AMENDMENT TO APPLICATION

The Applicant, Louisville Gas and Electric Company, respectfully submits this amendment to its application as filed on February 10, 2004, by stating as follows:

Applicant acknowledges that it failed, through inadvertence and oversight, to comply with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 9 in failing to secure receipt of a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") from this Commission prior to bidding on the franchise proffered by the City of West Point, and thereafter executing a franchise agreement with the City. Applicant further acknowledges that as a result of such failure, the Commission has jurisdiction to institute a show cause proceeding. In an attempt to resolve this matter at a minimum cost to the Applicant, its ratepayers, and the Commonwealth in legal and related fees and expenses, Applicant proposes that a civil penalty of no more than \$500.00 be imposed by the Commission on Applicant.

Applicant respectfully requests, however, that payment of the penalty be suspended. Applicant's compliance record with all CCN regulatory requirements to date is unblemished. In light thereof, Applicant requests that payment of any penalty imposed be suspended for a reasonable period of time. If there are no similar violations during the period of suspension, then penalty should be waived.

WHEREFORE, Applicant respectfully requests that the Commission issue an order granting Applicant a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity authorizing Applicant's prior bid on the City's franchise and authorizing Applicant to effectuate its new franchise agreement with the City. A copy of the franchise agreement was filed previously with the Commission.
