# RESPONSE OF PEAKS MILL WATER DISTRICT TO COMMISSION STAFF'S FIRST DATA REQUEST

Peaks Mill Water District ("Peaks Mill"), by counsel, for its Response to Commission Staff's First Data Request, states as follows:

- 1. Refer to Exhibit 15 of the application filed on March 31, 2006. In the project description for Phase II, there is a list of several roads along which the 6-inch water mains are to be installed in Franklin County. Then there is a listing of Kay's Branch Road in Owen County. In relation to the Kay's Branch Road part of Phase II, answer the following:
  - a. Is Kay's Branch Road in Owen County, Kentucky?Response: Yes.
- b. How far do you intend to extend service along Kay's Branch Road in Owen County?

Response: Pursuant to the certificate of public convenience and necessity requested in this docket, Peaks Mill will extend service approximately

3,000 feet along Kay's Branch Road. Peaks Mill intends ultimately to extend service along the entire length of Kay's Branch Road, as it is within the area in Owen County that was annexed and made part of Peaks Mill's territory, pursuant to KRS 74.115, by Order of Owen County Judge/Executive Billy O'Banion.

c. How many customers do you anticipate providing service for in Owen County?

Response: The current project for which a certificate of public convenience and necessity is requested will serve seven (7) customers in Peaks Mill's Owen County territory. Peaks Mill anticipates that it will ultimately provide service to approximately 37 customers within Peaks Mill's territory in Owen County.

d. Will these customers' meters be set in Owen County? If no, where will they be set?

Response: Yes.

2. In Case No. 2005-00437,<sup>1</sup> in which Peaks Mill was Defendant, Peaks Mill denied service to the Complainant in an undated letter signed by Lowell W. Clark, Secretary of Peaks Mill. In that letter Peaks Mill stated as one of its reasons for denial of service that the Complainant's property was located outside of the district boundary. Assuming your response to 1(a) above is yes, explain why Peaks Mill now seeks to serve outside its district boundary.

Response: In serving the subject portion of Owen County Peaks Mill will not serve outside its district boundary, as the territory in question was annexed to Peaks Mill on February 14, 2006. On November 28, 2005, two residents of Owen

County, Kentucky, petitioned Peaks Mill Water District in writing to annex a certain portion of Owen County for the purpose of providing water service to their currently unserved area. See Exhibit 1, attached hereto. The petition was submitted pursuant to KRS 74.115(1) which provides that "two (2) or more freeholders in a county or counties adjacent to a county containing a water district" may submit a petition requesting service to the area. The statute further provides that, after receiving a request from two freeholders, the water district may petition the county judge/executive of the adjoining county to add the area that is the subject of the freeholders' petition to the water district's territory. Peaks Mill submitted such a petition to Owen County Judge/Executive Billy O'Banion on December 5, 2005. See Exhibit 2 hereto. After publication of the proposal to annex the Owen County territory into Peaks Mill's district and a hearing during which no objections were made, see Exhibits 3 [notice] and 4 [minutes of hearing], County Judge/Executive O'Banion entered an Order declaring certain territory in Owen County, which includes Kay's Branch Road, to be annexed as territory of Peaks Mill. See Exhibit 5.

3. Explain the criteria that Peaks Mill employs to determine if it should or should not serve customers outside its district boundary.

Response: The area in Owen County to be served pursuant to the application in this case is within Peaks Mill's boundary pursuant to Judge/Executive O'Banion's Order of February 14, 2006. The decision to pursue annexation was based upon requests received at Peaks Mill Commission meetings from several citizens in the affected area. In addition, before Peaks Mill requested annexation or

began plans to construct lines to serve the area, Peaks Mill was notified that it will receive a KIA grant of \$893,000 that will enable it to serve the area. See Exhibit 6. Peaks Mill further notes that the Owen County project was approved by the Area Water Management Planning Council on February 9, 2004, as is demonstrated by the project profile submitted by the Northern Kentucky Area Development District. See Exhibit 7. The extension will connect two dead ends of Peaks Mill's line in Franklin County, thereby creating a loop that will improve system hydraulics for Peaks Mill's Franklin County customers. The extension is a reasonable, cost-effective one that will serve citizens whose cisterns are approximately 80% contaminated [Exhibit 7, at 5] and whose area is served by no other water utility.

4. Who authorized Peaks Mill to serve customers in Owen County?

Response: Owen County Judge/Executive O'Banion issued the Order authorizing Peaks Mill to serve customers in the area of Owen County for which a certificate of public convenience and necessity is requested in this docket. *See* Exhibit 5 hereto. There has been no blanket authorization given to Peaks Mill to serve all of Owen County.



Dear Judge O'Banion:

Please be advised that this is a petition, pursuant to KRS 74.115 and pursuant to resolution of the Board of Commissioners of Peaks Mill Water District ("Peaks Mill"), to serve certain territory in Owen County (the "Proposed Service Area"), as follows:

Beginning at a point in the Owen County/Franklin County line, said point being at the juncture with Scott County; thence in a northwesterly direction approximately 5.2 miles to a point, said point being 0.7 miles due north of the intersection of Cedar Creek and Indian Creek; thence continuing due west a distance of approximately 1.3 miles to a point in the center of Cedar Creek; thence continuing southwest to a point in the intersection of U.S. 127 and KY 368, a distance of approximately 0.4 miles; thence due south a distance of approximately 2.25 miles to a point in the boundary line between Owen and Franklin Counties; thence continuing east along said boundary line approximately 6.5 miles to the point of beginning.

Pursuant to KRS 74.115, two freeholders in the Proposed Service Area formally requested, by letter dated November 28, 2005 and attached hereto, that Peaks Mill extend its service area to include the Proposed Service Area. The Board of Commissioners has considered the request and has agreed to grant the request, contingent upon your order approving. It is the understanding of Peaks Mill's Board of Commissioners that no other water utility is available to offer service in the Proposed Service Area.



Dear Mr. Gatewood:

Congratulations on the grant you received from Governor Ernie Fletcher and the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky awarded during the 2005 Legislative Session. You are strongly encouraged to view these funds as "seed" money and to match these dollars with other funding sources in order to realize the maximum benefit from your grant award. The Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) is pleased to have been designated as the agency for administration of these infrastructure project grants. In an effort to ensure that your community receives the level of support it deserves, language was included in the 2005 Budget of the Commonwealth to provide 0.5% of each grant as an administrative fee to KIA.

To make this a successful grant process, KIA wants to update you on some important timing issues with respect to funding and administration.

First, your grant funds will be available some time after August 1, 2005. We are working with the State Budget Director's Office to determine the precise date of availability. When the grant funds become available, you must have a fully executed grant assistance agreement and your project must meet all grant requirements and be reviewed by the Capital Projects and Bond Oversight Committee before funds can be released. Primary requirements are discussed in the next paragraph. Detailed requirements will be provided to your Project Administrator. Special consideration will be given to projects needing attention prior to August 1, 2005.

Second, if your project is ready to go, do not stop progress if you have interim funding available. Your grant funds will still be available even if you have started your project. However, the expenditure of all project funds must comply with appropriate procurement process and the project must conform to the budget and grant requirements, be approved by the Area Water Management Council and endorsed by the Kentucky e-Clearinghouse. We will work with your designated project administrator to make sure all conditions necessary for reimbursement are satisfied.

#### Third, we need your help. KIA needs to know:

- A. Your designee for Project Administrator to work with KIA and be responsible for completion of all of the grant documentation and requirements. Your Project Administrator will be responsible for coordinating proper procurement of all necessary contracts and for completing all requirements of the grant. Please be assured that you will be copied on all essential correspondence and consulted on all decisions regarding your grant. Exhibit 1.
- B. Your project's WX or SX number. Having this project identifying number will assure that you have coordinated with your Area Water Management Council and your project meets the budget requirements. If your grant award is not yet linked to a project profile with a WX or SX number, it is critical that you contact your Area Water Management Council very soon to get a project designated. If you plan on using your grant funds for more than one project, each project will need a WX or SX number. Exhibit 2.

Please fill out the attached Exhibits and return to KIA by Wednesday, June 1, 2005. As soon as we receive your designation for Project Administrator, we will be in direct contact with that person regarding the specific requirements and the steps involved in accessing your grant funds. There will a workshop held in the near future to discuss all required grant documentation, so it is important that we receive your response as soon as possible.

Again, we are pleased to be a part of this important effort to improve infrastructure for citizens throughout the Commonwealth. We pledge our full cooperation and look forward to working with you and your Project Administrator in the coming months.




