Dear Mr. Dorman:

On November 10, 2004, the Water District received a Certificate of Service for our Phase I Water System Improvements & Extensions project, of which we are in the process of constructing. Due to the fact the we planned a two phased project, Condition No. 7 of the Order required that the District "make application with the Commission for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity when approval is necessary for Phase II of the project." We have reached that point and the necessary documents are being prepared to be submitted to your agency soon. The purpose of this correspondence is to request from your agency approval for an increase in our water rates as a part of the Phase II process. The increase is due to a series of events which consists of increased wholesale rates from all of our suppliers, the impact of the increase in petroleum prices which affects our pipe material prices, an increase in steel prices which affects nearly all of our material costs such as valves, fittings, and meter settings, and also a planned increase in operating costs so that we can maintain the required level of operation. Prior to the submission of the documents to your agency for the Phase I portion, we were aware that we would require a rate increase but at that time it was unknown as to the level of increase that would be needed. Since that time we have been informed by our wholesale water suppliers as to the amount of increase that has either occurred or will occur. This issue combined with our current knowledge of what we can expect as far as pipe and material cost increases, along with a defined plan for maintaining our operation, has allowed us to determine the level of rate increase we will need to apply to our consumers. The amount of increase requested can be found as a part of the application that is being prepared by Reed Law Office which serves as our bond council. Please note that the District's last retail rate increase occurred in August of 1992, and although we have worked to maintain those rates, we have finally reached a point where our rates must be adjusted in order for us to continue the required level of service.
