14. Identify all planned transmission capacity additions for the next 10 years. Include the expected in-service date, size and site for all planned additions and identify the transmission need each addition is intended to address.

Response:

The Midwest ISO's 10 year expansion plan, dated 12/4/03, is attached for the planned and proposed projects on the LG&E and KU Transmission System for facilities greater than 100 KV. All presently planned additions are for serving LG&E/KU network load. No projects are planned to increase export capacity or relieve parallel flow problems.
