ORDER

Grayson County Water District ("Grayson District") has moved to reopen Case No. 2005-00358¹ to modify the Commission's Order of September 29, 2005 to reflect revisions in the terms of an agreement between Grayson District and Rural Development regarding a construction project.² More specifically, Grayson District seeks Commission authorization to adjust its rates for water service to comply with the provisions in its revised agreement with Rural Development, an agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Grayson District has entered into an agreement with Rural Development to finance the construction of a \$2.5 million waterworks improvement project. This project involves the construction of 6 miles of 8-inch and 6-inch water mains; a booster pumping station; a 500,000-gallon ground water storage tank; a 500,000-gallon

elevated water storage tank; a 100,000-gallon ground water storage tank; and related appurtenances.

The project will be financed through the issuance of Water System Revenue Bonds to Rural Development in the amount of \$1,350,000; a grant of \$650,000 from Rural Development; a grant of \$400,000 from the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority; and applicant contributions of \$100,000.

On September 29, 2005, the Commission issued a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Grayson District for the proposed water improvements project³ and authorized the issuance of Water System Revenue Bonds. On August 29, 2006, Rural Development amended its original Letter of Conditions to require adjustments in Grayson District's rates to ensure sufficient revenues to cover the water district's increased operation and maintenance expenses and debt service requirements. On October 16, 2006, Rural Development issued a second amendment that corrected certain errors in its initial amendment and required a different schedule of rates.⁴

Grayson District's present application was made pursuant to KRS 278.023, which requires the Commission to accept agreements between water utilities and the U.S.

Grayson District is required to meet all conditions in the Letter of Conditions, including any amendments, for the financing agreement to close.

Department of Agriculture and to issue the necessary orders to implement the terms of such agreements within 30 days of satisfactory completion of minimum filing requirements. Given that the minimum filing requirements were met on October 23, 2006,⁵ KRS 278.023 does not grant the Commission any discretionary authority to modify or reject any portion of this agreement.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. The record of Case No. 2006-00435 is incorporated by reference into the record of this proceeding.
- 2. The rates set forth in Appendix A to this Order are approved for service that Grayson District renders on and after the date of this Order.
- 3. Within 30 days of the date of this Order, Grayson District shall file with the Commission its revised tariff sheets setting out the rates approved in this Order.

As the rates set forth in the Second Amendment do not differ significantly from those in the First Amendment, the Commission finds that Grayson District has substantially complied with the requirements of Administrative Regulation 807 KAR 5:069, Section 2.
