sewer service of \$17,982.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The rates in Appendix A are approved for service rendered by J & W on and after the date of this Order.

2. Within 30 days of the date of this Order, J & W shall file with the Commission its revised tariff setting out the rates approved herein.

Mr. Spenard,

The following information is provided in response to request for information by the Attorney General. The information is provided by Clyde Fowler, ⁹owner of J&W Sanitation.

1. J&W Sanitation has not entered into a maintenance contract with Danco Engineering at this time. I have personally been performing maintenance activities. I am 78 years old, and it is becoming increasingly difficult to adequately perform these activities. The current rate structure does not provide sufficient funds to contract out maintenance services. The purpose of the proposed rate increase is to provide these funds. Danco Engineering provided a proposal to furnish maintenance services. A copy of the proposal is attached.

2. Satisfactory operation requires that the plant be inspected, cleaned, and serviced four times per week. Activities performed during each visit include:

a. check the following equipment for proper operation:

- i. air pump and airflow
- j. skimmers
- k. chlorine pump
- 1. grinder
- b. Check chlorine level and refill as necessary
- c. Wash plant
- d. Remove any debris that has blown into plant area
- e. Conduct required sampling
- f. Report sampling results on the monthly Discharge Monitoring Report
- 3. The plant uses the aeration treatment process. Process flows are as follows:
 - a. sewage enters first-stage main tank at grinder where solids are ground
 - b. air is injected into main tank
 - c. sewage flows by gravity to second-stage settling tank
 - d. sewage that settles to bottom of settling tank is re-pumped into main tank. This is a repetitive process.

- e. Solids are skimmed from surface of settling tank and re-pumped into main tank
- f. Liquids flow from settling tank into third-stage tank
- g. Effluent is chlorinated and exits the plant
- 4. Monthly <u>Discharge Monitoring Reports</u> are submitted by quarter
- Notices of Violation were issued 11/09/98, 12/30/98, and 3/30/99. These notices were resolved by the 03/22/99 Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Cabinet Regional Office conference with no fines involved. Copies of the Notices of Violation and the 04//0/99 letter of resolution are attached.
- 6. The facility has no employees.
- 7. As stated in #6, J&W Sanitation has no employees. As owner, I have been performing the routine maintenance described in #2. J&W Sanitation currently contracts with Reclamation Services, Inc. to perform analyses and prepare self-monitoring reports. Pending the granting of the proposed rate increase, I plan to contract with Danco Engineering for routine maintenance, analysis, and reporting activities.
- 8. J&W Sanitation is required to annually renew its Kentucky Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (KPDES) permit. A copy of the current KPDES permit is attached.
- 9. Several years ago, J&W Sanitation entered into an agreement with the City of Madisonville in which J&W would cease treatment operations and the city would provide sewage treatment for J&W's customers. The agreement was contingent upon the city annexing the area covered by J&W. The annexation failed to materialize and the agreement became void. A condition of J&W's KPDES permit requires hookup to a municipal wastewater treatment system when available.
- 10. The proposal by Rudd Insurance (copy attached) brings J&W's coverage up to recommended limits.
- 11. The pro forma present rates for Outside Services performed should be 11,880 and the required revenue is 17,300.
- 12. A copy of the 2/21/99 letter is attached.
- 13. J&W currently pays 200.00 per month for accounts receivable services including billing, posting receipts, and preparing bank deposits. Other bookkeeping functions are performed internally.
- 14. The owner is responsible for:
 - a. ensuring that rights-of-way to all sewer lines are clear
 - b. repairing damaged sewer lines and manholes
 - c. ensuring that routine maintenance is performed
 - d. collecting fees
 - e. ensuring that plant continues to operate satisfactorily

- 15. A monthly statement is sent to each statement. Payments received are shown on the subsequent month's statement.
- 16. Your letter is the first time the installation of rubber gaskets or rubber seals on manholes has been brought to my attention.
- 17. No odor complaints have been received since January 1, 1997.
- 18. J&W Sanitation discharges into an unnamed tributary at mile point 0.35 to an unnamed tributary at mile point 1.75 to Clear Creek at mile point 24.35. A copy of the KPDES permit is attached.

I am writing to provide additional information regarding my application for a rate increase for J&W Sanitation. You previously requested supporting documents for the expenses shown on J&W's 1997 tax return. However, due to the changes outlined below, it is my position that previous expenses are irrelevant to my request for a rate increase.

In past years, expenses for J&W Sanitation have been unrealistically low. I have performed virtually all activities personally. I have used my personal vehicle, tools, and equipment. I am 78 years old and am no longer able to perform these activities myself. Accordingly, I am currently contracting out specific activities and have obtained quotes for the remaining activities. I have included copies of the quotes. Estimated monthly expenses for J&W Sanitation are:

The most difficult expense to estimate is capital expenditures. Previous rate structures have provided insufficient funds to make non-emergency repairs or to develop a reserve for repairs. As you are aware, the plant is currently in need of repairs for problems that have developed over a number of years. I have included two quotes for these repairs. I have budgeted monthly expenses for capital expenditures at \$100.00 per month. I welcome your recommendation concerning this budget item.

To ensure that the plant continues to operate, it is imperative that a rate be established that will provide sufficient funding. If you require additional information, please let me know.

Dear Mr. Fowler:

Enclosed is the Reconnaissance Inspection of March 22, 1999, conducted after our Regional Office conference and the follow up inspection of March 25, 1999, with sampling for fecal coliform as we agreed. The first inspection showed inadequate dose of chlorine disinfectant. The second inspection showed a ten-fold increase in dose strength and the fecal coliform sample was back in compliance. This shows as we discussed that maintaining a clean contact chamber with 30 minutes detention time and adequate chlorine dose to have a good residual can disinfect your effluent.

As we discussed during the conference DOW does not set rates of billing, but inspects the plant for its compliance with its KPDES permit. We have not received a written response from you as requested for any of the past NOV's in 1998 or 1999. We have used the conference you requested instead of the written reply.

As a plant in the Regional Planning Authority of the City of Madisonville your KPDES plant is under the regional planning area of the city and within one mile of their collection system. Your new KPDES permit will be for less than 5 years. Once a POTW collection line is available your KPDES permit requires hook up to the POTW eliminating the discharge. In the interim you have all of the KPDES requirements to be achieved as always.

Mr. Fowler did not respond in writing to our Notice of Violation for operation and maintenance errors and failure to provide continuous automatic disinfection as required. Inspections had been made from November 2-1998 to Feb 3, 1999, with no response to NOV's issued 11-9-98 or 12-21-98. Mr. Fowler also wanted to discuss his rate structure with the Public Service Commission and his request for a raise in rates and a plan to take to small claims court nonpaying customers that had failed to pay his bills for months.

He requested that DOW make an inspection of his facility on Thursday, March 25th, 1999, and that he would make an effort to get the facility in shape by that time. We discussed that his plant is supposed to be in shape all the time, and that the plant needed to maintain a higher minimum chlorine residual for safety of downstream users.

The facility is in the Regional Planning Area of the City of Madisonville and is in an area within 1 mile of their present collection system. It was discussed that this project is resulting in a less than 5 year KPDES permit and that he would be required on the availability of POTW connection to make a connection.

Mr. Fowler stated that he was too old and sick to deal with wastewater plants and that if he did not get his rate request he was going to abandon the plant to the Public Service Commission. It was explained as long as he was

1

the owner he had responsibility to the permit and to the downstream user to protect the creek from disease.

Goals are to maintain a cleaner plant by improving general housekeeping, spend more time on the plant, clean the clarifier regularly, get the skimmers the correct height to skim solids, and to clean out the chlorine contact chamber as solids accumulate to maintain contact time.

Chlorine test kits can be used to do process control testing to ensure that the disinfection is adequate.

On April 30, 1998, the Public Service Commission ("Commission") received a letter from J & W Sanitation ("J & W") requesting Commission assistance with the preparation of a rate application. Commission Staff ("Staff") provided that assistance by performing a limited financial review of J & W's test year operations, the calendar year ending December 31, 1997. The scope of Staff's review was limited to obtaining information as to whether the test period operating revenues and expenses were representative of normal operation. Insignificant or immaterial discrepancies were not pursued and are not addressed herein.

Upon completion of the review, Staff assisted J & W in the development and preparation of a rate application. The application included an adjusted pro forma operating income statement wherein adjustments were made to test year operating revenues and expenses that were known and measurable and deemed to be reasonable. During the test year J & W did not retain independent supporting indocumentation for operating expenses. Therefore, to calculate pro forma operations post test period invoices and bids were used for determining maintenance expenses and estimates were made by J & W for utility costs and property taxes. Staff is of the opinion that the estimates are conservative and should be accepted in this case.

The rates proposed in the application were based on the pro forma income statement. The pro forma income statement supports a revenue requirement of

\$17,982. The rate proposed to meet that requirement is a flat monthly fee of \$21.41 per customer. The proposed rate is a 33 percent increase over the current monthly fee of \$16.10. The proposed rate was calculated by dividing the revenue requirement of \$17,982 by the total number of pro forma bills of 840 (70 customers x 12 bills per year).

On April 28, 1999, J & W submitted the rate application to the Commission for consideration. The application was considered filed on the date received as no filing deficiencies were noted.

The pro forma income statement and explanation of adjustments have been attached to this report as Attachment A. Attachment B details the calculation of the revenue requirement and the recommended rate. Renee Curry is responsible for all revenue adjustments and the calculation of the recommended rate. Scott Lawless is responsible for the determination of the revenue requirement. Based on the information included in this report, Staff is of the opinion that the rate proposed by J & W in its application is reasonable; however, J & W noticed its customers that the proposed rate was \$21.40. Therefore, Staff recommends that the rate approved by this Commission be \$21.40.

contract and a management contract that carry annual fees of \$8,880 and \$3,600, respectively.

The maintenance contract was provided by Danco Engineering, Inc. The contract price was \$740 monthly or \$8,880 annually. It provides for quarterly sampling duties, maintaining the discharge monitoring reports, supplying chlorine, and four inspection and maintenance trips per week. Based on Staff's knowledge of similarly situated wastewater utilities, it is of the opinion that the contract price is reasonable; however, it is approaching the high end of the reasonableness range. Staff recommends that the contract price be included in pro forma operations.

Management Services provided the management contract bid of \$3,600. This contract provides for the processing and mailing of monthly statements, collection of monthly payments, and bookkeeping services. The Commission normally allows small investor owned utilities to include an owner/manager fee of \$3,600 in pro forma operations. This fee is to compensate the owner of a small utility that takes an active role in daily operations. J & W has requested that this management contract be approved in lieu of the typical owner/manager fee. Staff recommends that the contract price be approved.

F) <u>Insurance</u>. Test year expenses included \$878 for insurance expense. This amount was increased by \$358 so that pro forma insurance expense equaled the premium of \$1,236 as quoted by Rudd Insurance, Inc. for general liability and property insurance.

G) <u>Transportation Expense</u>. Test year transportation expense was reported to be \$1,447. This amount was eliminated because J & W could not provide supporting documentation for the expense and future transportation expenses to J & W should be minimal after the execution of the Danco Engineering maintenance contract.

H) <u>Depreciation</u>. In the past J & W was not allowed rate recovery of depreciation expense taken on plant assets as plant costs had been recovered through the sale of developed property. Now that the treatment plant has aged many capital improvements will be required. J & W is entitled to recover the cost of any such improvements through rates.

J & W submitted two bids for a major repair to the treatment plant. Both bids were to replace 3 inch channel supports, 3 inch tees, and install new guards. The bid amounts were \$5,460 and \$4,878. Recovery of the low bid was included in pro forma operations by increasing test year expenses by \$488. The amount was calculated by dividing the \$4,878 cost by the assets 10 year estimated depreciable life.

<u>Taxes Other Than Income</u>. Test year expenses did not include property taxes.
 To include a provision for such taxes an adjustment was made to increase test year expenses by \$240, the estimated property tax for J & W.

IV. Billing Analysis

The billing analysis is the chart reflecting the usage by the customers as well as the revenue generated by a specific level of rates. Example for completing Usage Table is as follows:

Column No. 1 is incremental rate steps.

Columns numbered 2 and 3 are completed by using information obtained from usage records.

Columns numbered 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 are completed by the following steps:

Step 1: 1st 2,000 gallons minimum bill rate level

We have received a notice from J & W Sanitation, 231 Randall Drive, Madisonville, KY 42431, that they intend to increase our rates for sewage from a monthly rate of \$16.00 to \$21.40.

Our service was connected in May of 1994, when we purchased our home. We have been charged \$16.00 a month, ever since. It has recently come to our attention that some of our neighbors were only charged \$12.00 a month until January 1997.

Two years ago, our sewer line was changed to run across our property, instead of our neighbor's front yard. Neither Mr. Clyde Fowler, nor the county, nor the State of Ky had any lay-out of the existing sewer system. We discovered that the property lines had been changed 3 times. That is a matter of public record, of which we have copies.

The state is also aware, and so are we, that the sewer is dumped into the underground coal mines. Our understanding is that this is strictly illegal.

There are new houses being constructed in our area, which generates additional revenue to Mr. Fowler, with no significant additional work or cost required.

Mr. Fowler did not give any reason for the rate increase in his notice. We do not see any justification for this rate increase. This facility appears to be run by Mr. Fowler and one assistant.

Is there a published rate on file with the commission? If so, would it be possible for us to receive a copy?

We would also like to respectfully request that the commission inspect this facility before considering the rate increase.
