Dear Ms. O'Donnell:

On Thursday, November 17, 2005, I received the Commission's Notice of Informal Conference scheduling a settlement and planning meeting for November 29, 2005 at 1:00 p.m. EST, and requesting briefing on Intervenor Major Jeffrey Stevens's rights under the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act of 2004 ("SCRA").

Due to other work obligations, I was unable to turn my full attention to the Notice until Sunday, November 20. After researching the detailed requirements of the SCRA, I realized that I needed to contact Major Stevens immediately to obtain a statement from his commanding officer. See 50 App. U.S.C.A. § 522(b)(2)(B). Therefore, this morning I telephoned my contact for Major Stevens and requested that she help me reach him so that he could obtain the necessary statement. After contacting Major Stevens's mother, we learned that the Major's battalion had returned to the United States on November 8. After several days of debriefing and transition exercises at a military base in Indiana, Major Stevens returned home to Kentucky last week. I spoke to Major Stevens late this morning, and he informed me that his battalion is not under any orders to re-deploy overseas. While troop rotation is somewhat uncertain, he hopes to remain home for at least the next year. Therefore, I do not believe that Major Stevens will need any relief under the SCRA at this time.

Shortly after speaking to Major Stevens, I contacted Brent Rice, counsel for Cellco Partnership, to inform him of Major Stevens's return to the United States. I hoped that my email would alleviate the need for Mr. Rice to spend unnecessary time on briefing any SCRA issues. Unfortunately, Mr. Rice already had written and submitted materials in response to your Notice.

In my communication to Mr. Rice, I also informed him that I planned to request from you that I be permitted to participate in the November 29 informal conference by telephone, rather than in person, because I have a previously scheduled deposition preparation session for

that day in Cincinnati. I would, of course, be prepared and authorized to discuss potential resolution of the matter and, if resolution is impossible, to discuss issues for hearing, witnesses, stipulations, et cetera. Alternatively, if the Commission has video-conferencing equipment, I could participate that way from my law firm.

Mr. Rice is understandably frustrated by the fact that I did not learn of Major Stevens's return to the United States until this morning and that he, consequently, unnecessarily spent time briefing the SCRA issues. Although I apologized to Mr. Rice and tried to explain the circumstances, he is not inclined to support my request to participate in the November 29 meeting by phone. (See attached email exchange between Brent Rice and Rachael Rowe.) Nevertheless, I respectfully request that you permit me to participate by telephone or video-conference in light of the facts that (1) this is an informal conference and (2) I had a previously scheduled meeting in Cincinnati on November 29.

Thank you for your consideration.

Brent: I apologize for the delay. I did not know that Major Stevens had returned until this morning. Although the Notice went out on the 14th, I did not receive it until the 17th. I had co-counsel in town from Callfornia, Atlanta and Washington on Thursday and Friday for deposition preparation and did not have a chance to turn to the Notice until the weekend.

I began to work on the brief this morning and realized that I would need a statement from the Major's commanding officer to comply with the SCRA. I telephoned my contact for Major Stevens, who called the Major's mother and thereby found out that he had returned home. As you can imagine, when one has been overseas in the military under very stressful conditions, his or her first priority on return is reconnecting with immediate family. Major Stevens has a daughter who is a freshman in college at EKU and since his return to Kentucky last week has been spending as much time with her and the rest of his family as possible, and has been getting readjusted to life at his own home in the states.

While I apologize for the inconvenience, under the circumstances, I do not know what else I might have done. I let you know within two hours of finding out myself (for the precise purpose of saving you from having to do unnecessary work). Be that as it may, I will make the request to the Commission and let it know that you are not amenable to me not being there live. If necessary, I will send one of my Kentucky-licensed colleagues in my place.

Brent: I received from the Commission a notice of informal conference and direction for

us to brief the commission on Major Stevens's rights under the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act of 2004 ("SCRA"). Consistent with my earlier communications, Major Stevens battalion returned to the United States on November 8, and after a week of debrief and transition at a base in Indiana, he now has returned to Rockcastle County. I spoke to him this morning, and he does not currently have, nor does he anticipate, any immediate orders to ship out of the country again. So, I do not think he will need any relief under the SCRA. I wanted to let you know ASAP so that you do not waste any time briefing the issue. I will send a letter to the Commission, with a cc to you, informing Ms. O'Donnell of this development.

Also, unless you object, I plan to request that I be permitted to participate in the informal conference by phone. I am scheduled to be in deposition preparation in Cincinnati on the 29th. Do you have any objection to this?
