## INTRA-AGENCY MEMORANDUM KENTUCKY PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

**RE:** Informal Conference of July 27, 2005

On July 27, 2005, representatives of Columbia Gas of Kentucky, Inc. ("Columbia") and Commission Staff ("Staff") met at the Commission's offices to discuss Columbia's application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct a 7-mile, 12-inch pipeline in Georgetown, Kentucky. A list of attendees is attached to this memorandum.

Staff began the discussions by asking Columbia to expand on how the proposed construction project was responsive to the Liberty Consulting Group's ("Liberty") audit recommendations. Columbia explained that Liberty had stated that Columbia took too great a risk in its planning to meet peak day criteria. Columbia stated that it conducted a study and determined that it should adjust its risk from 1 in 10 to 1 in 20 and explained that the proposed pipeline would permit it to achieve this reduced risk level. Columbia agreed to submit its expanded explanation in writing for the record.

Columbia and Staff then discussed issues raised by the information requests and the technical and financial issues related to construction of the proposed pipeline. The parties discussed various aspects of safety issues and possible alternatives. Staff asked if Columbia considered installing an automatic shutoff valve in place of valve No. 1 upstream of I-75. Columbia explained that the pipeline will be constructed in compliance with the applicable regulations.

Staff asked if a *smart pig* would be launched on the 12-inch pipeline from Lake Carnico to Frankfort to monitor the integrity of the pipeline after mechanical completion of the proposed pipeline. Columbia explained that *smart pig* launching was not going to be performed at the time of completion, but would be in place for the future.

Staff then requested clarification of whether the pipeline is based on a Class 4 design, rather than Class 3 as stated in its application. Columbia explained that the route of the pipeline changed after the application had been prepared and that the new route resulted in a change in the design from Class 3 to Class 4. Columbia stated that it failed to make the correction in the application. It agreed to file a correction for the record.

Columbia confirmed that its plans include the installation of a pressure regulating station at the DKT pipeline to reduce the pressure from 720 psig to 250 psig and that the 250 psig pressure at DKT pipeline will meet its 1 in 20 risk level. Columbia also confirmed that a regulating pressure station will be installed to reduce the pressure at the DE pipeline to its MAOP of 720 psig. In response to Staff's questions, Columbia explained that the crossing at Elkhorn Creek will be made by an open trench crossing and not by directional boring or insertion through casing.

The informal conference was then adjourned.
