Indian Adoptions from afar

by the help of students and staff at the Northeast Parent and Child Society Grout Park School to support Pine Ridge elders.

The students have held bake sales, sold flowers and put on a talent show to raise money. "For the students, they are learning a lot of history and culture, that there are people in this country who need their help," Gerome says.

Gerome recently sent flannel sheets to elderly people in the Wakpamni community to help them stay warm in the winter. One woman cried because she had never before had new sheets.

"It can be discouraging. You can feel like you could spend every dime you had within that community for many years and it wouldn't make a dent," Gerome says.

"I'm hoping over time through our school we can raise the standard of living in that community," she says.

Russell says she often makes the 12-hour drive from her home in Taos to deliver food and other supplies to the reservation. And she organizes a get-together for grandparents and sponsors during the Oglala Sioux's annual meeting.

"So much of the things that happen with this program are things that are not measurable in dollars," Russell says.

Ben and Alvina Conquering Bear would like to have someone adopt them. The retired couple raised 10 children and now have 35 grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren.

"It's a struggle and a half for my family," Mrs. Conquering Bear says. "Sometimes I have four families here."

O R D E R

On July 19, 1999, Lake Village Water Association, Inc. ("Lake Village") applied for approval to adjust its rates pursuant to the purchased water adjustment procedure. KRS 278.015 and 807 KAR 5:068. On July 23, 1999, Lake Village submitted an amendment to its original application.

The Commission, having reviewed the record and being sufficiently advised, finds that:

1. Lake Village purchases its water from two suppliers, City of Harrodsburg ("Harrodsburg") and City of Danville ("Danville").
2. Harrodsburg increased the wholesale water rate charged to Lake Village, effective May 1, 1999, as follows:

First	250	cubic feet	from \$5.00	to \$6.00	Minimum bill
Next	750	cubic feet	from 1.90	to 2.28	per 100 cubic feet
Next	3,000	cubic feet	from 1.65	to 1.98	per 100 cubic feet
Next	6,000	cubic feet	from 1.40	to 1.68	per 100 cubic feet
Next	25,000	cubic feet	from 1.20	to 1.44	per 100 cubic feet
Next	25,000	cubic feet	from 1.00	to 1.20	per 100 cubic feet
All Over	60,000	cubic feet	from .80	to .96	per 100 cubic feet

Danville did not increase its rate.

3. During the 12 months ending April 30, 1999, Lake Village purchased a total of 121,694,447 gallons of water and sold 93,301,200 gallons.

4. The increase in the cost of purchased water will be \$21,499.93, resulting in a purchased water adjustment of \$0.23 per 1,000 gallons of water. Based on a monthly usage of 5,000 gallons, the average bill of a Lake Village customer would increase \$1.15 from \$34.37 to \$35.52 or 3.3 percent.

5. The amended calculations and tariff provided by Lake Village are correct and should be approved.

6. The purchased water adjustment of \$0.23 per 1,000 gallons and the rates in Appendix A, attached hereto and incorporated herein, are fair, just, and reasonable and should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The purchased water adjustment of \$0.23 per 1,000 gallons and the rates in Appendix A are approved for services rendered on and after August 1, 1999.

2. The amended tariff submitted by Lake Village is hereby approved as filed.

3. Within 20 days from the effective date of this Order, Lake Village shall file a copy of the notice to its customers and verification that such notice has been given.







ORDINANCE NO. 1999- 4

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE WATER AND SEWER RATES

WHEREAS, the water and sewer rate ordinances have not been adjusted for several years although the cost of providing the utility services have significantly increased; and

WHEREAS, the present revenue is insufficient to maintain the continued cost of water production and sewage treatment; and

WHEREAS, the City is under a state mandate to make major improvements to the sanitary sewer system; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner seeks to equitably distribute the costs of services among the different classifications of users; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to adjust the water and sewer rates;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF HARRODSBURG, KENTUCKY:

I. Sections 17-3(1) and (2) of Chapter 17 are amended to read:

(1) Minimum water rate. The minimum water bill shall be ~~five~~ six dollars (~~\$5.00~~ 6.00) per month, and each water customer shall be entitled to two hundred fifty (250) cubic feet of water in each month for such minimum charge.

(2) Meter rates for water usage in addition to minimum charge. Subject to the minimum monthly water rate specified above, the following metered charges shall be made for each one hundred (100) cubic feet of water consumption per month to customers of all size connections except for any contractual arrangements with specific customers for additional surcharges.

Rates and Classification of Service

1. APPLICATION: This tariff shall cover the entire service area of the Association, which consists of Northeast Boyle County and East and Southeast Mercer County as follows: Bounded on the east by Lake Herrington, Water Works Road and Dix River; on the north by Curdsville Road, Kentucky Highway 342, and Chatham Road; on the west by U.S. 68, the Harrodsburg City Limits and Dry Branch Road and Bluegrass Pike; and on the south by Gentry Lane, Danville City Limits and Kentucky Highway 34.

2. AVAILABILITY OF SERVICE: The Association does not distinguish between classes of customers in making water service available; however, all customers who rent the premises to which service is provided will be required to make the deposit as hereinafter set out and the renter and the actual owner or owners of the premises must sign the water user's agreement; in the event service to the premises is discontinued for failure to pay service will not be restored to the premises, regardless of the person or persons occupying same, until the bill is paid in full.



ORDINANCE NO. 1999- 4

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE WATER AND SEWER RATES

WHEREAS, the water and sewer rate ordinances have not been adjusted for several years although the cost of providing the utility services have significantly increased; and

WHEREAS, the present revenue is insufficient to maintain the continued cost of water production and sewage treatment; and

WHEREAS, the City is under a state mandate to make major improvements to the sanitary sewer system; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner seeks to equitably distribute the costs of services among the different classifications of users; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to adjust the water and sewer rates;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF HARRODSBURG, KENTUCKY:

L. Sections 17-3(1) and (2) of Chapter 17 are amended to read:

(1) Minimum water rate. The minimum water bill shall be ~~five~~ six dollars (~~\$5.00~~ 6.00) per month, and each water customer shall be entitled to two hundred fifty (250) cubic feet of water in each month for such minimum charge.


