Dear Mr. Goss and Mr. Clay:

I live in Franklin County and have owned hill farm property in Franklin and Owen Counties since 1980. I have attended several of the public hearings about the proposed pipeline, and have followed with great interest the proceedings which began on November 26. I do not live on the Kentucky American Water proposed pipeline route, however, the route that I drive to and from Frankfort to work follows route 1262 through Peaks Mill Valley and along the wild and beautiful Elkhorn Creek basin. The landscape along this route is incredibly lovely. The landscape varies from rich bottomland that is under production, to rocky hillsides, palisades and woods full of wildlife and native plants that have been left as yet undisturbed.

I urge you, Mr. Goss and Mr. Clay, to take a drive along the entire length of the proposed pipeline route, from Owen County to Ironworks Pike, before you make your final decision in this case. I pray that you will recognize the unique fragile beauty of this area and that you will see the necessity of preserving it for our future generations. Please deny the Kentucky American Water Company this pipeline proposal and save our land.
