SUBJECT: January 30, 2006 Telephonic Conference

An informal conference held January 30, 2006 was attended by representatives of Columbia Gas of Kentucky, Inc. ("Columbia"), the Community Action Council for Lexington-Fayette, Bourbon, Harrison and Nicholas Counties, Inc. ("CAC") the Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Kentucky ("AG") and Commission Staff ("Staff"). The purpose of the conference was to discuss issues regarding Columbia's proposed allocation of excess revenues accumulated in the Revenue/Stranded Cost Recovery Pool established for its Customer Choice Program. The conference was scheduled in response to CAC's request. A list of the persons attending is attached hereto.

CAC commented on its understanding of the primary and alternative proposals included in Columbia's application. It also discussed possible uses of funds that could be allocated to low-income customers under the alternative proposal. CAC emphasized that, even with the added funds recently approved by both state and local governments, there remained a need for additional low-income assistance. According to CAC, the greatest benefit is from installing a high efficiency furnace along with weatherization which provides net benefit of about \$2,835 per household.

CAC stated that a customer refund under Columbia's proposal will be so small as to barely be noticed. Depending on the percentage refunded, the amount would likely be only \$10 - \$20. Per CAC, the alternative proposal would serve approximately 119 low-income households, less than 1% of the estimated 22,000 low-income households potentially eligible in Columbia's service area. CAC stated that a primary concern is the 850 participants in Columbia's Energy Assistance Program and that assisting all 850 would require roughly \$2.5 million.

Columbia expressed satisfaction with how CAC has administered the Energy Assistance Program since its implementation several years ago. It also expressed confidence in CAC's ability to adequately distribute any additional funds that might be approved under its alternative proposal in this case.

Columbia, CAC and the AG then privately discussed various issues in this case, without Staff present. The parties agreed to continue discussions after the conference and to update Staff on those discussions via e-mail. The parties were reminded by Staff that any agreement or stipulation they might reach would need to address the issue of why the allocation of excess revenues in the Revenue/Stranded Cost Recovery Pool should be modified from what the Commission approved in Case No. 1999-00165, when it originally authorized the Customer Choice Program.

It was reiterated that February 7, 2006 was the due date for filing a request for formal hearing, or in the alternative, written comments. The parties were also reminded that this memorandum would be prepared and filed in the record of the case. After that, the conference was adjourned.
