Dear Ms. Stumbo:

I am writing to advise that the applicants in these cases and the Office for the Attorney General, Utility Rate Intervention Division ("AG") believe that they may have a very limited discovery dispute concerning the response to two of AG's requests for information in each case, one of which subsumes the other in scope. Due to conflicting schedules and deadlines in other matters, the AG has not had an adequate opportunity to evaluate the issue, and will not be able to do so until sometime next week. The applicants and the AG have informally agreed to toll the time for the Companies to timely file their objections, if necessary, until such time as the AG can further evaluate its position and discuss the matter further with counsel for the applicants. In doing so, the applicants and the AG believe this agreement will allow them the opportunity to use their best efforts to resolve the possible discovery dispute.
