ORDER

SouthEast Telephone, Inc. ("SouthEast") is a competitive local exchange carrier. SouthEast provides local exchange service using its own facilities and facilities that SouthEast leases from other carriers and resale of other carriers' services. On March 11, 2002, SouthEast petitioned the Commission to designate SouthEast as an eligible telecommunications carrier ("ETC") pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 214(e) and 47 C.F.R. § 54.201-207 in certain Kentucky counties in the service territories of BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Kentucky ("AT&T Kentucky") and Windstream Kentucky East, LLC f/k/a Kentucky Alltel, Inc. The Commission granted the request on November 26, 2002. SouthEast has now requested that it be designated an ETC in four other Kentucky counties within the AT&T Kentucky region.

To receive ETC status, the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") requires a common carrier to: (1) offer services that are supported by federal universal

support mechanisms² throughout its designated service area; (2) provide these services using its own facilities (including unbundled network elements) or a combination of its own facilities and resale of another carrier's facilities; and (3) advertise the availability of these services through media of general distribution.

The Commission finds that SouthEast has met the standards established by the FCC. SouthEast currently provides services supported by the Federal Universal Service mechanisms.³ In its petition requesting ETC designation, SouthEast affirmed that it offers these services using its own facilities and facilities that SouthEast leases from other carriers and by resale of other carriers' services.⁴ SouthEast also states that it advertises the availability and price of these services using media of general distribution.⁵ SouthEast has complied fully with FCC guidelines regarding ETC designation.

SouthEast has provided sufficient evidence for this Commission to grant ETC status. This designation will benefit consumers in Kentucky by expanding the range of competitive choices and by providing an incentive for incumbent telephone companies to improve their existing networks.

The Commission, having reviewed the evidence of record and having been

otherwise sufficiently advised, HEREBY ORDERS that:

1 SouthEast is designated as an ETC for the wire centers listed in the

Appendix. Accordingly, SouthEast is eligible to receive federal Universal Service Fund

support.

2. SouthEast shall offer universal support services to consumers in its

service area.

3. SouthEast shall offer these services using its own facilities or a

combination of its own facilities and resale of another carrier's services, including the

services offered by another ETC.

SouthEast shall advertise the availability of and charges for these services 4.

using media of general distribution.

SouthEast has certified to the Commission that it will comply with the

FCC's criteria, in accordance with 47 U.S.C. § 254(e), and is therefore eligible to

receive Universal Service Fund support for the current certification period.

The Executive Director shall serve a copy of this Order upon the FCC and

the Universal Service Administrative Company.
