I strongly object to any person, utility poles or wires be put on my property and have instructed my nephew to allow no one to conduct a survey or proceed in any manner with the project. The property is posted "No Trespassing" and it will be strictly enforced.

I have contacted a long time friend of mine, Honorable Judge Jenkins, of Spencer County, as to my concerns. I am confident that you could contact David Jenkins as to my willingness to go to any extent to prevent this outrageous invasion of my property that has been in the family for generations.

In conclusion, I will intervene in this project in local, state and federal courts if it becomes necessary. Is there really a price one can put on destroying property that a lifetime of work went into.
