MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION OF JUNE 2, 2006 ORDER

NuVox Communications, Inc. (including the former NewSouth Communications Corp.) ("NuVox"), by counsel, and pursuant to KRS § 278.400, hereby moves the Public Service Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky ("Commission") to reconsider and modify its order dated June 2, 2006 denying confidential treatment of certain documents. In support of its motion, NuVox states as follows.

NuVox requests that the Commission reconsider its decision with respect to the customer name and location only in documents NSC/NVX 000051-52. Pursuant to Section 222(c) of the Communications Act, as amended, every telecommunications carrier has an obligation to provide confidentiality with regard to the network information of its customers. NuVox seeks confidential treatment for the customer name and location in these two documents because they contain customer-specific information to which the customer has an expectation of privacy. Specifically, these two documents contain customer proprietary network information ("CPNI") which may only be disclosed as required by law or with the approval of the customer. *See* 47 U.S.C. 222(c).

CPNI is defined as:

[I]nformation that relates to the quantity, technical configuration, type, destination, location, and amount of use of a telecommunications service subscribed to by any customer of a telecommunications carrier, and that is made available to the carrier by the customer solely by virtue of the carrier-customer relationship.

47 U.S.C. 222(h). Documents NSC/NVX 000051-52 concern service requests by NewSouth Communications Corporation's customer. Information relating to the type of service received by a customer is CPNI within the meaning of the statute, and as such, is protected from disclosure.

Moreover, pursuant to KRS 61.878(1)(k), NSC/NVX 000051-52 are exempt from disclosure under the Open Records Act. The statue provides that "all public records or information the disclosure of which is prohibited by federal law or regulation" shall be subject to disclosure "<u>only</u> <u>upon order of a court of competent jurisdiction</u>." KRS 61.878(1)(k) (emphasis added). As explained above, NSC/NVX 000051-52 contain CPNI which is protected from disclosure pursuant to 47 U.S.C. 222(c). Therefore, these two documents are also exempt from disclosure under KRS 61.878(1)(k). In accordance with 807 KAR 5:001, Section 7, any document that is exempt from public disclosure pursuant to KRS 61.870 *et seq*. is entitled to confidential treatment by the Commission.

Accordingly, NuVox respectfully requests that the Commission reconsider its June 2, 2006 Order denying confidential treatment of these two documents, and order that the customer name and customer location only in documents NSC/NVX 000051-52 be afforded confidential treatment. The remainder of those two pages (with customer name and location redacted) and the other documents that were the subject of the Commission's June 2, 2006 order, may be made part of the public record with no objection from NuVox.
