We just received our electric bill and noticed where Kentucky Utilities had filed with the KPSC requesting another charge increase to its customers. Is there nothing we can do to stop this? We moved here 8 years ago and bragged to other people, who had much higher electric charges than we, but we are passing them now. Besides that, we live on a fixed income and had our income cut in 2009 by \$18,000.00.

Most of the people who live in our circle here in Greensburg live on a fixed income, and if something doesn't happen, some will be forced to sell and move to an apartment or Gov. Housing. All senior adults did not receive a cost of living increase in 2010, even though most utilities and housing expenses went up.


