Our farm is across the road from the proposed site and I invite you to visit our home and look out of any window and envision what has transpired over these hills. Our home was used as a hospital during the battle of Ferrysville. Blood stains remain in the wood floors as does a bullet embedded in a door. One can imagine that the fighting did not stop even when the wounded and dying were tended. At present we are aware of at least 360 graves in our front yard.

There is an ongoing study of this  
by the University of Kentucky.

To think that the beauty of this  
pristine farm land can be polluted  
by an unnecessary tower. We are  
losing so much of our heritage to  
ugly technology that could be  
placed in an area that would not  
reproduce a historically significant  
area
