STATUS REPORT OF BRANDENBURG TELEPHONE COMPANY

Brandenburg Telephone Company ("Brandenburg Telephone"), by counsel, hereby submits its status report as required by the Public Service Commission's (the "Commission's") order of December 31, 2008 (the "Order").

REPORT

In its December 31, 2008 order, the Commission ordered the parties to file a status report addressing: (1) the parties' ongoing negotiations to resolve this complaint; and (2) whether a hearing should be scheduled within 60 days.

Brandenburg Telephone has made a good faith effort to resolve the dispute with Sprint Communications Company L.P. ("Sprint") through negotiations. Brandenburg Telephone remains willing to negotiate a resolution with Sprint; however, based on the parties' recent teleconference and on Sprint's January 26, 2009 Amended Response to Brandenburg Telephone's Data Requests, it appears unlikely that the parties will be able to resolve this matter without the Commission's intervention.

In an effort to narrow the scope of the dispute before the Commission, and to recover the undisputed charges rightly owed Brandenburg Telephone, Brandenburg Telephone filed an Emergency Motion to Compel Payment of Access Charges ("Emergency Motion") with the Commission on January 30, 2009. Sprint's refusal to pay these undisputed charges unnecessarily increases the issues before the Commission. In addition, Sprint's ability to refuse to pay undisputed charges for services received constitutes a financial disincentive to resolve this matter.

PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION Given the unlikely prospect of the parties reaching a negotiated resolution to this matter, Brandenburg Telephone believes a hearing should probably be scheduled within the next 60 days. Accordingly, by way of a separate motion, Brandenburg Telephone will propose a procedural schedule addressing pre-hearing discovery. In addition, Brandenburg Telephone may file a dispositive motion.
