NOT A COMPLAINT

COMES NOW WALTER CALLIHAN AND REFERS
TO A LETTER WRITTEN TO GLENN COPPEE DATED
APRIL 28, 2006. FROM CAROL HALL FRALEY CEO
OF GRAYSON RURAL ELECTRIC CORPORATION.

MRS. FRALEY AGREES TO SELL ELECTRICITY TO
GLENN COPPEE, IF GLENN COPPEE WILL PAY AN ALLEGED
BILL THAT ALLEGEDLY WALTER CALLIHAN OWES.

PLEASE NOTE THAT IN MRS. FRALEY'S OFFER
TO SELL TO GLENN COPPEE ELECTRICAL POWER THAT
WOULD MAKE MR. COPPEE A MIDDLE MAN BROKER
IN ELECTRICITY THAT SHE WOULD CHARGE
GLENN COPPEE A CERTAIN RATE OR KILOWATT
HOURS COPPEE COULD SELL CALLIHAN ELECTRICAL
POWER AT THE RATE HE WANTED TO CHARGE HIM.

REMEMBER MR. COPPEE HAS NO MEANS TO
DELIVER ELECTRICAL SERVICE TO MR. CALLIHAN AND
HE WOULD NOT BE CONTROLLED BY ANYONE AT

THE RATES HE WOULD CHOOSE TO CHARGE TO CALLHAN.

THIS IS AN UNORTHODOX SYSTEM THAT MS. FRAYLEY HAS PROPOSED TO MR. COFFEY.

NUMBER ONE:

HER PROPOSAL IN ESSENCE HAS DECIDED THAT GRAYSON RURAL ELECTRIC WILL NEVER SELL TO WALTER CALLIHAN ELECTRICITY. THAT IS A MONOPOLY AT WORK, AND DISCRIMINATION IN THE WORST FORM.

KENTUCKY LAW CLEARLY STATES, THAT THE KENTUCKY PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION IS CHARGED WITH THE RESPONSIBILITY TO SEE THAT EVERYONE IS PROVIDED ELECTRICITY. AND GRAYSON'S GEOGRAPHIC BOUNDARIES PROTECTS GRAYSON FROM ANY OTHER COMPETITORS INFRINGING UPON GRAYSON'S RIGHT TO GRAYSON'S TERRITORY.

IT IS MY UNDERSTANDING THAT THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION INTENDS TO TAKE DEPOSITIONS AND IF THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION HAS NO AUTHORITY TO REGULATE GRAYSON WITH WHOM SHE WANTS TO SELL, AND TO TAKE DEPOSITIONS AFTER SAID LETTER WOULD BE MOST AND AFTER THE FACT.

IT IS EVIDENCED BY FRAYLEY'S LETTER, THAT SHE NEVER INTENDS TO SELL WALTER CALLIHAN ELECTRICITY UNDER ANY CONDITIONS AND UNDER THOSE CONDITIONS - TAKING DEPOSITIONS WOULD BE USELESS IF THE

PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION LACKS JURISDICTION TO ORDER GRAYSON RURAL ELECTRIC TO SELL ELECTRICITY TO WALTER CALLAHAN - BUT THE KENTUCKY PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION DOES HAVE JURISDICTION TO OPEN UP GRAYSON'S BOUNDARIES TO COMPETITION TO BREAK THEIR MONOPOLY.

I WOULD STRONGLY SUGGEST THAT THE LEGAL DEPT THAT REPRESENT THE KENTUCKY PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION TO RETAIN LEGAL COUNCIL WITH A TEAM OF WELL TRAINED SMART LAWYERS - SO THEY CAN EXPLAIN TO THE COMMISSION'S LEGAL COUNCIL - WHAT THE COMMISSION'S LIABILITIES ARE.
