Joe Burns

Joe has been with Kentucky Rural Water Association since April 1994. His current activities include implementing the NRWA source water protection program and oversight of the NRWA wellhead program and the Division of Water wellhead protection assistance grant. Prior to joining the KRWA staff, Mr. Burns was a Senior Groundwater Hydrologist for the Kentucky Division of Water beginning in July, 1991, where he was responsible for formulating Kentucky's Wellhead Protection Strategy. He also has experience in drilling and environmental monitoring. Joe holds Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees in Geology from Eastern Kentucky University.

Jack Stickney

Jack Stickney came to Kentucky Rural Water Association in February of 2001. As a Groundwater Technician for KRWA, he writes Wellhead Protection Plans for small water utilities throughout Kentucky. He also assists utilities with problems and technical issues that pertain to groundwater resources. Jack earned his Bachelor of Science Degree in Geology in 1979 from Radford University, Radford Virginia, and his Masters Degree in Geology in 1985 from Eastern Kentucky University, Richmond, Kentucky.

Jack has over twenty years of work experience in the geologic field including oil drilling, uranium mining, coal, groundwater, and environmental from all over the United States, but primarily in Kentucky. He is a registered Professional Geologist in Kentucky, North Carolina and Alaska.

Matt joined the Kentucky Rural Water Association in March of 2002 as a Groundwater Technician. His primary responsibilities include the development of Sourcewater Protection Plans for water systems utilizing groundwater resources and providing technical assistance in related groundwater issues.

Matt attended Western Kentucky University, where he obtained a bachelor's degree in Geography with an emphasis in hydrogeology. He worked on several projects as a geologic technician for the Center for Cave and Karst Studies at Western and completed a planning internship under Dr. Nicholas Crawford, focusing on the development of a stormwater management plan for the city of Bowling Green.

Phillip N. East

Prior to coming to work as a Circuit Rider for the Kentucky Rural Water Association (KRWA) in September 1996, Phillip East served as Water Treatment Superintendent for the City of Franklin, Kentucky. Before moving to Kentucky, Mr. East worked as Treatment Plant Operator for the Hendersonville Utility District in Hendersonville, Tennessee. Phillip has served as the Education Services Director for KRWA since 1997.

Mr. East has also worked for the City of Odessa, Texas and the City of Austin, Texas where he worked his way up through the ranks serving as Chemical and Filter Operator, Instrument Technician, Maintenance Mechanic Foreman, Chief Operator, Assistant Plant Superintendent, Plant Supervisor, and Plant Operations Supervisor. Gary Larimore

Gary Larimore has been Executive Director of the Kentucky Rural Water Association (KRWA) since its formation in March 1979. He has received both Bachelor of Science and Master of Public Service Degrees from Western Kentucky University in Bowling Green, Kentucky.

Mr. Larimore is responsible for the administration and day-to-day operation of the Association's office and supervision of a twenty-member staff. These duties include budgeting and financial management, personnel management, and acting as the primary representative with the membership, the Board of Directors, National Rural Water Association, various funding agencies, and other outside organizations. Additionally, Mr. Larimore serves as Secretary/Treasurer of the Kentucky Rural Water Finance Corporation, which was incorporated in 1995 for the purpose of assisting communities in obtaining competitive financing. Other primary duties include representing the Association's legislative and regulatory interests as a full-time lobbyist and working with water-related groups and organizations.

Mr. Larimore is the co-author of the *Kentucky Wastewater* Assistance Manual for Policymakers, June, 1993; Kentucky Rural Water Assistance Manual, January, 1990; Water System Decision Makers — An Introduction to Water System Operation and Maintenance, January 1988; and Conserving Water and Energy — A Manual for Managers of Rural Water Utilities, September, 1982. He has served on a variety of National Rural Water Association (NRWA) committees and currently serves as a trustee of the Rural Municipal Retirement Trust, sponsored by NRWA.

Gary is a native of Horse Cave, Kentucky. He lives in Warren County, Kentucky with his wife Rita Tupts Larimore, who teaches third grade at St. Joseph School in Bowling Green, Kentucky.

CLEM WETHINGTON

Clem Wethington came to Kentucky Rural Water Association in 1987 from the City of Eddyville where he was Superintendent of Public Works for over eight years. For nine years he served on the Eddyville City Council. Clem holds the following licenses: Class IIIA Kentucky Water Treatment Plant Operator's License, Class II Kentucky Water Distribution System Operator's License, and Class I Kentucky Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator's License.

Mr. Wethington held the position of Circuit Rider with Kentucky Rural Water Association from June 1987, to March 1991. The Program Specialist is dually responsible for providing training and technical assistance to water systems. Clem was awarded the honor of "Training Specialist of the Year" by the NRWA in 1999.
