The last communication we received with regard to our complaint was a letter from Ogden, Newell & Welch, a law firm representing Kentucky Utilities, dated May 9, 2005. The letter in brief states that Kentucky Utilities did nothing wrong and the rates charged are legal according to what the Public Service Commission has approved. They requested that the Public Service Commissions close our complaint.

Ogden, Newell & Welch states that they have no knowledge of our landscaping or retaining wall. Of course, neither Kentucky Utilities or their legal firm would take the time to investigate our complaint. We are enclosing a picture of our garage, landscaping and retaining wall. We are also enclosing a picture of our next door neighbors detached garage, which also has a separate meter. Their home was built shortly before ours. Could it be that they were also given the same erroneous information regarding placement of meters?

I suspect that if a computer analysis was done of all GS-General Service bills in our area, that there would be many people that are being charged this erroneous charge. We do not agree with the conclusion reached by the legal firm of Ogden, Newell & Welch. This is an unfair rate to be charged for a residential garage.

Since we have never received any communication from you or the Public Service Commission, does this mean that you agree with Kentucky Utilities conclusion and have closed your investigation of our case?
