ORDER

Complainant, Donald G. Simpson, brought this action against Defendant, Louisville Gas and Electric Company ("LG&E"), on May 31, 2007, claiming that LG&E failed to disconnect electric service to his apartment unit while Simpson was serving a prison term. Simpson maintained that he had a friend contact LG&E in November 2004 shortly after he was sentenced to discontinue electric service. Simpson alleged, however, that LG&E failed to disconnect his electric service until May 2005 thus incurring an outstanding balance of \$192 on his account.

LG&E filed its Answer to the Complaint on June 28, 2007, and moved the Commission to dismiss the complaint for failure to state a claim upon which the Commission may grant relief. Defendant asserted that Simpson failed to set forth a valid claim that LG&E had violated its tariff or statute or Commission regulation.

Complainant may file with the Commission, within 15 days of the date of this Order, a written response to Defendant's Motion to Dismiss, addressing the issues

raised therein. If Complainant does not file a response, the matter will stand submitted on LG&E's motion to dismiss. LG&E shall file its reply, if any, no later than 10 days thereafter.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. Complainant, Donald G. Simpson, is hereby authorized to submit a written response to Defendant's Motion to Dismiss within 15 days of the date of this Order.
 - 2. Any reply to the response shall be filed no later than 10 days thereafter.
