I feel that construction of a new water treatment plant on the Kentucky River in Owen County is the best solution for supplying Lexington and the surrounding counties with a dependable and cost-effective water supply for the long term. The plant would be located in the pool created by Dam #3 and the present plant is in the pool created by Dam #9. The proposed location would have 6 additional pools for water supply.

This location would allow members of the Bluegrass Water Supply Commission to purchase a portion of the facilities if they can raise the necessary funds. If funds cannot be obtained, the surrounding counties would have the option to purchase water from the facility in times of need.

I feel that Lexington should not be dependent on purchasing water from the Louisville Water Company and should not be dependent upon using a pipe line that belongs to another entity. In regard to costs, the Louisville water deserves a profit for their effort and the Lexington Water Company also deserves a profit on the cost of the Louisville water and a double profit does not seem to be good for the Lexington consumers.
