ORDER

North Mercer Water District ("North Mercer") has requested to deviate from Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 10(2)(b). Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 10(2)(b) states that fire hydrants may be installed by a utility only if a professional engineer with a Kentucky registration has certified that the system can provide a minimum fire flow of 250 gallons per minute and if the supporting system has the capability of providing the flow for a period of not less than 2 hours plus consumption at the maximum daily rate. To date no intervention requests have been filed with the Commission.

North Mercer states that it surrounds the city of Harrodsburg, Kentucky ("City") on the north, west, and south and that the City requires all developers to install fire hydrants that can be used directly for fire fighting and protection. North Mercer is making this request for deviation because developers are developing real estate located within the City and within North Mercer's service territory. North Mercer proposes that fire hydrants be installed by the developers, but that they be used only for flushing purposes, not for direct fire fighting, until such time as a professional engineer can

certify that the system can provide the required flow. In the alternative, North Mercer proposes that it be relieved of the responsibility to provide the minimum fire flow required by 807 KAR 5:066, Section 10(2)(b), if the City obtains ownership and maintenance of the mains and facilities in the subject developments.

Pursuant to an Order by the Commission, an informal conference was held for Commission Staff and North Mercer to meet and discuss the request. North Mercer invited the developer and a representative of the City to attend and participate at the informal conference even though they had not intervened in the action. The developer and North Mercer expressed differing opinions as to whether North Mercer's system can provide the flows required for the installation of fire hydrants.

Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 18, provides that in special cases, for good cause shown, the Commission may permit deviations from Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:066. To determine whether good cause exists for the requested deviation, the Commission ordered North Mercer to provide a hydraulic analysis of its water distribution system in the area where the fire hydrants are planned for installation. The Commission further ordered that North Mercer include in its analysis a certificate signed by a professional engineer stating whether North Mercer's system can provide the minimum fire flow required by 807 KAR 5:066, Section 10(2)(b). North Mercer did not provide the analysis requested; nor did it provide any other evidence to support its request.

The Commission, having considered the request and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that North Mercer has not shown the requisite good cause to grant it permission to deviate from Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 10(2)(b).

In addition, the Commission is concerned that the installation of fire hydrants may mislead North Mercer's customers into believing that the water distribution system is capable of providing adequate and reliable volumes of water for fire protection purposes. Therefore, North Mercer's request should be denied.

North Mercer should not construe our action as authority to eliminate fire hydrants from the proposed water main extensions. KRS 74.415(1) permits North Mercer to eliminate fire hydrants from new or extended water lines if it determines that they are not feasible. KRS 74.415(1) establishes the analysis that must be performed for a proper determination on feasibility. North Mercer has not performed such an analysis to allow the elimination of the proposed fire hydrants.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. North Mercer's request to deviate from 807 KAR 5:066, Section 10(2)(b), is denied.

2. Before eliminating any fire hydrants from new or extended water mains within its service territory, North Mercer shall perform the analysis required by KRS 74.415(1) and determine that hydrants are not feasible.

RESPONSE TO FIRST DATA REQUEST OF

COMMISSION STAFF

Comes the North Mercer Water District, by counsel, and for its Response to the First Data Request of Commission Staff of the Public Service Commission, hereinafter known and referred to as "Commission", to the North Mercer Water District, hereinafter known and referred to as "District", and states as follows:

(1) REQUEST FOR INFORMATION:

Provide a hydraulic analysis of North Mercer's water distribution system in the area being developed by Baker, Kirkland & McGlone. The analysis shall be prepared by a professional engineer with a Kentucky license and shall include a certification by the engineer regarding whether North Mercer's system can provide the minimum fire flow required by the Commission's administrative regulations.

(1) RESPONSE OF DISTRICT

The District attaches herewith, a photocopy of the January 9, 2000 letter of William Daugherty, LPE #447; and a copy of the Construction Plans, Amended Alexander Heights Subdivision, Phase 2, as prepared by William Daugherty of Daugherty Engineers on August, 1998.

(2) REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

Does North Mercer provide fire protection to any of its customers?

(2) RESPONSE OF DISTRICT

The District does not provide fire protection to any of its customers, if the Commission Staff is meaning that fire hoses are hooked directly to the hydrant, or flush valve, as they are described by District personnel. The District does allow fire fighters to draw water from any District flush valve for the purpose of refilling fire trucks. Refilling fire trucks is never to be accomplished by a "hard

connection" suction hose or pump. The fire fighters are authorized to refill tanks directly by placing a collapsible hose directly into the top of the fire truck tank, or by filling a portable tank or "pond" and thus allowing the fire truck to pump from the portable tank or "pond". The District does not charge for this water, but does request the fire protection district officials to notify District personnel as to the amount of water consumed in fire fighting and the time that the usage is made.

(3) REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

Does North Mercer's filed rate schedule contain a disclaimer of fire protection service?

(3) RESPONSE OF DISTRICT

Yes. The District's Rates, Rules and Regulations for Furnishing Water, adopted by the Commission on October 17, 1992, states at paragraph R, as follows:

"Water furnished by the District may be used for domestic consumption by the customer, members of his household, and employees only. The customers shall not sell the water to any other person."

(4) REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

Has North Mercer determined that hydrants are not feasible in the area being developed by Baker, Kirkland & McGlone?

(4) RESPONSE OF DISTRICT

(6) REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

If the response to Item 4 is in the negative, explain why a determination on feasibility has not been performed.

(6) RESPONSE OF DISTRICT

The response to Item 4 was "Yes". No additional response is required for Request for Information #6.

The District does, however, wish to explain its position in light of statements made by William Daugherty as shown on the attachments filed in Response to Request for Information #1.

The District's sole source of water for the Alexander Heights Subdivision is the City of Harrodsburg, Kentucky/North Mercer Water District master meter on U.S. Highway 127. This master meter has a contractual limitation from the City of Harrodsburg, Kentucky, of 300 gallons per minute. 807 KAR 5:066 Section 10 (2) (b) Fire Protection, requires that "the system supporting this flow has the capacity of providing this flow for a period of not less than two (2) hours plus consumption at the maximum daily rate." North Mercer Water District frequently exceeds the total number of gallons per minute as authorized by its contract with the City of Harrodsburg, Kentucky. This use of water is made without providing any fire protection. Should the District be required to provide fire protection to its customers, it would be necessary that the District violate its contract with the City

of Harrodsburg, Kentucky, as that contract would only provide for 50 gallons per minute of water in excess of the minimum number of gallons required by <u>807 KAR</u> <u>5:066 Section 10 (2) (b) Fire Protection</u>. In short, the District would only have 50 gallons of water, per minute, to serve over 2,000 customers if it had to provide fire protection.

On March 22, 2000, the Commission held a conference in this case at the Commission's offices in Frankfort, Kentucky. Present were:

Beginning the conference, Anita Mitchell explained the procedure and stated that Commission Staff would prepare minutes of the conference for the case record, that a copy of the minutes would be provided to all those in attendance, and that everyone would have the opportunity to submit written comments upon the minutes.

Staff explained to the participants that the conference was scheduled to provide Commission Staff and the representatives of North Mercer Water District ("North Mercer") the opportunity to discuss the deviation request filed by North Mercer on December 1, 1999.

The discussions were then turned over to Mr. Jones. He explained to Commission staff and the others present at the meeting why he considered it necessary for North Mercer to obtain a deviation. He stated that North Mercer surrounds the City of Harrodsburg, Kentucky to the north, west and south. He stated that North Mercer has lines in the area of the City being developed by Baker, Kirkland & McGlone

("developer") and that the City of Harrodsburg, by ordinance, is requiring the developer to install fire hydrants which can be used directly for fire fighting and protection. Mr. Jones stated that at this time North Mercer cannot provide adequate flows to meet Commission Regulations 807 KAR 5:066, Section 10(2)(b)(1)(a) and (b) which provides:

- (b) Fire protection.
- 1. On or after the effective date of this administrative regulation, fire hydrants may be installed by a utility only if:
- a. A professional engineer with a Kentucky registration has certified that the system can provide a minimum fire flow of 250 gallons per minute; and
- b. The system supporting this flow has the capability of providing this flow for a period of not less than two (2) hours plus consumption at the maximum daily rate.

Mr. Jones stated that North Mercer wants to work with the developer and wants to work with the City but does not believe it can do so and be in compliance with the law. He stated that he has discussed the dilemma with the City of Harrodsburg and believes North Mercer will be in compliance with the City's ordinance if it can obtain a deviation from this Commission permitting it to allow the developer to install fire hydrants that operate as flush valves. Tebbs Moore, the Attorney for the City of Harrodsburg, stated that the City would be satisfied if fire hydrants were installed and used as flush valves. He also stated that the firefighters would be satisfied. Mr. Pennington, attorney for the developer, and Mr. McGlone stated that according to the developer's engineer, the flow at North Mercer is sufficient to meet Commission Regulation.

The participants then held a discussion on the type of connections and the type of pipe used by the North Mercer and the developer. Mr. Amato briefly explained that as a City Engineer he was involved in a similar situation and that the matter was resolved by the City paying an incremental cost to increase the system of the water district so that it could provide fireflow. It was also suggested by the City that the matter might be resolved by the City taking over that part of the line.

Mr. Pennington, attorney for the developer, raised the question of extension reimbursement. He stated that North Mercer has not reimbursed the developer the 50 foot line extension as required by Commission Regulation. He stated that the matter was presently being litigated. Staff explained that this was not a matter of consideration in this case and that if the developer wished to pursue it before the Commission there were appropriate avenues available.

Commission Staff informed North Mercer that the Commission would have to have information regarding the pressure filed with the Commission and certified by a licensed engineer. Mr. McGlone stated that he would have an engineer perform the

test. Mr. Jones agreed to allow Mr. McGlone's engineer to run a test and provide the information to the Commission.

Mr. Jones explained that North Mercer was working on tapping into the City's 8 inch main where the sewer plant is located. He stated that North Mercer would cross the river and run through the distribution system. He also explained that part of the system at Rose Hill, just west of the city, the line is marginal and borders on minimum pressure. He stated that North Mercer would like to work with the City to tap into the water tower that was built about 1-1/2 miles from Mr. McGlone's subdivision.

The participants discussed at length North Mercer's system, the City's requirements, the developer's situation and the Commission requirements.

Dear Sir:

I am inquiring as to the possibility of obtaining from the Public Service Commission, a deviation from the administrative regulations relating to fire hydrants. 807 KAR 5:066 Section 10 (2) (b) Fire Protection, states as follows:

- "1. On or after the effective date of this administrative regulation, fire hydrants may be installed by a utility only if:
- a. A professional engineer with a Kentucky registration has certified that the system can provide a minimum fire flow of 250 gallons per minute; and
- b. The system supporting this flow has the capability of providing this flow for a period of not less than two (2) hours plus consumption at the maximum daily rate."

North Mercer Water District surrounds the City of Harrodsburg, Kentucky, to the north, west and south. The City of Harrodsburg requires all developers to install fire hydrants which can be used directly for fire fighting and protection. North Mercer Water District, which is supplied water by the City of Harrodsburg, Kentucky, cannot at this time provide adequate flows of water to meet paragraphs (a) and (b) of the above regulation.

The City of Harrodsburg does not wish to amend its Ordinance relating to developers installing fire hydrants. The water district is not presently capable of supplying sufficient flows to these fire hydrants for fire protection. The City of Harrodsburg has annexed a portion of the North Mercer Water District service area into the City of Harrodsburg. The problem is created when developers are developing real estate which is located within the North Mercer Water District service district, but being required by City of Harrodsburg to install fire hydrants. North Mercer Water District seeks to obtain a deviation from the PSC regulation cited above.

The district would propose a regulation or deviation from the regulation which would require developers to install all necessary equipment for the installation of fire hydrants. These hydrants would not be used for direct fire fighting, but be used ONLY as flush valves until such time as a professional engineer with a Kentucky registration can certify that the system can provide a minimum flow of 250 gallons per minute and maintain this flow for at least two (2) hours plus consumption at the maximum daily rate. The North Mercer Water District would propose a further deviation from the regulation which would provide that should the City of Harrodsburg obtain ownership and maintenance responsibility of the water mains and facilities within the subject subdivision, then the requirements for minimum flows imposed upon the water district would not be applicable.

I would be happy to discuss this matter with the officials that normally deal with water related matters. Please consider this request and contact my office at your next opportunity.
