LOUISVILLE WATER COMPANY'S MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Louisville Water Company ("LWC"), by counsel, hereby moves the Public Service Commission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky (the "Commission") for a short extension of time within which to files its amended responses to initial Data Request Nos. 15, 46 and 117 of Kentucky-American Water Company ("KAWC").

In support of its motion, LWC states that the Commission's October 24, 2007 order (the "Order") compelled LWC to produce additional documentation in response to initial Data Request Nos. 15, 27, 46, 53, 68, and 117. With respect to the additional production required for Request Nos. 15, 27, 53, and 68, the Commission ordered LWC to provide the additional information no later than Monday, October 29, 2007. The Order did not specify a date by which LWC was required to produce the information required with respect to Request Nos. 46 and 117. LWC believed this discrepancy in the Order was intentional, as Request Nos. 46 and 117 concern matters that will require voluminous amounts of document retrieval, review, and reproduction.

On Friday, October 26, LWC was attempting to complete its responses to the 108 (not counting subparts) supplemental data requests it received on October 15. Those responses were due on Monday, October 29, 2007. LWC was simultaneously attempting to complete its responses to the additional data requests the Commission had ordered be amended by that same date. (See Order at

5-6.) The Friday afternoon before those responses and amended responses were due, the Commission informed LWC that it would be issuing an order ("Supplemental Order") requiring LWC to amend its responses to KAWC initial Request Nos. 46 and 117, too. The Commission informed LWC at that time that the responses to initial Request Nos. 46 and 117 would also be due just one business day later on Monday, October 29, 2007.

In addition to attempting to complete its other work (including the preparation of an amended response to Request No. 15, which requires a search of LWC's email system and the review of a significant number of emails among a number of individual employees at LWC), LWC began work retrieving and reviewing the additional documentation to be required by the Supplemental Order. As with LWC's response to Request No. 15, LWC's responses to Request Nos. 46 and 117 require a significant research and review of internal correspondence and email (Request 117), as well as a detailed analysis of historical project files (Request 46). As a result of the extensive amount of work associated with these obligations, LWC is unable to respond to KAWC initial Request Nos. 15, 46 and 117 by Monday, October 29, 2007. LWC continues to work diligently to respond to these requests as soon as possible, and it will be able to do so no later than Monday, November 5, 2007.

KAWC and the other parties will not be harmed by this short extension of time, as any remaining testimony is not due until Tuesday, November 13, 2007. The hearing is two weeks beyond that date. As KAWC has previously claimed, "the only formal proposal in this case is [KAWC]'s, and this case is for consideration of that proposal." (KAWC Response to LWC Motion for Informal Conference(s) at 1.) In any event, an LWC production in response to those requests

¹ Although LWC has not yet completed its review of internal documentation with respect to Request No. 15, it has produced those responsive documents that it has been able to locate and review by today. Nevertheless, LWC has included its response to this request within the scope of this motion because it anticipates the potential for producing additional documents as it completes its review of potentially responsive documents.

will still permit KAWC (as the movant) and the parties over a week to review this additional information before KAWC's final rebuttal testimony is due. Accordingly, LWC respectfully requests that the Commission grant it until Monday, November 5, 2007 to respond to KAWC initial Request Nos. 15, 46 and 117.
