RE: Application to Revise Non-Recurring Charges

Cannonsburg Water District proposes to make the following revisions to its schedule of charges.

Credit/Debit Card fee

When a customer makes payment by credit or debit card, the District will assess a fee equal to that charged to the District by the credit or debit card processing company to process the transaction. This fee is generally calculated using a formula applied to the balance of the amount charged to the credit or debit account buy may be a flat fee per transaction. Prior to processing the transaction, the customer will be informed of the fee amount and, upon request by the customer, the formula employed to arrive at this fee amount.

The charges/rates contained in this notice are the charges/rates proposed by the Cannonsburg Water District. Box 615, Frankfort, KY 40602, and shall set forth the grounds for the request including the status and interest of the party.

State officials confident about Oakwood funding

LOUISVILLE (AP) Federal authorities conducted a surprise inspection of Kentucky's largest residential center for adults with physical and mental disabilities and left state officials confident about receiving most federal Medicaid funding restored.

Federal officials gave preliminary approval to conditions at three of four units at Bluegrass Communities at Oakwood in Somerset, which lost federal Medicaid funding in May because of poor treatment of residents.

Cabinet for Health and Family Services secretary Janie Miller called the visit a positive step.

Officials declined to approve a fourth unit and cited it for a safety violation after determining that a female resident had received some bruises during a visit off-campus.

The state has been forced to pay the \$5 million per-month cost of operating the center since the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services cut off federal funds in May, citing repeated instances of abuse

RATES AND CHARGES

CREDIT /DEBIT CARDS:

All customers may pay their bill by credit or debit card. This method of payment may be made in person at the utility office or by telephone.

If on the bill due date an attempt to pay the credit card or debit card is made and the card is declined for any reason, payment is still due in full on that date and will be considered late after that date. All late charges and penalties will be applied. If a customer is paying on our disconnect day and the card is denied, the same rules as above apply, in addition to service being disconnected.
