## ANSWER OF KENTUCKY UTILITIES COMPANY

In accordance with the Kentucky Public Service Commission's ("Commission") Order of December 22, 2004, in the above-captioned proceeding, Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU") respectfully submits this Answer to the Complaint of Robert T. Gallagher ("Mr. Gallagher") filed on November 15, 2004. In support of its Answer, and in response to the specific averments contained in Mr. Gallagher's Complaint, KU states as follows:

1. KU admits the allegations contained in paragraphs (a) and (b) of the Complaint.
2. With respect to the allegations contained in paragraph (c) of the Complaint concerning electric service to the address at 121 Johnston Blvd, KU states that Original Sheet No. 87 of KU's electric tariff provides that "deposits will be required from all customers not meeting satisfactory credit and payment criteria." Further, KU's electric tariff, at Original Sheet No. 87, expressly states that residential customers will pay a deposit in the amount of $\$ 115.00$. On September 7, 2004, Mr. Gallagher's account was disconnected for nonpayment. Consequently, Mr. Gallagher has not maintained a satisfactory payment history, and therefore, a deposit is appropriate. Because Mr. Gallagher only had a $\$ 50.00$ deposit on his account, an
additional $\$ 65$ deposit was necessary. Pursuant to KRS $278.160, \mathrm{KU}$ is prohibited from charging any person "a greater or less compensation for any service rendered or to be rendered than that prescribed in its filed schedules." As a result, Mr. Gallagher was properly assessed an additional $\$ 65.00$ charge for his deposit.
3. KU denies all allegations in the Complaint which are not expressly admitted in the foregoing paragraphs of this Answer.

## FIRST AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSE

The Complainant fails to set forth any claim upon which relief can be granted by this Commission and, therefore, should be dismissed.

## SECOND AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSE

Complainant has failed to set forth a prima facie case that KU has violated its tariff or any Commission statute or regulation, and the Complaint should be dismissed for that reason.

WHEREFORE, for all of the reasons set forth above, Kentucky Utilities Company respectfully requests:
(1) that the Complaint herein be dismissed without further action being taken by the Commission;
(2) that this matter be closed on the Commission's docket; and
(3) that KU be afforded any and all other relief to which it may be entitled.
