I am a Franklin County resident and farm owner whose property is scheduled for a massive invasion from the KAW pipeline on two entire sides, essentially shutting down my business operation of raising, training, and breeding horses, hay production, and affecting the operation of our Kentucky Department of Agriculture approved CEM quarantine facility for imported mares and stallions. Business aside, the low forested land where the Buck Run Creek travels through my property and wildlife abounds, will be destroyed as we know it. Needless to say, I am not happy about how this planned pipeline will directly impact my beautiful land and our daily lives.

I fully understand the concept of eminent domain and have a guarded respect for its use when appropriate. I also understand how important it is for Central Kentucky citizens to have dependable, affordable water.
