Pursuant to KRS 278.020, 807 KAR 5:001, Sections 8 and 9, and the Commission's Order dated January 31, 2002 and Commission's Order dated December 22, 2005 in *In the Matter of Adjustment of Gas Rates of The Union Light, Heat and Power Company*, Case No. 2005-00042, The Union Light, Heat and Power Company (ULH&P) respectfully states as follows:

- 1. ULH&P previously filed an application for a certificate for public convenience and necessity in this matter. This filing is intended to respond to the filing deficiency in that application addressed in a letter from the Commission dated March 16, 2006. This filing supplements the application by providing additional information regarding the estimated cost of operation after the proposed facilities are completed.
- 2. The main replacement work is being performed as part of ULH&P's Accelerated Main Replacement Program. In Case No. 2001-00092, 2004-00017 and 2005-00094, the Commission approved Rider AMRP as an annual adjustment to allow ULH&P to recover the costs of replacing its cast iron and bare steel mains on an accelerated basis,

including the cost of recovering customer-owned service lines connected to such mains.

3. ULH&P expects that its estimated cost of operation and maintenance will decrease after the proposed facilities are completed because the cast iron and bare steel lines are being replaced with plastic lines, which have a lower leak rate. In fact, ULH&P passes such O&M savings to customers as part of the annual Rider AMRP rate adjustment.

WHEREFORE, ULH&P respectfully requests that the Commission issue a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity pursuant to KRS 278.020(1) for the above-described construction as requested in the application herein.
