1. Refer to the Cost Justification pages for the 5/8 Inch and 3/4 Inch Meter Size filed with application. The Total Connection Expense justified is \$511.25, however the requested charge sought by Magoffin County is \$400. Explain why the charge sought is less than the charge justified. Provide all documentation to explain the difference.

The Magoffin County Water District Commissioners voted to not raise the present Water Tap fee to no more than \$400. The backhoe and other equipment will be tied up on each meter site more than 4 hours but may not actually be used more than 2 hours. Many of the customers cannot afford to pay \$400. They have to make payments. The Water District got a grant that paid for the backhoe and the cost per meter setting should be less. The Commissioners did not want to raise the Tap Fee but they agreed to raise the Fee to \$400.

Bill May, County Judge Executive is trying to get coal severance money and CDBG funds for approximately 15.0 miles of water line extensions for our Water District. Ninety percent of the people in Magoffin County have rural water.
