ORDER

On October 1, 1999, Cawood Water District ("Cawood") filed an application for Commission approval of proposed rates. The proposed rates for water service would generate additional annual revenues of \$30,191, an increase of 11.28 percent above normalized operating revenues.

By Order dated January 11, 2000, the Commission issued a Staff Report that was prepared upon review of Cawood's test-year operations. Staff's report recommended that Cawood's requested increase be granted. The Order granted 10 days to file written comments regarding the Staff Report or requests for a hearing or informal conference. No such comments or requests were made.

The Commission, having considered the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that:

- 1. The recommendations and findings contained in the Staff Report are supported by the evidence of record, are reasonable, and should be adopted as the findings of the Commission.
- 2. The rates in Appendix A will produce annual revenue from water sales of \$297,944.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The findings contained in the Staff Report are adopted and incorporated by reference into this Order as if fully set out herein.

2. The rates in Appendix A are approved for service rendered by Cawood on and after the date of this Order.

3. Within 30 days of the date of this Order, Cawood shall file with the Commission its revised tariff setting out the rates approved herein.

4. Three years from the date of this Order Cawood shall file an income statement, along with any pro forma adjustments, in sufficient detail to demonstrate that the rates approved herein are sufficient to meet its operating expenses and annual debt service requirements.

STAFF REPORT

ON

CAWOOD WATER DISTRICT

CASE NO. 99-362

Pursuant to a request by Cawood Water District ("Cawood") for assistance with the preparation of a rate application, Commission Staff ("Staff") performed a limited financial review of Cawood's test year operations, the calendar year ending December 31, 1998. The scope of Staff's review was limited to obtaining information as to whether the test period operating revenues and expenses were representative of normal operations. Insignificant or immaterial discrepancies were not pursued and are not addressed herein.

Upon completion of the review, Staff assisted Cawood in the development and preparation of a rate application. The application included an adjusted pro forma operating income statement wherein adjustments were made to test year operating revenues and expenses that were known and measurable and deemed to be reasonable. The rates proposed by Cawood were based on the pro forma income statement as shown in Attachment A of the application. Attachment A also includes the calculation of Cawood's revenue requirement using a 120 percent debt service coverage. The coverage requirement is \$102,995. The proposed rates produce income available to service the debt of (\$633); however, by adding back depreciation, a non-cash expense, income available to service debt at the proposed rates increases to \$102,195 which is \$800 less than the coverage requirement. The proposed rates should

therefore provide adequate revenue for Cawood to meet its cash revenue requirements.

The proposed rates are shown in the application on Sheet 7 of Attachment B.

On October 1, 1999, Cawood filed its rate application to the Commission for consideration. Staff is hereby adopting the contents of that application as its recommendation in this report as if fully set out herein. Renee Curry is responsible for all revenue adjustments and calculation of the proposed rates. Scott Lawless is responsible for the determination of the revenue requirement. Based on the information included in Cawood's application, Staff is of the opinion that the rates proposed by Cawood, as shown in Attachment A of this report, are reasonable and should be approved by this Commission.

At its July monthly meeting, the Cawood Water District Board of Commissioners reviewed the material you sent us via letter dated June 17, 1999 regarding our rates. The Board of Commissioners voted per option 4 in your letter to request the Public Service Commission's assistance in preparing a Rate Adjustment application which would amend the rates to the following:

First 2,000 Gallons	\$15.50 (minimum bill)
Next 8,000 Gallons	5.75 per 1,000 Gallons
Over 10,000 Gallons	4.80 per 1,000 Gallons

While these rates will not generate as much revenue as the proposed rates shown in the original application you proposed, the District feels they will generate enough revenue to comfortably operate the system, service our debt and cover an appropriate portion of the depreciation. They will be sufficient to meet the Commission's "Minimum Financial standard".

While Staff believes that the Commission would approve rates that generate revenue below the MFS in this situation because the deficit is minimal, Staff is of the opinion that such rates should be cost based.

In recent years, the Commission has made increasing efforts to establish rates for water districts that are actually cost based. Thus, each customer or class is actually paying his fair share of the cost of providing water service. When rates are not based upon actual costs, one class of customer often ends up subsidizing another. To ensure that rates are fair and equitable, a cost of service study should be performed.

After receiving your letter with proposed rates, Staff performed another cost of service study to generate revenues of \$297,944. The cost of service study produced the following rates:

First 2,000 Gallons Next 8,000 Gallons Over 10.000 Gallons \$16.45 (Minimum Bill) 5.54 per 1.000 Gallons 3.94 per 1,000 Gallons

Based upon the cost of service study, it costs the District \$5.25 just to service each customers. This does not include any water usage. The cost of 2,000 gallons of water is \$11.20. Therefore, the minimum bill for the first 2,000 gallons should be \$16.45. Charging less than this in the first usage block will cause customers whose usage is greater than 2,000 gallons to be charged higher rates. These rates would be unfair because this group of customers would be subsidizing another group.

I respectfully request that the proposed rate increase for the Cawood Water District be denied for the following reasons.

Cawood Water District is currently in the process of expanding services to other customers. This means the test year they used on the applications doesn't adequately show the future revenue and expenses.

The current rates are excessive. The customers of the water district are charged one of the highest rates in this part of the region. An increase to the existing rate will place hardship on many of of the customers. Many of the customers of this district are on fixed income and can't afford this rate increase.

There is the possiblity of some of the customers electing to switch back to alternate water source (water wells). If a number of customers use their well water, this would mean even higher rates for the remaining customers.

The people of Cawood believed that this water District would provide them a save and afforable water supply. At first we were extremely disappointed with the high rates. We were angered when the applications for even higher rates were proposed.

Additional increases for the next 8,000 gallons will be from \$2.15 to \$3.00 per 1,000 gallons; from \$1.68 to \$2.75 for the next 15,000 per 1,000 gallons used; from \$1.48 to \$2.40 for the next 75,000 gallons per 1,000 gallons and from \$1.32 to \$2.15 for amounts over 100,000 gallons per 1,000 gallons used.
