ORDER

On November 22, 1999, Harrison County Water Association, Inc. ("Harrision") filed its application for Commission approval of a five-year rate phase-in plan. The proposed plan would generate additional annual revenues of \$60,000 in the first year and \$25,000 per year for each of the last four years.

By Order dated March 23, 2000, the Commission issued a Staff Report that was prepared upon review of Harrison's test-year operations. An error in the Staff Report was discovered and an amended report was issued by Commission Order on March 29, 2000. Staff's amended report recommended that Harrison's requested increase be granted. The Order granted 10 days to file written comments regarding the Staff Report or requests for a hearing or informal conference. No such comments or requests were made.

The Commission, having considered the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that:

1. The recommendations and findings contained in the Amended Staff Report are supported by the evidence of record, are reasonable, and should be adopted as the findings of the Commission.

2. The rates in Appendix A will produce additional annual revenue from water sales of \$60,000 in the first year and \$25,000 per year for each of the remaining four years.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. The findings contained in the Amended Staff Report are adopted and incorporated by reference into this Order as if fully set out herein.
- 2. The rates in phase-one of Appendix A are approved for service rendered by Harrison on and after the date of this Order. Phase-two rates become effective 12 months from the date of this Order, phase-three in 24 months from the date of this Order, phase-four in 36 months from the date of this Order, and phase-five in 48 months from the date of this Order.
- 3. Within 30 days of the date of this Order, Harrison shall file with the Commission its revised tariff setting out the first phase of rates approved herein.
- 4. Thirty days prior to the effective date of each subsequent rate phase-in, Harrison shall file with the Commission its revised tariff setting out the appropriate phase of rates approved herein. Harrison shall provide its customers with a one-time notice with the implementation of each phase of rates.

Pursuant to a request by Harrison County Water Association, Inc. ("Harrison") for assistance with the preparation of a rate application, Commission Staff ("Staff") performed a limited financial review of Harrison's test year operations, the twelve months ending November 30, 1998. The scope of Staff's review was limited to obtaining information as to whether the test period operating revenues and expenses were representative of normal operations. Insignificant or immaterial discrepancies were not pursued and are not addressed herein.

Upon completion of the review, Staff assisted Harrison in the development and preparation of a rate application. The application included an adjusted pro forma operating income statement wherein adjustments were made to test year operating revenues and expenses that were known and measurable and deemed to be reasonable. The rates proposed by Harrison were based on the pro forma income statement as shown in Attachment A of the application. Attachment A also includes the calculation of Harrison's revenue requirement using a 120 percent debt service coverage. The coverage requirement is \$317,500. To meet the coverage requirement Harrison needs additional revenues of \$160,000. To generate the additional revenue Harrison proposed a five-year rate phase-in plan. Under the proposed plan Harrison would generate additional revenues of \$60,000 in the first year and \$25,000 per year for each of the last four years.

On November 22, 1999, Harrison filed its rate application to the Commission for consideration. Staff is hereby adopting the contents of that application as its recommendation in this report as if fully set out herein. Brent Kirtley is responsible for all revenue adjustments and calculation of the proposed rates. Scott Lawless is responsible for the determination of the revenue requirement. Based on the information included in Harrison's application, Staff is of the opinion that the rates proposed by Harrison, as shown in Attachment A of this report, are reasonable and should be approved by this Commission.

ORDER

On September 29, 1999, Harrison County Water Association, Inc. ("Harrison County") applied to the Commission for an adjustment in rates. The application was reviewed by Commission Staff and rejected pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 2, for failure to meet the minimum filing requirements. A letter from the Commission was sent to Harrison County on November 2, 1999, outlining the deficiencies. In an effort to cure the deficiencies noted, Harrison County filed additional documents on November 17, 1999 and November 22, 1999. Harrison County included in its November 17, 1999 filing a request for permission to deviate from the 4-week notice requirement of Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10(2).

Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10(2), requires a utility with gross annual revenues exceeding \$1,000,000 to file with the Commission a written notice of intent to file a rate application at least 4 weeks prior to filing its application. The filing must state whether the rate application will be supported by a historical or fully forecasted test period and is to be served upon the Attorney General, Utility and Rate Intervention Division ("Attorney General").

Harrison County states in support of its request that it caused a letter to be written to the Executive Director of the Commission on May 19, 1999 stating that its

Board of Directors had voted to apply for an increase in rates and requested staff assistance in preparing the application. Thereafter, Commission Staff and Harrison County worked to prepare the application to be filed by Harrison County. Upon completion of the application, Harrison County filed it with the Commission believing that no further notice was required. On November 16, 1999, Harrison County sent a letter to the Attorney General enclosing a copy of the rate application and explaining its failure to provide the 4-week notice required by 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10(2). A request for full intervention was filed by the Attorney General on January 19, 2000. Full intervention was granted on January 24, 2000. No comments or objections to the request for deviation have been filed by the Attorney General.

The Commission, having reviewed the record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that good cause has been shown by Harrison County for its request to deviate from the 4-week notice requirement of 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10(2), and that the request should be granted. The Commission further finds that the application should be considered filed as of November 22, 1999, the date Harrison County filed the last remaining filing requirement.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. Harrison County's request for permission to deviate from the 4-week notice requirement of Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10(2), is granted.
- 2. Harrison County's rate application shall be considered filed as of November 22, 1999.

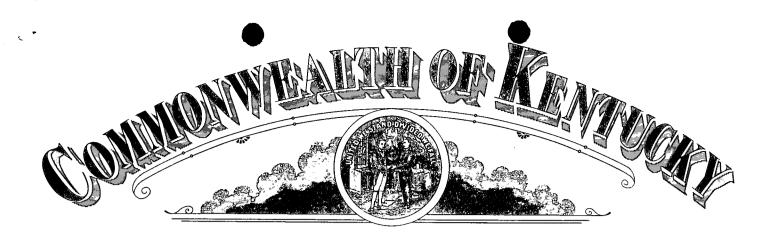

I am enclosing a rate application for the Harrison County Water Association, Inc. I understand that under the State Regulations 807 KAR 5:001, Rules of Procedure, Section 10(2), utilities with gross annual revenue of \$1,000,000.00 shall file a written notice of intent with the Attorney General to increase rates four (4) weeks prior to filing the rate application.

However, because the Public Service Commission had recommended to us in March of 1999 that we increase our rates, we are asking that we be issued a waiver on this requirement of a four (4) week notice. We submitted our rate application to the Public Service Commission on September 28, 1999. The Commission staff has conducted an initial review of your filing in the above case. This filing is rejected pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 2, as it is deficient in certain filing requirements. The items listed below are either required to be filed with the application or must be referenced if they are already on file in another case or will be filed at a later date.

Filing deficiencies pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001:

- 1) KRS 278.180: 30 days' notice of rates to PSC.
- 2) Section 10(1)(b)(3) and (5): If utility is incorporated, certified copy of articles of similar import. If they have already been filed with PSC refer to the style and case number of the prior proceeding and file a certificate of good standing or authorization dated within 60 days of date application filed.



- 3) Section 10(1)(b)(9): Statement that notice given, see subsections (3) and (4) of 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10 with copy.
- 4) Section 10(2): If gross annual revenues exceed \$1,000,000, written notice of intent filed at least 4 weeks prior to application. Notice shall state whether application will be supported by historical or fully forecasted test period.
- 5) Section 10(4): If copy of public notice included, did it meet requirements?

The statutory time period in which the Commission must process this case will not commence until the above-mentioned information is filed with the Commission. You are requested to file 10 copies of this information within 15 days of the date of this letter. Comes the Applicant, Harrison County Water Association, Inc, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10, gives notice to the Kentucky Public Service Commission of its intent to increase its water rates effective ______9/27__, 1999, so as to raise in total additional annual revenues the principal sum of \$160,000 through a five year phase-in plan. The phased-in rates will produce additional annual revenues in the amount of \$60,000 for the first year and \$25,000 for each year thereafter for four additional years. In support of this application and notice, Applicant files the following information as required by the applicable KAR as so stated.

Pursuant to KRS 278.180, Applicant with the mailing address of Harrison County Water Association P.O. Box 215 Cynthiana, Kentucky 41031, is hereby requesting that the Commission allow it to increase its rates charged for water service.

The rate adjustment is needed to provide financial resources to pay operating costs and service long-term debt.

Applicant has filed its 1997 annual report with the Commission as well as annual reports for all prior years of operation.

The Association's Articles of Incorporation have been previously filed with the Commission in case number 9253 and should be incorporated into this record by reference herein.

N/A. Applicant is not a limited partnership.

Section 10(1)(b)(6)

A certified copy of a certificate of assumed name is not necessary in this instance.

Section 10(1)(b)(7)

The proposed tariffs are attached hereto as Attachment E.

A comparison of the present and proposed tariffs is attached hereto as Attachment D.

Applicant has provided notice to its customers as required by 807 KAR 5:001, Sections (3) and (4).

The Commission was notified of the Association's intent to file a rate application on September 23, 1998 when a verbal request for Commission assistance with the preparation of the application was made.

The Association is charged monthly legal retainer fees of \$100. The Association makes semi-annual payments of \$600. Three \$600 semi-annual payments were included in the test year so one has been eliminated.

The Association currently has an outside contractor that prints customer bills for mailing. The Association paid \$.40 per bill during the test year for a total expense of \$20,515. In an effort to cut operating cost, the Association has been considering performing these services in-house. Test year operations have been adjusted to reflect this change in operation. To calculate the adjustment the Association annualized its current part-time employees wage rate and increased employee benefits, taxes, and computer costs accordingly. The adjustment was calculated as follows:

During the test year the Association brought a major system improvement project on line. The construction costs were moved from the CWIP account to the proper UPIS accounts in August 1998. No depreciation was charged for these items during the test year. Therefore, depreciation expense has been adjusted to include the recovery of these items. The depreciable lives used to calculate the annual expense are consistent with those approved by the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners. BILLING ANALYSIS

A Billing Analysis is a summarization or tabulation of customer bills that provides a useful basis for identifying and analyzing customer usage patterns, selecting water-usage rate blocks, and determining utility billing revenue under any rate schedule. It is to be completed before the cost of service study can be initiated.

The analysis shows the number of customer bills rendered at various levels of water usage during a specified period of time for each customer class served by the utility. The tabulation of bills for a historical period provides the basis for identifying typical customer-class usage patterns and aids in the development of rates recognizing such usage patterns. Rate schedules that are intended to be applicable throughout an entire year require an analysis for an historical 12-month period in order that annual usage patterns are properly identified. Using a full year of billing data allows for proper accounting of seasonal variations in customer water usage patterns. Sometimes the period selected for analysis may represent a year in which water usage was abnormally high or low due to climatic or other conditions. Such instances should be taken into consideration when utilizing the billing analysis for rate design purposes. Whenever possible, the selection of the 12-month period (test year) should reflect a year in which average consumptive conditions prevail.

The first step in tabulating customer bills is to separate billing records into customer classes, and then into meter sizes. The next step in the process involves entering individual customer usage for each billing period for the test year and tabulating the results. A 100% sample was used in order to provide a proper representative distribution of water-usage patterns. Bills issued to inactive accounts are excluded. Bills issued to active customer accounts with zero usage during any billing period are included in the minimum bill totals.

Once individual customer usages have all been entered, totals are tabulated by customer class and meter size. This represents the final step in the billing analysis.

Attached is the Billing Analysis for Harrison County Water Association. The test year for the analysis was the twelve months ending November 30, 1998. Both commercial and residential billings for each different sized meter were examined along with bulk water sales. The revenue reported by the association for that time period was verified, as was the amount of water sold. Harrison County's records reported revenues of \$1,200,238 on sales of 242,673,549 gallons. Commission Staff's billing analysis produced revenue from rates in the amount of \$1,201,486 on sales of 242,611,579 gallons. The difference in revenues is \$1,248 or 0.10% and the difference in gallons sold is 61,970 or 0.03%. Differences of less than one percent are considered insignificant in that such small discrepencies do not fundamentally alter the results of the calculations.

COST OF SERVICE STUDY

The principal theory in seeking to establish fair, just, and reasonable rates for a water utility is to develop rates that reflect the actual cost of providing water service to each of the different customer classifications. A sound analysis of the adequacy of charges requires allocation of costs among the customers commensurate with their service requirements in order to recognize differences in costs of furnishing service to different types of customers. For example, a customer with a high peak rate of use as compared with average rate of use requires larger capacity pumps, pipes, and certain other system facilities than a customer who has an equal total volume of use but takes water at a uniform rate. Accordingly, cost allocation procedures should recognize the particular service requirements of the customers for total volume of water, peak rates of use, and other factors.

Next, the utility's expenses (costs) are analyzed and allocated according to three different classifications: Commodity, Demand, and Customer.

Commodity costs are those directly associated with the cost of water. The major expense in this classification is the amount paid to purchase water from the city of Cynthiana. The only other commodity cost that the association experienced was purchased power expense and contracted services for bacteria analysis.

Demand costs are those associated with providing the facilities to meet the peak demands placed on the system. Costs consist of pumping and storage facilities, transmission and distribution mains, and the salaries and expenses associated with the employees that monitor and maintain these facilities.

Customer costs are those incurred to serve customers without regard to varying usage. These costs include meter reading, billing, collections, accounting expenses, and the capital related costs associated with service lines and meters.

The first three pages show the allocation breakdowns that were prepared using the association's financial information for the test year. Page C-1 allocates plant value, C-2 allocates depreciation, and C-3 allocates operating and maintenance expenses. The fourth page, C-4, calculates the phase-in increase in revenue as requested by the association.

Currently, retail customer revenue for Harrison County is \$1,165,708. The revenue requirement calculation established that the association needs rates that generate \$1,325,540, providing for an increase in revenue of \$159,832. However, Harrison County requests that the rate increase be phased-in over time to lessen customer rate shock. Therefore, the association proposes an initial rate increase of \$59,832 to be followed by four annual revenue increases of \$25,000 each.
