RE: Adjustment of Wholesale Rates

City of Versailles, Kentucky

On January 12, 2006, an informal conference was held pursuant to an Order of the Commission. The names of those participating in the meeting are shown on the attached sign-in sheet.

After a discussion of the procedure of the conference, Commission Staff pointed out to the City of Versailles ("Versailles") the answers that were not responsive to Staff's information request. Staff explained to Versailles that it must supply the data to substantiate the requested rate adjustment and that those responses must be in a verified form, since that is Versailles's proof and would be subject to cross-examination at any hearing. Staff emphasized that Versailles must provide the facts and figures to show how much revenue it forecasts to meet the debit requirements. Versailles's position is that improvements to its system benefit all customers, including wholesale customers, and that the cost is reflected in the series of bond issues used to fund the entire improvement campaign.

The test-period information filed by Versailles was discussed. Staff advised that the test period is required to be a full 12-month period. Staff further advised that Versailles should supply the fiscal 2005 figures as used in its audit of the water system.

Next there was a discussion of the approved rate contained in the information provided by Versailles and the wholesale rate contained in its tariff approved by the Commission.

Commission Staff will correspond with Versailles and outline the areas that Versailles needs to supplement in its response. Based upon this response, new dates for the procedural schedule will be considered.

The meeting was adjourned.
