RE: Formal Application for Tariff Revision

This is an application to revise Oldham County Water District's meter connection fee for $5/8 \times \frac{3}{4}$ inch connections. Upon approval of the tariff, Oldham County will begin installing computer radio read meters for all new connections. Enclosed is the connection charge cost justification calculations, a revised tariff sheet and a copy of the public notice that will be published in the newspaper for three consecutive weeks.

This meter connection fee was not included in the last rate case filed by Oldham County since Oldham County had no plans to install computer radio read meters at that time. Oldham County is not requesting a general rate increase at this time. However, the District cannot absorb the cost of installing computer radio read meters at its current connection fee. The increased connection fee will not impact current customers. The individuals affected by this increase will be new applicants for service.

The District has previously filed income statements and balance sheets with the Public Service Commission. These income statements and balance sheets are contained in the annual reports filed by Oldham County. Oldham County has not filed more than two increases in its non-recurring charges since its last general rate case.

There will not be additional revenue from this tariff filing. All money collected will be used to purchase and install the computer radio read meters. Therefore, additional revenue will not exceed five (5) percent of total revenues provided by all miscellaneous and non-recurring charges for the most recent twelve (12) month period.
