Mount's chief stresses ethical le

Tony Aretz thinks that the financial scandals that have led the national economy to the brink of collapse could offer an opportunity for the College of Mount St. Joseph.

Companies hiring college graduates will be looking for students who can combine job excellence with ethical standards, a combination that the Mount is ideally suited to provide, said Aretz, who will be inaugurated today as the Mount's sixth president and second lay president.

"Companies want students who can come out and be leaders," he said. "The accumulation of wealth can't be your only goal. The economic mess we're in now is due to selfishness and greed.

"I think in higher education we've moved way too far toward the job-training model. As a faith-based institution, we have something to offer. Institutions like the Mount really have to look closely at what niche they're going to fill."

Aretz started his job last summer at the Catholic liberal

arts college on Delhi Road. He said it's time for the Mount to take its next step and train every one of its 2,150 students in ethical leadership. He envisions integrating everything from classes to sports to student groups in the training.

Today's ceremonies include a morning Mass and then the inauguration on the Delhi Township campus. The day is packed with symbolism. It is the anniversary of construction starting on the cam-

pus in 1960 and of Aretz's predecessor Sister Francis Marie Thraillkill's inauguration in 1988, and it is the feast day of St. Joseph, the college's patron saint.

Aretz, 50, already has seen his share of travails, such as earlier this month when a Mount freshman was arrested for setting a series of small fires. Another student died during the fires after suffering what authorities have ruled a heart attack.

Like all colleges, the school's finances have taken a hit. It has cut \$2 million out of a \$50 million budget, and the endowment has lost millions in stock-market value. The school is delaying its most ambitious fundraising plans to concentrate on "friend-raising," Aretz said.

But he is looking forward.

Later this year, the Mount will finish its next strategic plan, which Aretz hopes will make the ethical leadership program a priority.

He started a similar program in his last job at Christian Brothers University in Memphis, and the Mount has a two-year grant to pay for a new ex-
