## STATEMENT AND NOTICE

Western Lewis Rectorville Water District ("Western Lewis") hereby petitions the Commission for approval of a proposed increase in its water rates and charges. In support of its application, Western Lewis respectfully states as follows:

- 1. Western Lewis is a non-profit water district organized under KRS Chapter 74 and has no separate articles of incorporation or by-laws. Western Lewis's principal office, place of business and mailing address is 8000 Day Pike, Maysville Kentucky, 41056.
- 2. Western Lewis is engaged in the distribution and sale of water. It currently provides water service to approximately 1,790 customers.
- 3. The proposed increase in rates and charges is necessary for Western Lewis to meet its operating expenses, to maintain financial viability, to cover its debt service, and to continue to provide adequate service.
- 4. For the purpose of justifying the reasonableness of the proposed increase, Western Lewis has utilized a historical test period consisting of the twelve (12) consecutive calendar months ending December 31, 2007.
